1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand. 3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects :-

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veius and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and construction. and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

SHIRE OF BRIGHT. BY-LAW NO. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright, made under the Health Act 1890, and numbered 15:

I N pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bright, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say :-

- 1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrictville.
- the boundaries of the townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville.

 3. The occupier of any house, building, tenement, or premises within the said townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville shall cause to be provided and kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building, tenement, or premises a covered receptacle not exceeding four cubic feet in content, constructed of gal-vanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, so that the same may, with the contents thereof, when there are any, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes, or other household refuse, produced or accumulated in any such premises, to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, and such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept covered and in a dry and cleanly condition, and on the day or days appointed by the said Council for the removal thereof such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed in the yard of such house, building, tenement, or premises, at a distance not exceeding ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane, or right-of-way, so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavenger or other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and no occupier shall place any such receptacle, or permit the same to be placed, in any street, lane, or right-of-way.

 4. No occupier shall by any means place or cause to be placed on or in any footpath, street, or street channel any
- 4. No occupier shall by any means place or cause to be placed on or in any footpath, street, or street channel any house or yard refuse or sweepings.
- house or yard refuse or sweepings.

 5. The occupier of any land situate in the said townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, or eattle-shed, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a condition in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or manure removed therefrom, as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any such person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty notwithstanding that the said Council may be empowered by this By-law, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken such breach, and whether such Council hus or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Local Government Act 1903.-Fourteenth Schedule. BY-LAW.*

A By-law of the Shire of Wannon, made under section 498 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 13, for regulating the conditions under which "Cattle" may be driven on to any street or road for purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

- In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wannon order as follows:—

 1. That any ratepayer shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number, not exceeding six, head of horsed cattle or six head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause 7 hereof.
- 2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the bona fides of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.
- 3. Such form shall specify (inter alia) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or reserves and Riding on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.
- 4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

- 9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

That the Council shall have a discretion as to number of cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon such roads, streets, or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.
- 11. That no person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any street, road, or reserve in the Shire of Wannon, and any such animals found upon any road, street, or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as also will any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road, street, or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law.
- 12. The permit to graze stock within the township boundaries of Coleraine and Balmoral shall extend to milking cows only, and to the hours between sunrise and sunset, and any other live stock found grazing, within such boundaries or any milking cows found within those boundaries between the hours of sunset and sunrise, even though registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.
