PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, it is among other things provided that—

“In the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the Seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant-Governor, or, if there be no such Officer, or if such Officer be absent or unable to act, then any other person to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor, by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected, otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct”:

Now therefore I, Sir John Madden, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, do hereby proclaim that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by writing under his hand, has appointed me to be his Deputy, as on and from this day, during his absence from Melbourne within Victoria, for him and on his behalf to do all things necessary to be done by him as Governor of the said State.

The buoy is moored about thirty (30) fathoms south-west from the wreck in 10 fathoms of water, and the highest portion of the wreck has 2½ fathoms over it at L.W.S. tides.

There is also a spar floating vertically attached to the wreck, the end of which shows about 3 feet above the surface at slack water; but disappears during the strength of the tide. The bearings from the wreck are Troubridge Hill, E. ½ S. mag., distant about one mile. Approximate position, lat. 35 deg. 10 min. S.; long. 137 deg. 37 min. E.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Water Act 1905* it is among other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendation as to the granting of the application, or as to any alteration or addition he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or with or without any conditions, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks;
- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed;
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the Waterworks District of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality, the council whereof, or the councillors of any riding whereof, were applicants for the construction of such waterworks;
- (d) Subject to the provisions of the said Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several Councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the Waterworks District as the case may be;
- (e) Assign a Corporate name to the Waterworks Trust;
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the said Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case the Governor in Council may think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a Waterworks District is either wholly, or, with the exception of the waterworks, or proposed waterworks, thereof, within one municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such council to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with one or more persons not being members of such council, to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the South Riding of the Shire of Avoca for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Avoca with water; and doth hereby order and appoint as follow:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) That the Councillors for the South Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Avoca for the time being and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Eight thousand seven hundred pounds (£8,700).

In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, double columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 5 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department.
