### PROCLAMATION

KANGAROO ISLAND—SOUTH-WEST COAST.—CAPE DE COUÉDIE LIGHTHOUSE.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 8 of 1909, masters of vessels and others are hereby informed that the Light on Cape de Couédie was exhibited for the first time on the night of the 27th June, 1909.

The structure is of masonry, 55 feet in height, and is painted with red and white alternate bands. The focal plane of the light is 339 feet above sea level, O.H.W.S.

The light will be double-flashing, showing all round the horizon, and will show a flash for .33 seconds, eclipse 1.35 seconds; flash .33 seconds, eclipse 5.49 seconds. The light will be visible in clear weather for a distance of 27 miles.

The light is, however, obscured to the westward by the land at Cape Bedout on a line bearing N. 47 deg. W. and S. 47 deg. E., and to the eastward by Cape Kersaint on a line of bearing N. 81 deg. E. and S. 81 deg. W.

In addition to the above a subsidiary fixed light will be exhibited from the tower 60 feet lower than the main light, showing two sectors, as follows:—

- (1) Over the Lipson's Reef a red sector of 10 deg. between the bearings of N. 45 deg. 30 min. W. to N. 55 deg. 30 min. W., or N.W. to N.W. by W. westerly.
- (2) Over Casuarina Islands a white sector of 30 deg. between the bearings of N. 5 deg. W. and N. 25 deg. E., or N. ½ deg. W. to N.N.E. ½ deg. E.

Approximate lat., 36 deg. 4 min. 15 sec. S.; long., 136 deg. 42 min. 00 sec. E.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 52.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection and examination of candidates for employment in the Victorian Railways Service as Apprentice, Engine Cleaner, Fireman (Electric Light), Junior Clerk, Junior Telegraph Operator, Labourer, Lad Labourer, Lad Porter, Lamp Carboner, Porter, Repairer, Shunter, Skilled Labourer, Telegraph Lineman, Telegraph Operator, Telephone Attendant, or Wireman, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in an advertised vacancy in any of the positions referred to herein shall prepare, in his own handwriting, an application in the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for the position of (as the case may be).

2. The age of each candidate shall be not less than the minimum and not more than the maximum age shown hereunder opposite the particular grade in which he desires employment, viz. :—

with the exception that every youth at present in the permanent or supernumerary employment of the Commissioners who will not have reached the age of twenty years at the date of the opening of such applications, shall be eligible to become a candidate for the position of Apprentice, Junior Clerk, Junior Telegraph Operator, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter, provided that he has had continuous employment in the service of the Commissioners at least from the date on which he attained his eighteenth birthday.

The appointment, however, to the position of Apprentice of any such candidate who has had permanent or supernumerary service in the Department shall be subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) That such previous service as a permanent or supernumerary employé of the Commissioners shall not be taken into consideration in determining the period of his apprenticeship.
- (b) That the wage per day payable to him from year to year, during his term of apprenticeship, shall be at the respective rates of pay prescribed hereunder for Apprentices, and subject to the allowance fixed for Apprentices who reside away from home, irrespective of the wage he was in receipt as a permanent or supernumerary employé prior to his appointment as an Apprentice; and,
- (c) That he shall enrol himself as a student at the Working Men's College, and attend the prescribed classes of instruction at such College, but shall not be eligible to compete for any prizes or scholarships provided by the Commissioners for competition by Apprentices.

3. The height of each candidate for the position of Electric Light Fireman, Labourer, Lamp Carboner, Porter, Repairer, Shunter, Skilled Labourer, Telegraph Lineman, or Wireman, shall be not less than 5 feet 4 inches; and the height of each candidate for the position of Engine Cleaner shall be not less than 5 feet 5 inches.

4. The salary of every Junior Clerk and Junior Telegraph Operator on appointment shall be at the rate of £40 per annum, and the salary of every Telegraph Operator and Telephone Attendant on appointment shall be at the rate of £110 and £100 per annum respectively; and thereafter the rate of salary in each case shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being, subject, however, in every instance, to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the performance of the allotted duties, and the acquisition of such qualifications as may be deemed essential to meet the requirements of the particular Branch in which such Junior Clerk, Junior Telegraph Operator, Telegraph Operator, or Telephone Attendant, is employed.

5. The pay of every adult employé in the under-mentioned grades shall, on appointment, be at the rate specified hereunder for the particular grade in which he is employed, and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in

operation for the time being, subject, however, in every instance, to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the performance of the allotted duties:—

Shunter ...	21 years of age, 7s.; 22 years and over, 7s. 6d.
Skilled Labourer ...	21 years of age, 7s.; 22 years and over, 7s. 6d.
Telegraph Lineman ...	7s. 6d.
Wireman ...	8s. 6d.

with the exception that every Adult Engine Cleaner, Labourer, Porter, or Repairer, who immediately prior to the date of the ballot for precedence of appointment hereinafter referred to may have been engaged in the supernumerary service of the Commissioners at a wage in excess of 6s. per day shall on appointment be paid at the rate of 6s. 6d. per day; provided, however, that every such Adult Engine Cleaner, Labourer, Porter, or Repairer who, as a result of the ballot, is unsuccessful in obtaining immediate appointment, but whose services may be subsequently required, shall have had continuous employment in the service of the Commissioners from the date of such ballot to the date of his appointment.

