Contingencies, 1909-10.

STIPULATIONS FOR SUPPLIES OF PROVISIONS.

(Where practicable, all items must be manufactured or prepared within the Commonwealth.)

Under all Sub-schedules particular attention is drawn to Clause 1 of the Condition as to quality.

BEER AND SPIRITS.

For brandy, whisky, and rum, porter in bulk, and for Guinness' porter in case, delivery will be taken at and from the bond, the contractor paying cost of re-gauging when required, and all other charges.

The contractor will be bound to supply such of the brands named in the tender as the departments may order. In cases where delivery from the bond is taken by the Government, the contractor will be required to hand to the secretary to the Tender Board the bond certificate and the locker's order and a copy of the entry, and pay all charges, including re-gauging, before delivery is taken.

English ale, brandy, whisky, and Guinness' porter in case must be delivered as imported; if bottled in the State it will not be accepted.

BREAD.

Samples of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as test loaves for first quality for fine wheat and pure wheaten Meal Bread. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal. *Pure wheaten Meal Bread of first quality may be substituted, wholly or in part, for fine wheaten Bread at such times and in such quantities as in the opinion of the Medical Superintendent may be deemed necessary, and the contractor will be required to supply such Bread at the contract rate. Reasonable notice, however, of the intention to substitute wheaten Meal Bread must be given to the contractor by the officer ordering the supply.* Bread may be baked at any Government establishment without infringing these contracts. At the Gaols, Beechworth, Ballarat, Geelong, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale, if required, bread must be supplied one day old, due notice to be given to the contractor of such requirement.

Under sub-schedules for Bread no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, or the delivery of the bread tendered for in these schedules shall not exceed 48 hours per week, and every such person engaged in the delivery of the bread shall be paid a wage of not less than £2 per week, or such other wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Bread Carter's Board under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and every person engaged in the manufacture or preparation of the bread shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Bread Board, or by the Court of Industrial Appeals, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which bread is prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of these conditions, or breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

In the event of bread being made at any Government establishment in the Melbourne District, during the currency of these contracts, the flour required will be drawn under the flour and maize meal sub-schedule. The maize meal for all the country gaols is included in the sub-schedule for flour and maize meal, and delivery of same will be required to be made at the Victorian Railways, Spencer-street.

GROCERIES, CANDLES, SOAP, TEA, ETC.

Candles, except those for prison cells, must be supplied in 1-lb. packets. Candles for prison cells must be delivered in boxes containing from 25 to 50 lbs. per box, the boxes for which must be legibly stencilled on one end, showing the estimated burning time and the gross, tare, and net weight of contents. The soap supplied must be hard throughout, ready for immediate use without waste. Soap for Lunatic Asylums is not included in

these contracts. When the quantity admits, tea must be supplied in original and unopened packages, labelled, as landed.

For s.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert* a certain quantity of Biscuits and Preserved Meat are sometimes required in lieu of fresh meat and fresh bread, and are included to meet such contingency only.

BUTTER AND JAMS.

Butter is to be delivered to the s.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert* in such quantities as may be ordered, and no excess over the quantity ordered will be received.

All Butter supplied, as well as the cases in which it is packed, must bear the impress stamp of the creamery manufacturing the Butter, otherwise it will be rejected. Any Butter and Cheese supplied may be tested at any time by the Government expert if considered by the officer ordering as not being up to standard quality.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the jam tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 hours per week, and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Jam Board under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which jam is prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

N.B.—Jams.—The weight stamped on the tins in accordance with the regulations under the Commerce Act, as indicating the minimum net quantity that each tin contains, shall for the purpose of this contract be taken as the actual contents when computing the quantity supplied.

When Jam is supplied in jars the jars remain the property of the contractor, and must be removed by the contractor at his own expense when empty.

MEAT.

