I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nine and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this and the last preceding Session of Parliament.”

VACANCY IN AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL, SHEPPARTON.

In the case of elementary science, preference will be given to teachers who have gone through a course of laboratory work, and, in the case of nature-study and geography, to teachers who have engaged in field work.

REGULATIONS.

(Government Gazette, 15th February, 1905.)

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.
2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.
3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.
4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—
 - (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
 - (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
 - (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
 - (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.
5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.
6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYERS ON THE ICE BOARD.

SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 15:

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bright, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville.

3. The occupier of any house, building, tenement, or premises within the said townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville shall cause to be provided and kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building, tenement, or premises a covered receptacle not exceeding four cubic feet in content, constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, so that the same may, with the contents thereof, when there are any, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes, or other household refuse, produced or accumulated in any such premises, to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, and such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept covered and in a dry and cleanly condition, and on the day or days appointed by the said Council for the removal thereof such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed in the yard of such house, building, tenement, or premises, at a distance not exceeding ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane, or right-of-way, so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavenger or other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and no occupier shall place any such receptacle, or permit the same to be placed, in any street, lane, or right-of-way.

4. No occupier shall by any means place or cause to be placed on or in any footpath, street, or street channel any house or yard refuse or sweepings.

5. The occupier of any land situate in the said townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Wandiligong, and Harrietville, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, or cattle-shed, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a condition in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or manure removed therefrom, as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

6. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any such person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty notwithstanding that the said Council may be empowered by this By-law, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 8th day of December, 1908, and confirmed the 5th day of January, 1909.

The light is situated on the eastern extreme of the small bay south of Angle Point, locally known as Pukuhiki Point. VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—BEECH FOREST AND CROWE'S RAILWAY.—ORDER NOTIFYING THE INTENTION OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO CONSTITUTE CERTAIN LANDS A RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT UNDER THE NAME OF THE BEECH FOREST AND CROWE'S RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS the construction of a line of railway, to be called the Beech Forest and Crowe's Railway, has been authorized by the *Beech Forest and Crowe's Railway Construction Act 1908*, subject to the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Acts*: And whereas it is necessary that the requirements of section 8 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* be now complied with: Now therefore I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby announce that unless I receive within the period by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* mentioned a petition signed as therein required, praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the said Beech Forest and Crowe's Railway be not constructed, it is my intention to constitute, after the expiration of one month from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Order, the lands hereinafter described as a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the Beech Forest and Crowe's Railway Construction District, that is to say, all the lands included within the following boundaries:—

The whole of the Parish of Moomowroong.
The whole of the Parish of Barwongemoong.
The whole of the Parish of Wangerrip.
The whole of the Parish of Aire.
Part of the Parish of Weeapirraih.

(b) The occupancy, which is renewable annually, terminates 31st July, 1911, with the right to cultivate. Not more than one-third of the area to be cropped in any one year. Occupancy to be terminable after six months' notice in the event of the area being at any time determined to be South Australian Territory. On expiry of the term, the occupier is to have preferential claim for renewal for a further term of seven years, unless his previous use of the land has rendered such renewal undesirable, but such renewal will be subject to review of rents and conditions. Local Government Act 1903.—Fourteenth Schedule.

BY-LAW.*

A By-law of the Shire of Wannon, made under section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 13, for regulating the conditions under which "Cattle" may be driven on to any street or road for purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wannon order as follows:—

1. That any ratepayer shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number, not exceeding six, head of horned cattle or six head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause 7 hereof.
2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the *bona fides* of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.
3. Such form shall specify (*inter alia*) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or reserves and Riding on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.
4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.
5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a permit or licence in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.
6. The charges or fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be:—
 - (a) For each horse above age of six months, Sixpence per week per quarter.
 - (b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Fourpence per week per quarter.
7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of April, July, October, and January in each year.
8. Fees payable under permits to register granted during the currency of a quarter shall be apportioned according to the unexpired term of that quarter.
9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.
10. That the Council shall have a discretion as to number of cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon such roads, streets, or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.
11. That no person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any street, road, or reserve in the Shire of Wannon, and any such animals found upon any road, street, or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as also will any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road, street, or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law.
12. The permit to graze stock within the township boundaries of Coleraine and Balmoral shall extend to milking cows only, and to the hours between sunrise and sunset, and any other live stock found grazing within such boundaries or any milking cows found within those boundaries between the hours of sunset and sunrise, even though registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.

13. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to or straying of any cattle or horse grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly upon these conditions.

14. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration to that effect.

15. Calves and foals under six months of age the progeny of the registered cows or mares may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

16. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of any animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any street or road or by any other person.

17. If the tag has previous to the passing of this By-law been issued by the Council to any applicant such tag must be returned or its loss satisfactorily accounted for as a condition precedent to the registration of any animal by such applicant.

18. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal of any registered animal, and in case of sale of the name and address of the purchaser.

19. The Council shall have the power to terminate the permission to graze any animal of the applicant at the end of any current quarter if reported by the herdsman to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if feed or water become scarce or insufficient.