6. The rate of pay of every Lad Labourer, Lad Porter, and Lad Engine Cleaner, shall, on appointment, be in accordance with his age, based on the following scale:—

and thereafter the rate of pay in each case shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; subject, however, to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the performance of the allotted duties.

7. Every Junior Clerk or Junior Telegraph Operator who, in consequence of his employment, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary, be granted an allowance of ninepence (9d.) per day towards his board and lodging expenses during such time as his salary continues to be £40 per annum; and in the case of an Apprentice, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter, an allowance, in addition to his ordinary rate of pay, will be granted in accordance with the following scale:—

8. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the Trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

9. Any candidate for the position of Junior Clerk, Labourer, or Lad Labourer, may specify the particular Branch in which he desires employment, but in the event of the number of successful applicants for any particular Branch being in excess of the number of Junior Clerks or Lad Labourers required for such Branch, the Commissioners reserve the right to allot the whole or any number of the successful candidates among the different Branches according to the order of precedence for appointment as determined by the ballot hereinafter referred to.

10. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth, which may be obtained from the office of the Government Statist, Melbourne, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted in lieu of such certified extract.

11. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employé, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment and the cause of his leaving such service; and any candidate who has been dismissed therefrom at any time, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the Service of the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

12. The Secretary for Railways, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, shall, on the day and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register,"

and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

13. If the number of candidates for employment in any grade be not more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade, the candidates for employment in such grade shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 19 to 31 inclusive of this Regulation.

14. If the number of candidates for employment in any grade be more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade, the number of candidates for employment in such grade shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number to be employed in the particular grade.

15. The Members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them, and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the Victorian Railways Service.

16. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

17. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

18. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

19. Every such candidate and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

20. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

21. Every such candidate for the position of Junior Clerk or Junior Telegraph Operator shall be required, by the Examiners appointed for that purpose, to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Merit Certificate, and, in addition, every such candidate for the position of Junior Telegraph Operator shall be required to prove his ability to send and to receive telegraph messages at the rate of 20 words per minute, and give satisfactory evidence of his knowledge of the principle and use of telegraph instruments.

22. Every such candidate for the position of Telegraph Operator or Telephone Attendant shall be required to satisfy the Educational Examiners that his educational qualifications are sufficient for the duties which he will be required to perform, and, in addition, every such candidate for the position of Telegraph Operator shall be required to prove his ability to send, and to receive by sound, telegraph messages at the rate of 30 words

per minute, and give satisfactory evidence of his knowledge of the maintenance and use of batteries, the tracing of the different circuits, the action necessary in cases of interruption, and the construction and principle of telegraph instruments; and every such candidate for the position of Telephone Attendant shall be required to produce satisfactory evidence of his having had at least two years' experience at switchboard work.

23. Every such candidate for the position of Apprentice, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter shall be required by the Educational Examiners to pass an examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Standard Certificate, and every such candidate for the position of Engine Cleaner, and for any adult position specified in Clause No. 5, shall pass a simple examination in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

24. Every such candidate for the position of Electric Light Fireman shall be required to produce a certificate of competency in firing and attending boilers, and documentary evidence of his knowledge of the operation of fuel-economizers, feed-pumps, and all boiler-house auxiliaries.

25. Every such candidate for the position of Lamp Carboner shall be required to produce documentary evidence of having served at least two years at such class of work.

26. Every such candidate for the position of Wireman shall be required to produce documentary evidence of his competency to perform all branches of work in connexion with Electric Light and Power Cables, and of his knowledge of the circuits and connexions of direct and alternating motors and static transformers.

27. Every such candidate for the position of Skilled Labourer shall be required to produce documentary evidence of his having performed skilled labouring work for a period of at least two years.

28. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firm or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years.

29. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the selected candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

30. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

31. After examination by the Educational Examiners, the successful candidates for each grade, provided that the number of such candidates be not in excess of the number required in the respective

grades by the Commissioners, shall be employed in order of merit according to the number of marks respectively allotted them by such Examiners, but if the successful candidates for employment in any grade be in excess of the number required by the Commissioners in such grade, the successful candidates in such grade shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz. :—

Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates for the particular grade.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

32. Every successful candidate in excess of the number required by the Commissioners in the particular grade for which he is a candidate shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade that may occur during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of such determination without further or other examination.

33. Every appointment shall be made on probation for a period of six months and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity and industry of the employé whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

34. Every Apprentice shall immediately enrol himself as a student at the Working Men's College, and shall attend the classes of instruction at such College appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over a period of three years.

35. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College at his own expense, but the Commissioners will pay the College fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College.