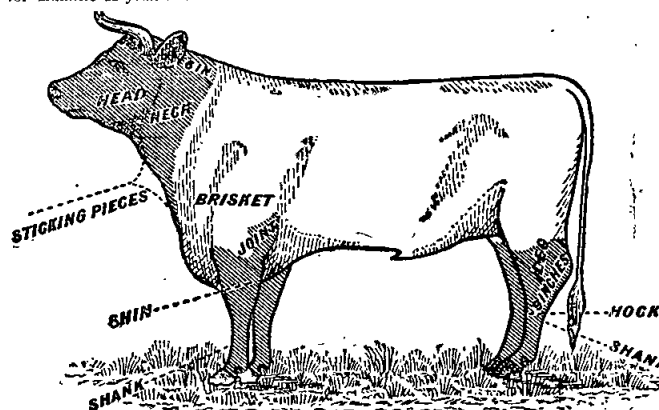
When fore and hind-quarters of beef are ordered for Hospitals for the Insane they must be supplied in the proportion of two of the former to one of the latter, and must be delivered as a whole respectively, also extra buttocks separately when ordered. Meat for other institutions must be supplied as ordered. Where hind-quarters or buttocks are ordered, 9 inches must be cut off from the end of the leg from the hock upwards, i.e., the end of the leg from which the shank has been removed at the abattoirs; and when fore-quarters form a portion of the supply, 6 inches from the end of the neck and the whole of the shin at the clodbone joint must be removed. The sticking pieces also must be trimmed off, and the point and end of the brisket rendered free from blood and blood stains.

Fore and hind-quarters, for convenience of handling, may be cut into two parts, but each part is to bear evidence of having been cut from the same beast.

Corned beef, rolled or round, as ordered, must be supplied without bone or cartilage and will be received, whether pumped or prepared in the ordinary way by pickling, but in the former case must have been soaked after pumping for at least 48 hours, in a good pickle, and then thoroughly drained before supply. No flank, chuck, sticking piece, shin, leg of beef, or piece under 7 lbs. will be received.

Should the local supply of fresh meat become scarce, or the price of same become abnormally high, frozen or chilled meat may, with the consent of the Tender Board on the recommendation of the head of the Department, be supplied.

In cases of emergency, or on such other occasions as in the opinion of the Inspector-General of the Insane may seem advisable, other forms of meat such as rabbits, fanned meats, &c., may be purchased apart from the contract, in lieu of the meat mentioned in the schedule, and substituted therefor, provided 24 hours' notice (except in cases of emergency) be given to the contractor of such intention.



The parts to be removed by the contractor are indicated by the shaded portions of the annexed diagram.

As regards supplies for s.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert*, all Meat must be of prime quality, and must be supplied in equal quantities from ribs, sirloin, and thick flanks; mutton to be delivered in sides; all kidney fat to be removed; meat containing an undue proportion of fat will not be accepted.

Under sub-schedules for Meat no subletting will be allowed; no delivery of meat shall be made on Sundays*; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the employment of any person engaged in the cutting up, preparation, or delivery of the meat tendered for in these schedules, and the wages paid to any such person shall be subject to the conditions of and in accordance with the determination of the Butchers Board appointed under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which meat is prepared under these contracts. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

MILK.

The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality it will be rejected, and any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

Under sub-schedules for Milk no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or the delivery of the milk tendered for in these schedules shall not exceed 60 hours per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £1 17s. 6d. per week, or £1 per week with board and lodging; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or dairy (and in each part of the factory or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which milk is prepared under these contracts. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

POTATOES AND VEGETABLES.

(Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractor to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to him, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.)

If the price of potatoes becomes abnormally high, the heads of the various departments concerned may, if they think fit, cause rice or any other suitable food to be occasionally substituted in lieu thereof. As regards vegetables for s.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert*, no subletting will be allowed. Cabbage to be free from outside leaves and stalks.

TOBACCO.

Tobacco for country Hospitals for the Insane is included in the sub-schedule for tobacco, and delivery of same will be required to be made at Spencer-street.

Tobacco for country Gaols is not included in this contract. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the Tobacco tendered for in this sub-schedule shall not exceed 48 hours per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £2 8s. per week for a man and £1 per week for a woman respectively; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which tobacco is prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

PROVISIONS FOR ROYAL AUSTRALIAN ARTILLERY.

Any sub-schedule may be tendered for, and may be accepted or rejected separately. Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Particular attention is drawn to clause 1 of the conditions as to quality.

the manufacture or preparation of the bread shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Bread Board or by the Court of Industrial Appeals, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which bread is prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determinations, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.
