## SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1909.

IT is hereby notified that Saturday, the 1st day of May next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights, from the Registrars or Deputies for their respective Divisions *before* or on that date.

"Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 29th April instant will be in time for enrolment on the Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest to their residence—and must forward (either with their application or on or before Tuesday, the 1st June, 1909), a crossed postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Commissioner, Melbourne, for Ten shillings in the case of candidates for the Clerical Division Examination, and Five shillings in the case of the General Division Examination—being the fees for such examinations.

Forms of application and copies of regulations may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner, Treasury Buildings, Melbourne.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerk, and three (3) for Assistant in the Public Library, Melbourne. Candidates must be between the ages of sixteen and thirty years. For the position of Assistant, Public Library, applicants must produce evidence of having passed the Junior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne (or some equivalent examination which the Commissioner may judge equivalent) in Greek, in Latin, and in either French or German.

No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he be less than five feet eight inches in height, or measure round his chest less than thirty-six inches, or weigh less than eleven stone.

1. All signals to be printed in clear and legible form, and posted in full view of the engine-driver; also to be printed on metal plate and hung at each working plat.
2. All signals must be given very distinctly.
3. Every pump shaft must have a separate knocker, of a different tone, independent of those used for winding.
4. When a cage has been left suspended at or in front of a level no one shall attempt to make use of it or to put on or take off tools or material without first giving 3 knocks for "Hold fast," which shall be answered by the engine-driver moving the cage slightly.
5. On receiving the signal "2 pause 2," "holes charged ready for firing," the engine-driver shall answer by moving the cage or bucket slightly; at the same time one of the party shall stand by the knocker line until the men are on the bucket or cage, when he shall knock 1.
6. The signal "4 pause" means "men on," and care must be taken that no other signal conflicts with it.
7. The signal for serious accident implies—Doctor and ambulance wanted.
8. An approved system of communication, in addition to knocker line, between braced and engine-driver to be installed, and may consist of:—a plate having painted thereon, in legible figures, the number of the level to which men wish to descend, and hung by braced man in some conspicuous place within sight of the engine-driver; indicator boards or dials, one erected at the brace and connected by a line with another having bell attachment in engine-room; speaking tube fitted up between brace and a point in engine-room convenient to engine-driver; telephone or other electrical system.
9. To meet local conditions, or for sectional signalling, additional signals will be permitted, provided they do not conflict with the prescribed code.

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 14 of the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this my Proclamation direct that the area hereunder described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game set forth in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1896*, except Quail.

## AREA ABOVE REFERRED TO :—

In the parish of Dunnewalla, county of Hampden: Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 42B; bounded thence by a straight line running northerly to the north-west corner of allotment 43A; thence by a straight line

running westerly to the south-west corner of allotment 23B; thence by a straight line running north-easterly to the north-west corner of allotment 24A; thence by a straight line running easterly to the north-east corner of allotment 27B; thence by lines bearing respectively south-easterly twenty-one chains twenty-five links along the north-east boundary of allotment 27B and southerly one hundred and thirty-five chains thirty-one links along the eastern boundaries of allotments 27B and 32B and of J. Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act, as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract,

then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

17. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. 18. A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section Two hundred and twenty-eight (228) of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Eighty-four (84) for the purpose of expressly altering or repealing certain By-laws in force in such Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows :—

1. The words forming a portion of clause one (1) of the By-law numbered Seventy-two confirmed by the Council on the second day of August, One thousand nine hundred and four, are hereby repealed, viz. :—

IV. In streets or roads in which at the site of any proposed crossing there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge or footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall be constructed as has been respectively appointed by same regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof, and shall be constructed in accordance with any regulations made in respect thereof.

2. In lieu of the said words so repealed by the last preceding clause the following words shall be and are hereby inserted, viz. :—

“In streets or roads in which at the site of any such proposed crossing there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall be constructed as has been respectively appointed by some Regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof, and shall be constructed in accordance with any regulations made in respect thereof.”

3. The By-law numbered sixty-two (62) for providing for the care, protection, and management of Jubilee Park, situated in the parish of Wangoom, which was passed by the Council of the Town of Warrnambool on the thirty-first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, shall be and is hereby repealed.

4. The By-law numbered seventy (70) for the purpose of repealing certain portions of Part I. of By-law sixty-five (65) in relation to “Porticoes” and crossings over footways and channels and otherwise providing for same, which was passed by the Council on the ninth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

5. The words following, which form a part of clause two (2) of the By-law numbered seventy-two (72), confirmed by the Council on the second day of August, One thousand nine hundred and four, shall be and are hereby repealed, viz., save and except the word “twenty” is hereby omitted from clause four (4), and the word “forty” is inserted in lieu thereof.

6. The By-law numbered seventy-nine (79) for regulating the market places and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or on the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market will be held, which was confirmed by the Council on the fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and four, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