36. Every Apprentice so appointed shall present himself for the examinations of the aforesaid College, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations prescribed for each year of such course, and,

in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

37. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Coppersmith, Fitter and Turner, Instrument Maker and Moulder, who each year may be adjudged to have passed the best examination prescribed at the College for such apprentices shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively, according to their order of merit, provided that such apprentices obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks, with the exception that at the end of the third year the first in order of merit amongst such apprentices shall be nominated as a student in either the Electrical or Mechanical Engineering Course (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and the second in order of merit amongst such apprentices shall be awarded a prize of £5.

38. The Apprentice who may be nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering shall be afforded facilities to attend for two years the full-day course at the Working Men's College, and provided that such Apprentice pass the prescribed examination, and gain a diploma of the College in respect thereof, he shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College fees shall be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £7 per month.

39. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Carriage Trimmer, Gas Fitter, Lamp Maker, Painter, Sailmaker and Wood Machinist, who may be adjudged to have passed the best examination prescribed at the College for such Apprentices, shall at the end of each of the first three years be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively, according to their order of merit, provided that such Apprentices obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

40. Every Apprentice who fails to pass the prescribed examination at the end of either the First or the Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, subject to the reservation that except as provided in Clause 38, the term of tuition at the College at the expense of the Department will in every instance be limited to three years, and any Apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay his own fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College.

41. Every apprentice who fails to pass the prescribed examination at the end of either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is deemed guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College, or who is adjudged to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College, will render himself liable to the immediate determination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

42. The term of apprenticeship shall be six years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the six years exceed three months in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the six years exceeding three months in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond

the six years for a period equivalent to the period of leave of absence granted in excess of the three months.

43. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employé shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

#### STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 82.—COLIBAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the By-law following for the district supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said district for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure.

- (I.) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d., Twenty shillings per annum.
- (II.) Of any such tenement the valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d., Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £300, and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £700.
- (III.) Of lands on which there is no building, Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1909, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1910, and shall be payable on the first day of November, 1909, at the offices of the Commission at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY  
COMMISSION.BY-LAW NO. 81.—GENERAL RATE.—DEAKIN IRRIGATION AND  
WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of section 62 of the *Water Act 1905*, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Deakin Irrigation and Water Supply District except within any urban division thereof:—

WHEREAS by section 55 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII. No. 1962) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing, amongst other things, the form and manner of application for allotments, and the issue of permits for immediate occupation of allotments, and the rates of registration permit and lease fees payable, and generally for fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR  
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE MUNICIPAL  
DISTRICT OF HAMILTON.

THE Council of the Borough of Hamilton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-second day of September, One thousand nine hundred and eight, as a site for Public Recreation, in the Municipal District of Hamilton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions :—

- 1st Division.—The grandstand buildings and enclosure contiguous thereto.  
2nd Division.—The playing or sports ring, which is fenced in and surrounded by a fence.  
3rd Division.—The remainder of the reserve, which is fenced in and surrounded by a close fence, together with the buildings thereon.

2. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, and October, and from sunrise to 8.30 p.m., during the months of November, December, January, February, and March, except as hereinafter provided.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and any society, club, picnic party, or other combined body of persons shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the reserve and the buildings and erections for the time being thereon.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, chattels, or other property in or around the reserve, or pollute any water in the reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

5. No person shall interfere with or injure the trees, shrubs, flowers, or other property in the reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, rubbish, or any litter in the reserve.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; and no person shall light any fires in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

8. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, and all dogs brought into the reserve and all goats and poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. Public betting in any part of the reserve (including all buildings and enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the buildings or enclosures and the reserve.

10. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve, or any part thereof :—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.  
(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.  
(c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements, or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground would be injurious to it.  
(d) Being found in any part of the 1st or 3rd division of the reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gate-keeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the places wherein he or she may be found.  
(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

11. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding fifty in one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, entertainments, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows :—

For admission of every person to the 1st division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

For admission of every person to the 3rd division, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1s.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

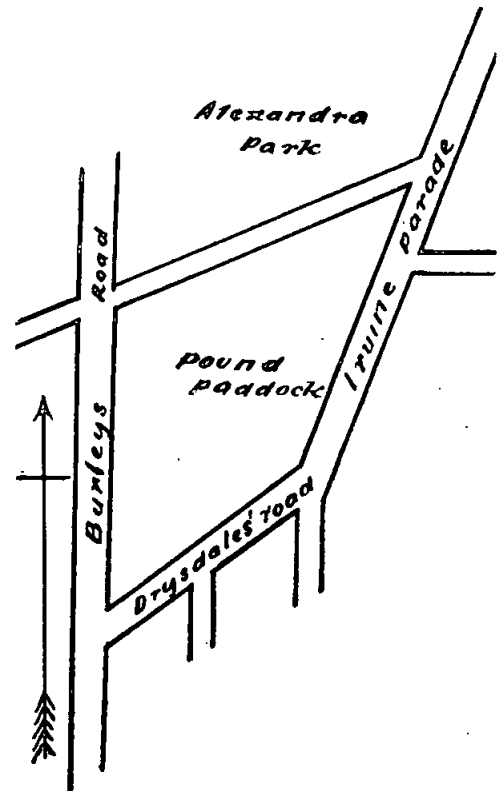
