FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. CROMOND AND DICKSON, DRESSMAKERS AND TAILORS, TIMOR-STREET, WAHRNAMBOOL,

for a period of two weeks from the 21st December, 1908, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty-nine females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty-nine females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PENShurst
RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Francis O'Connor Twomey, Thomas Tobin, Richard Barnes, Robert Aitken, and Daniel O'Brien, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Penshurst Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section One hundred and ninety-nine of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be allowed on the lawn or to enter any of the buildings in the Reserve on days on which admission-fees are not imposed without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained :—

1. The grand stand, the lawn, the members' carriage paddock (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
2. The flat, the outer carriage paddock, and approaches thereto (surrounded with a close fence).
3. The saddling paddock, the birdcage, and all approaches thereto (surrounded with a close fence).
4. The weighing yard, the judge's box, the stewards' stand, the stewards' room, the secretary's office, the jockeys' room, the casualty room, the committee stand, the scales platform (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
5. The picnic paddock (enclosed) and approaches thereto.
6. The racing track, the training track, the steeplechase course, and the remainder of the Reserve which is enclosed.

(2) No person shall enter the Reserve at any race or other meeting, or bring therein any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle except on production of a ticket to be issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing such person in that behalf, and then only into such part or parts of the Reserve as shall be indicated on the ticket, and only on the days for which the ticket is issued: Provided always that the holder of a ticket shall not remain in the Reserve, or any part thereof, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run, without the consent of the Committee of Management.

(3) No person, except the judge or any person whom he may call to his assistance, or a steward shall enter the judge's box at any time the horses are prepared to start or are running for any race.

(4) No person shall enter the weighing yard, the weighing stand, or the approaches thereto, except jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

(5) The following persons shall not be admitted to any division of the Reserve :—

a. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connexion with racing.

b. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.

(6) All persons paying for admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall on demand produce, or, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.

(7) Persons renting or hiring for any race or sports meeting the Reserve, or any portion thereof, or any booth, building, or other erection for the time being in the Reserve, and any persons allowed to train or exercise horses in the Reserve, shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve and the booths, buildings, and other erections for the time being therein.

(8) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog.

(9) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(10) No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(11) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

(12) No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(13) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for any other purpose, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(14) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

(15) Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being therein any of the following offences shall, together with any horses or carriages or other vehicles in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof:—

- a. Assaulting any person.
- b. Being drunk.
- c. Riding, crossing, or trespassing on the course, or any part thereof, during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
- d. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- e. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- f. Behaving improperly or riotously.
- g. Being found in any part of the Reserve and not producing upon demand, or, if required so to do, not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the Reserve wherein such person may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or the steward deputed by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such ticket has been lost.

- h. Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

(16) No person shall, after the twenty-fourth day of December, 1908, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve other than upon the portion of the stand and lawn enclosures or flat enclosures set apart for bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the stewards of the Boxing Day Race Club or the Penshurst Race Club, or by those duly authorized by the said Committee of Management or stewards.

(17) Every person carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, whether in the stand and lawn enclosures, or flat enclosures, shall, during the time he shall be so carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or by the

stewards of the Boxing Day Race Club or the Penshurst Race Club, or by those duly authorized by the said Committee of Management, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

(18) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every person to the 1st Division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	10s. 6d.
For admission of every person to the 2nd Division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
For admission of every person to the 3rd Division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	5s. 0d.
For admission of every person to the 5th and 6th Divisions, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	1s. 0d.
For admission of every truck or hand barrow, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
For admission of every vehicle drawn by one or more horses to the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Divisions, such sum for each horse as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
For admission of any saddle horse (exclusive of the rider) to the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Divisions, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
