Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice. practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WODONGA GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Wodonga General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :-

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby

rescinded.

2. All fees and charges made shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection, shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and pay the charge set forth in scale of fees, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the

No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the name, age, place of residence, and supposed cause of death of the deceased given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for

the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around

3 teet below that level, and a layer of earth at least I foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burial shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. throughout the year.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees, or some person appointed by them.

11. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

the owners.

12. All persons wilfully destroying property, or otherwise misconducting themselves, to be proceeded against under the authority of the Cemeteries Act 1890.

13. Dogs found in the Cemetery may be destroyed.

14. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of recommending, from time to time, for the approval of His Excellency the Governor, such alterations in these Rules and Regulations as to them may appear desirable.

A LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.

2. Orders for interment must be given to Mr. Theo. Ford, secretary, one of the trustees, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. the previous day.

- 3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 4. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.
- 5. The usual hours for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September till 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months of the year.
- 6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on the certificate of a Justice, or on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the cost and charges.
- 7. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument, in the Cemetery, to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper
- 8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to any other person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
- 9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
- 10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
- 11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a copy of every proposed epitaph, must be submitted to the trustees, for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- 12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper order and repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to owner.
- 13. A plan of the Cemetery will be kept, together with a registry, and may be inspected at the office of the
- 14. No servant, or any other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the Cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 39th section of the Act 54 Victoria, No. 1072.
 - 16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.
- 17. The trustees reserve the right to make any altera-tion from time to time in the regulations.
- 18. No interment shall be permitted until an applica-tion has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
- 10. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 20. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Marriage Act 1890, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make rules and regulations and alter and repeal the same for more effectually carrying out the provisions of the said Part: And whereas by the Marriage Act 1898 it is enacted that every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to Part I. of the Marriage Act 1890 or to the like effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, pursuant to the provisions of the Marriage Acts, repeal the Order in Council of the 20th February, 1899, so far as it relates to the Form of Consent to the Marriage of Minors, and in lieu thereof doth make the following No. 74.—June 9, 1909.—6874.—2. No. 74.-June 9, 1909,-6874,-2.

(V.)—The Secretary to the Department for Neglected Children or Reformatory Schools may consent to the marriage of a ward of the Department.

(b) Where either party to an intended marriage is a ward of the Department for Neglected thidden or of the Department for Reformatory Schools the marriage of such party may take place with the written consent of the Secretary of the Department for Neglected Children or Reformatory Schools (as the case may be).

Section 26.—Every Police Magistrate shall without further or other appointment than this Act and whilst holding the office of Police Magistrate be a guardian of minors in and for Victoria, anything contained in the Marriage Act 1890 or this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 28.—Every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to Part I. of the Marriage Act 1890 or to the like effect.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN WEST COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, as Managers of the Chiltern West Cemmon, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

- r. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- 2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers, residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common for the half-year from 1st October to 31st March, both dates inclusive, in every year, shall be as follow:—

For every horse For every head of other large cattle For every head of small cattle 4 0 ... 1 4

and the fees for depasturing stock on the Common for the half-year from 1st April to 30th September, both dates inclusive, in every year, shall be as follow:—

For every horse ' For every head of other large cattle For every head of small cattle ...

Progeny, under the age of nine months, of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free. Provided always that such progeny shall be duly registered.

- No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the Common as the managers may set apart for the pur-
- No bull over nine months of age, and no stallion over twelve months of age, shall be allowed on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.
- 7. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owner of such
- 8. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock, and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand. the Common brand.
- 9. Stock not registered at the beginning of a half-year may be registered and paid for when put on the Common during the currency of the half-year, and in such cases may be tar-branded at the owners' yards, if found con-

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
