W HEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, it is among other things provided that-

"In the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the Seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant-Governor, or, if there be no such Officer, or if such "Officer be absent or unable to act, then any other "person to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such "absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities "vested in the Governor, by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and "limited, but no others. Provided, nevertheless, that "by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the "power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected, otherwise "than We may at any time hereafter think proper to "direct":

Now therefore I, Sir John Madden, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, do hereby proclaim that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by writing under his hand, has appointed me to be his Deputy, as on and from this day, during his absence from Melbourne within Victoria, for him and on his behalf to do all things necessary to be done by him as Governor of the said State.

- "Mariners and others in charge of vessels passing the dredger must proceed at the slowest possible speed, and must stop propeller engines when passing the dredger's chains.
- (2) Port Rule No. 66A, which reads as follows:—
  Persons in charge of steam-ships navigating the waters in the dredged cutting, South Channel, shall cause the speed of such steam-ships to be so reduced that it shall not exceed the maximum rate of 7 nautical miles per hour."

The penalty for infringement is £100.
