**PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,  
SURVEY BRANCH.**

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 1st July next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

**CONDITIONS.**

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

**QUALIFICATIONS.**

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

**COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.**

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

**PROBATION.**

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

**TERM OF SERVICE.**

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors Board as to his qualifications.

**REMUNERATION.**

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

**SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.**

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

**BONDS REQUIRED.**

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not less than £160 per annum.

3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WODONGA GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Wodonga General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges made shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection, shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and pay the charge set forth in scale of fees, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the name, age, place of residence, and supposed cause of death of the deceased given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary.

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burial shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. throughout the year.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees, or some person appointed by them.

11. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

12. All persons wilfully destroying property, or otherwise misconducting themselves, to be proceeded against under the authority of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

13. Dogs found in the Cemetery may be destroyed.

14. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of recommending, from time to time, for the approval of His Excellency the Governor, such alterations in these Rules and Regulations as to them may appear desirable.

5. The usual hours for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September till 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months of the year.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on the certificate of a Justice, or on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the cost and charges.

7. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument, in the Cemetery, to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to any other person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a copy of every proposed epitaph, must be submitted to the trustees, for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper order and repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to owner.

13. A plan of the Cemetery will be kept, together with a registry, and may be inspected at the office of the trustees.

14. No servant, or any other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the Cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 39th section of the Act 54 Victoria, No. 1072.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in the regulations.

18. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

19. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

20. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

REGULATION PARTLY REPEALED, AND  
REGULATION MADE IN LIEU THEREOF.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Marriage Act* 1890, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make rules and regulations and alter and repeal the same for more effectually carrying out the provisions of the said Part: And whereas by the *Marriage Act* 1898 it is enacted that every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to Part I. of the *Marriage Act* 1890 or to the like effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, pursuant to the provisions of the Marriage Acts, repeal the Order in Council of the 20th February, 1899, so far as it relates to the Form of Consent to the Marriage of Minors, and in lieu thereof doth make the following

No. 74.—JUNE 9, 1909.—6874.—2.

Regulation prescribing the Form of Consent hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

No. 4.—Consent of Guardian of Minor to the Marriage of a Minor. [See back of this form.]

Marriage Acts.—54 Victoria. No. 1166, and 62 Victoria No. 1582.

On this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, in the year \_\_\_\_\_ One thousand \_\_\_\_\_ hundred and \_\_\_\_\_, in the State of Victoria, appeared personally before me \_\_\_\_\_ duly appointed a Guardian of Minors for the District of \_\_\_\_\_, in which the said \_\_\_\_\_ is now resident, the said \_\_\_\_\_ being desirous to intermarry with \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_, and for the purpose of obtaining the consent of a Guardian of Minors. And the said \_\_\_\_\_ maketh oath and saith that \_\_\_\_\_ is under the age of twenty-one years, and that \_\_\_\_\_ hath no parent or guardian resident in the said State qualified to give such consent, and is not a widow.

Having made inquiry on oath as to the facts and circumstances of the case, I do hereby this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ One thousand \_\_\_\_\_ hundred and \_\_\_\_\_ give my consent to such marriage.

Guardian of Minors.

[The following directions appear on back of Form No. 4.]

Every consent must be in writing.

The following is the order in which persons are qualified to consent to Marriages of Minors:—

(I.)—The Father, if he be within Victoria, and have not forfeited his right.

(II.)—A Guardian appointed by the father. If there be none—

(III. and IIIA.)—The Mother, if she be within Victoria, and the father is dead or absent from Victoria and has not appointed a guardian; or if the father has forfeited his right (sec. 25 of Act 1582) and the minor is or has been living with the mother.

(IV.)—A Guardian of Minors (*i.e.*, any Police Magistrate, or any Justice specially appointed by the Chief Justice) if there be no such parent or guardian in Victoria, or if he or she be incapable of consenting by reason of absence, mental incapacity, or other substantial cause.

