THE ROYAL ASSENT TO A RESERVED BILL ENTITLED "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR ADULT SUFFRAGE."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of provisions contained in *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land* (5 and 6 Vict.), also in *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies* (13 and 14 Vict.), and in *The Constitution Statute* (19 Vict.), do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill, the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to provide for Adult Suffrage,"

which was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that by an Order in Council made at the Court at Buckingham Palace, and bearing date the fifteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and nine, a copy whereof is hereto appended, His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. M. JOSEPH, TAILOR, RICKARD'S BUILDINGS, LITTLE COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 5th April, 1909, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifteen females or more than one boy under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifteen females and one boy under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

ORDER CONFIRMED.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Barrier Tickets.—Platform tickets will not be issued at Spencer-street on 7th and 8th April.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. ADDITION TO REGULATION No. XXI. OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1890.

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. (c) The forty scholarships under sub-section (a) of this section and thirty-four of the forty scholarships under sub-section (b) shall be grouped in two Divisions as follows :—

Division I.—Twenty-four scholarships under sub-section (a) and twenty scholarships under sub-section (b) to be awarded to pupils of State schools in each of which the average attendance of pupils is 150 in number or over that number.

Division II.—Sixteen scholarships under sub-section (a) and fourteen scholarships under sub-section (b) to be awarded to pupils of State schools in each of which the average attendance of pupils is under 150 in number.

Provided that if a greater or a less number than forty scholarships be awarded in any year under either sub-section (a) or sub-section (b) a greater or a less number shall be allotted to each Division in the proportion, as closely as possible, of twelve (12) in Division I. to eight (8) in Division II.

Provided also that should the number of meritorious candidates in either Division be less than the number of scholarships allotted to such Division, the scholarships unallotted may be awarded to meritorious candidates in the other Division.

The Director shall decide under which Division a school shall be placed, and in the case of candidates who during the twelve months preceding the examination at which they present themselves have attended more schools than one shall determine for which Division of scholarships such candidates may be permitted to compete.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

A SUM of Three thousand five hundred pounds shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1908, and 31st December, 1908, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st May, 1909. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1908, and 31st December, 1908; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by

Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1908.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1907 (*vide* Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated to the north-east of Lake Tyrrell, and is from 25 to 45 miles from Ultima railway station, and from 3 to 20 miles from Chillingollah railway station.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, the 5th May, 1909.

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the third class, improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made before the end of the third year from the date of the licence, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the

property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. 16. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

18. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mact, not exceeding fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section forty-four (44) of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for:—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which any animals may be received into or supplied from any abattoirs.
- (b) Prescribing the duties of meat inspectors.
- (c) Fixing the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of abattoirs of which it is the owner.
- (d) The feeding, watering, and tending, and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and for the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs.
- (e) Examining animals by meat inspectors before slaughter, and prescribing the mode of dealing with animals at abattoirs when suspected of being affected with communicable disease.
- (f) Prescribing the mode of slaughtering animals, of flaying and of dressing carcasses, and for preserving the cleanliness of appliances used therefor.
- (g) Examining by meat inspectors the different parts of a carcass after slaughter at abattoirs, and for preventing the parts of one carcass being mixed with those of another prior to examination.
- (h) Fixing the fees for examining of animals, for examining and branding of carcasses, and for giving certificates as to any examination of any animal, or carcass, or meat, made by or under the direction of a meat inspector.
- (i) Prescribing the mode of removing condemned carcasses or meat, and of rendering the same unusable for human consumption, and of disposing of or destroying the same, and prescribing the mode of removing and destroying of blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure from abattoirs.
- (j) Prescribing the nature of the particulars to be entered in the register as to animals examined or slaughtered at or supplied or removed from any abattoir, and as to carcasses of meat dealt with thereat.
- (k) And generally for carrying into effect the objects of the Meat Supervision Acts, and for imposing penalties for non-compliance with the regulations made in accordance therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool make the following Regulations, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Warrnambool.

A.—RECEPTION OR REMOVAL OF ANIMALS.

1. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the public abattoir on any day from the hour of Five o'clock a.m. till the hour of Six o'clock p.m., from the first day of October to the thirtieth day of April, and between the hours of Six o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m. from the first day of May, until the thirtieth day of September in each year, provided always that animals shall not be received into the public abattoir on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
2. All animals received or placed into the public abattoir, if not slaughtered or otherwise dealt with as by law provided, must be removed from the public abattoir by the owner or the person in charge thereof within a period of not more than thirty-six hours in all from the time such animals were first received into the public abattoir, otherwise the said animals shall be removed by order of the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner thereof.

B.—DUTIES OF INSPECTOR.

3. The following shall be included in the duties of meat inspectors—

- To keep a register of all animals received into or placed in or slaughtered or condemned in or removed from the public abattoir, and to keep such books, accounts, registers, and records, and furnish such reports as the Council may from time to time direct or require.
- To inspect all animals received or placed into the public abattoir before the same are slaughtered.
- To direct the management and care of animals during the time they are at the public abattoir pending slaughter or removal.
- To direct the removal of all animals that have been longer than eighteen hours in the public abattoir.
- To examine all carcasses, organs, viscera, and offal, and other parts of animals immediately on being slaughtered, and to brand or cause to be branded under his direction, in accordance with the regulations made by the Board of Public Health under

the Meat Supervision Acts, all such carcasses, organs, viscera, offal, and parts as are intended to be exposed for sale for human consumption.

To demand and receive the fees hereinafter appointed to be paid in respect of such examination and branding; also to collect the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoir, or for the slaughtering of animals.

To superintend and direct the carrying out of all cleansing methods and sanitary measures and requirements in and about abattoirs.

To keep a register of all butchers, salesmen, slaughtermen, and others engaged or doing business at the public abattoir, and to control and direct the operations and enforce propriety of conduct of all such persons.

To prevent summarily any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering or cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, and to report to the Council the names of every person guilty of such cruelty.

To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts, and all By-laws and Regulations relating to public abattoirs.

C.—SLAUGHTERING FEES.

4. The sums stated hereunder shall be the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoir, viz. :—

And such said sums shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the public abattoir whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

D.—FEEDING, WATERING, ETC. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, ETC.

5. Every person who shall bring animals into the public abattoir shall cause them to be provided with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and if the same remain in the public abattoir for a longer period than twenty-four hours, shall also provide such animals with sufficient food: Provided always that no animal shall be allowed to remain in the public abattoir after three hours' notice shall have been given by the inspector to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove same, and such owner or person in charge shall remove same accordingly.

6. Animals shall be placed in such numbers only as the inspector may direct in any of the pens, stalls, yards, or standings in the public abattoir, and every person failing to observe the directions of the inspector in this respect shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

7. Every person who shall cause any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering any animal, or be guilty of any cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations. All milk animals in the public abattoir shall be milked by the owner or person in charge thereof at such time and place as the inspector may direct, either verbally or in writing.

E.—EXAMINATION, ETC., OF ANIMALS BEFORE SLAUGHTERING AND COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.

8. Every animal received into or placed in the public abattoir shall be examined by the inspector before any such animal shall be slaughtered, and every owner or person in charge of any animal who shall permit the same to be slaughtered before being so examined, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

9. No animal shall be removed from the public abattoir if affected with, or if, in the opinion of the inspector, there are reasonable grounds for believing it to be affected with any of the following diseases, viz. :—Tuberculosis, anthrax, quarterill, pleuro-pneumonia, swine fever (hog cholera), swine erysipelas, lymphatic abscess, actinomycosis (lumpy jaw), or any communicable, contagious, or infectious disease, and no animal so affected shall be received into the public abattoir except by the direct permission of the inspector, and when so ordered by the inspector, either verbally or in writing, the owner or person in charge of any diseased animal shall forthwith destroy such animal in the manner directed by the inspector, whereupon the carcass of such animal shall be forthwith dealt with by the inspector so as to render it unfit for human consumption, and the carcass shall be disposed of (at the expense and risk of the owner thereof) in such manner as the inspector may direct.

