Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF PORTLAND.

BY-LAW NO. 8.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Portland, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say :—

1. All former by-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this by-law are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Heywood and Branxholme in said shire, and within one mile of the boundaries of such townships as shown on the parish plan issued in the State of Victoria, and shall extend to the occupier of every tenement within such townships and boundaries as aforesaid.

4. The ordinary cesspits and system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished; and instead thereof every closet in such townships shall be furnished with a double-pan service to be supplied by the said Council!



5. The occupier of any premises which by the provisions of the Health Act or by this by-law should be provided with a privy, shall erect a substantial building suitable for the pan system hereby adopted; the floor of such building shall at no point be less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford an easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof.

6. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

7. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pans and lids in any manner whatsoever.

8. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause or direct one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

10. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

11. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by water and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

12. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract or arrange for the removal of the night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this by-law, nor shall he cause the contents of the pan to be buried or used in his grounds.

13. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make an annual charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed.

14. The annual charge shall be payable by each occupier of a tenement as aforesaid by four equal three-monthly instalments, commencing from the date of publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be paid to the secretary of the said Council or to such other officer or servant of the Council as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose by the Council. And in default of payment of any one or more instalments as aforesaid for a period of fourteen days after demand thereof being made by the secretary or collector for the said Council by means of a written or printed memorandum served personally on such occupier or left with some inmate of his abode, or sent by the post by a registered letter addressed to the residence of such occupier, the amount of any such instalment may be sued for and recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

15. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this by-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,  
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*;

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C. D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by those Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practices of Surveying.*

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

*Use of instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tellurimeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

*Drawing.*

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vinifera* vocc).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

## LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

The fees, costs, and charges under the said *Justices Act 1890*, or under any other Act for the time being in force, so far as the same relates to any matter or proceeding as to which a Court of General Sessions or Petty Sessions, or any one or more Justices, has or have jurisdiction : Now therefore I, the Governor in Council, do hereby and by

virtue of the powers and authorities cited above, rescind the first Schedule to the Rules and Regulations under the said *Children's Court Act 1906*, passed at the meeting of the Executive Council, held on the eighteenth day of June, 1907, and for the said Schedule substitute the following :—

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Offences Act 1890* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour make the following By-law No. 17, for keeping in and preventing obstruction of the carriage and footways and public places in the Shire of Seymour:—

1. Any person obstructing any carriage-way, footway, or public place by standing or loitering therein or thereon shall, upon being ordered to do so by any member of the police force, discontinue such standing or loitering.

Any person committing a breach of this by-law is guilty of an offence against the *Police Offences Act 1890*, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

*Local Government Act 1903*.—Fourteenth Schedule.

BY-LAW.

A By-law of the Shire of Wannon made under section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 13, for regulating the conditions under which "Cattle" may be driven on to any street or road for purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wannon order as follows:—

1. That any ratepayer shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number, not exceeding six head, of horned cattle or six head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause 7 hereof.

2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the *bona fides* of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such form shall specify (*inter alia*) the particulars and descriptions and brands, or apparent brands, and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or reserves and riding on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a permit or licence in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges or fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be:—

(a) For each horse above age of six months, Sixpence per week per quarter.

(b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Fourpence per week per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly, in advance, to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months in each year.

8. Fees payable under permits to register granted during the currency of a quarter shall be apportioned according to the unexpired term of that quarter.

9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

10. That the Council shall have a discretion as to number of cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon such roads, streets, or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

11. That no person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any street, road, or reserve in the Shire of Wannon, and any such animals found upon any road, street, or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as also will any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road, street, or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law.

12. The permit to graze stock within the township boundaries of Coleraine and Balmoral shall extend to milking cows only and to the hours between sunrise and sunset, and any other live stock found grazing within such boundaries or any milking cows found within those boundaries between the hours of sunset and sunrise, even though registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.

13. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death or for any injury or damage to or straying of any cattle or horse grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly upon these conditions.

14. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration to that effect.

15. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cow or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

16. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of any animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any street or road or by any other person.

17. If the tag has, previous to the passing of this By-law, been issued by the Council to any applicant, such tag must be returned, or its loss satisfactorily accounted for, as a condition precedent to the registration of any animal by such applicant.

18. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal or any registered animal, and in case of sale, of the name and address of the purchaser.

19. The Council shall have the power to terminate the permission to graze any animal of the applicant at the end of any current quarter if reported by the herdsman to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if feed or water become scarce or insufficient.