(V.)—The Secretary to the Department for Neglected Children or Reformatory Schools may consent to the marriage of a ward of the Department.

The Law is expressed in the following Clauses:—

Act 1166, Section 14.—If either party to any intended marriage not being a widow or widower be under the age of twenty-one years, such marriage shall not take place unless and until there be produced to the person about to celebrate the same the written consent of the father of such party if he be within Victoria, or if he be not within Victoria, of a guardian appointed by the father, or if there be no such guardian in Victoria of the mother of such party if she be within Victoria, or if there be no such parent or guardian in Victoria or if he or she be incapable of duly consenting by reason of absence mental incapacity or other substantial cause, the written consent (after inquiry on oath previously made as to the facts and circumstances of the case) of some justice appointed for that purpose, now termed "Guardian of Minors," under sec. 4 of Act No. 1582, as hereinafter mentioned.

Act 1582, Section 25.—Notwithstanding anything contained in section fourteen of the *Marriage Act* 1890—

(a) Where either party to any intended marriage (not being a widow or widower) is under the age of twenty-one years, and is or has been living with and under the care and control of the mother of such party, such mother having been unlawfully deserted by her husband or having obtained a protection order against him, or there having been pronounced a decree for the judicial separation nullity of marriage or dissolution of marriage of such mother and her husband, then in such case the marriage of such first-mentioned party may take place with the written consent of the mother of such party, or after the death of the mother in any such circumstances with the written consent of a guardian of minors; and

(b) Where either party to an intended marriage is a ward of the Department for Neglected Children or of the Department for Reformatory Schools the marriage of such party may take place with the written consent of the Secretary of the Department for Neglected Children or Reformatory Schools (as the case may be).

Section 26.—Every Police Magistrate shall without further or other appointment than this Act and whilst holding the office of Police Magistrate be a guardian of minors in and for Victoria, anything contained in the *Marriage Act* 1890 or this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 28.—Every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to Part I. of the *Marriage Act* 1890 or to the like effect.

The Penal Clauses referring to the Marriages of Minors are as follow:—

Act 1382, Section 21.—Every person guilty of a misdemeanour within the meaning of this Act or the *Marriage Act* 1890 shall be liable at the discretion of the court before which he is convicted to a penalty not exceeding Five hundred pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years, or to both such penalty and imprisonment as the court before which the person offending is convicted may award.

Act 1166, Section 23.—If any minister Government Statist or other officer or other person celebrate or profess or attempt to celebrate marriage in the case of any person under the age of twenty-one years not being a widower or widow without some such written consent as aforesaid knowing him or her to be under that age or knowing that the consent produced is not by the appropriate person, or wilfully celebrate or profess or attempt to celebrate any marriage in any other case contrary to any of the provisions in Part I. of this Act, or where any provision of such Part has not been complied with knowing the same not to have been complied with, every person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.

Section 24.—If any person marry a person under the age of twenty-one years without having previously obtained the written consent of the father or guardian or (where the mother is competent) of the mother of the person so under age, or the written consent of some justice appointed in that behalf, or induce or endeavour to induce any minister Government Statist or other officer to celebrate marriage between parties one of whom is under age without such consent, or abet or assist in any illegal marriage, every person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE  
 CHILTERN WEST COMMON.**

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, as Managers of the Chiltern West Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers, residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common for the half-year from 1st October to 31st March, both dates inclusive, in every year, shall be as follow:—

and the fees for depasturing stock on the Common for the half-year from 1st April to 30th September, both dates inclusive, in every year, shall be as follow:—

Progeny, under the age of nine months, of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free. Provided always that such progeny shall be duly registered.

4. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the Common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

6. No bull over nine months of age, and no stallion over twelve months of age, shall be allowed on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

7. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owner of such stock.

8. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock, and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand.

9. Stock not registered at the beginning of a half-year may be registered and paid for when put on the Common during the currency of the half-year, and in such cases may be tar-branded at the owners' yards, if found convenient.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence: and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