F.—MODE OF SLAUGHTERING, ETC. CLEANLINESS OF APPLIANCES.

10. The owner or person in charge of any animal brought into the public abattoir may slaughter such animal and flay and dress the carcass thereof in such manner at such time and in such place or portion of the public abattoir as the inspector shall direct.

11. Every person engaged in slaughtering, dressing, or tending or caring for any animal or carcass in the public abattoir shall take all means and precautions so as to secure

perfect cleanness of his person, dress, and of all appliances of every kind used or to be used by him in the public abattoir, and the inspector shall decide whether all such means and precautions have been taken, and the inspector shall have the authority to forthwith order, either verbally or in writing, any person to at once leave the public abattoir who shall not have so complied in regard to the cleanness of his person or the appliances used or to be used by him, and every person who has not so complied shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

G.—EXAMINATION OF CARCASS AFTER SLAUGHTER, ETC.

12. The carcass, organs, viscera, and offal of every animal shall, immediately upon being slaughtered in the public abattoir, be examined by the inspector, and no person shall cut away or remove from any animal any portion of the carcass or the organs, viscera, or offal thereof, except in such manner as the inspector may direct.

H.—FEES FOR EXAMINING AND BRANDING CARCASSES.

13. The fees hereunder mentioned shall be paid to the inspector for examining and branding of carcasses of meat slaughtered at the public abattoirs, viz. :—

J.—REMOVAL OF CONDEMNED CARCASSES, OFFAL, ETC.

15. Upon the carcass of any animal being condemned by the inspector as unfit for human consumption, it shall be destroyed or dealt with as the inspector may direct, provided always that such carcass shall not be removed or retained by the owner thereof, or by any person acting for such owner, but the proceeds or any portion thereof of the disposal of the carcass may, if the inspector so determine, be given to the owner of such carcass.

16. Upon any animal being slaughtered in the public abattoir, the owner of such animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith thoroughly cleanse of all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure, as the inspector shall direct, the stall or place in which such animal was slaughtered.

17. Immediately after the cleansing of any stall or place as set forth in the last preceding clause, the owner of any animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith remove from the public abattoir in such a manner as shall be approved by the Council and the inspector, all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure that may have arisen from such slaughtering of any animal, and shall dispose of the same at such place and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council and the inspector.

K.—REGISTER, ETC., OF ANIMALS.

18. The inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoir, a description of all animals brought into the public abattoir, including the particulars of the class of each animal, the colours, brands, and sex of every head of the same. The date on which such animals were received, examined, slaughtered, or condemned in or removed from the public abattoir, and the amount of fees paid for examining, slaughtering, and branding of all such animals, together with the names of the persons who are owners of all such animals.

19. The inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoir a complete description of all diseases of animals which he inspects either before or after slaughter, and in such description there shall be included the names of the owners of the animals, the sex and age and kind of animals, also of the particulars of the manner in which all such animals have been disposed of.

L.—CHARGES FOR SLAUGHTERING.

20. The sums stated hereunder shall be paid to the Council by the owner of any animal which has been slaughtered in the public abattoir at the request of such owner by the slaughterman employed by the Council, viz. :—

M.—CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

21. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoir, or butcher's shop or premises in or along any of the roads or streets of the Town of Warrnambool

any meat unless such meat in any such vehicle is properly covered and surrounded by a thoroughly clean canvas or wooden covering.

22. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, any meat in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoir or butcher's shop or premises in or along any road or street in the Town of Warrnambool unless any such vehicle is in a proper, clean, and sanitary condition.

23. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of these regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Resolution for passing these regulations was agreed to by the Council the ninth day of February, 1909, and confirmed the ninth day of March, 1909.

Health Acts No. 1098-1866.

A By-law of the Shire of Mulgrave made under sections 31 and 255 of the Health Acts No. 1098 and 1866.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave order as follows:—

Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, before 7 a.m. in the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and 8 a.m. in the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, on the day such deposit thereof shall have been made, immediately cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

Clause 19 of By-law No. 1, made by the Local Board of Health of the Shire of Oakleigh on 15th July, 1886, is hereby repealed.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Mulgrave.
