BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

No: 4.

THE Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Act No. 1250 doth hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection and examination of candidates for employment as Engineering Students in the service of the Board of Land and Works (Railway Construction Branch), and doth hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto:—

- 1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment as an Engineering Student in an advertised vacancy shall prepare in his own handwriting an application in the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for the position of Engineering Student, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time and date fixed for the opening and dealing with such applications.
- 2. The age of every candidate for the position of Engineering Student shall not be less than sixteen years.
- 3. Every candidate shall forward with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth, which may be obtained from the office of the Government Statist, Melbourne, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted in lieu of such certified extract.
- 4. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department, or in the Public Service, or in the service of the Board of Land and Works, whether as a permanent or a supernumerary employé, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and the cause of his leaving such service; and any candidate who has been dismissed therefrom, either before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Board of Land and Works.
- 5. The salary of every Engineering Student shall on appointment be at the rate of £40 per annum, and thereafter at the rate of £60, £80, £100, and £120 for the second, third, fourth, and fifth years of his service respectively, subject, however, to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the service of the Board, and compliance with the conditions specified in Clause No. 6 of this Regulation.
- 6: Every Engineering Student shall attend the Melbourne University, and shall obtain the University degree in Engineering. Not more than two years will be allowed for the passing of each year's course; and failure to pass within such time will necessitate retirement from the service of the Board.

- 7. Every Engineering Student will be granted the necessary leave of absence with full pay to enable him to attend the University lectures.
- 8. The Secretary for Railways, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, shall, on the day and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.
- 9. If the number of candidates for employment as Engineering Students be not more than twice the number to be employed, the candidates shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 15 to 21 inclusive of this Regulation.
- 10. If the number of candidates for employment as Engineering Students be more than twice the number to be employed, the number of candidates shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number to be employed.
- 11. The Members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, 'nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them, and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Board of Land and Works.
- 12. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.
- 13. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.
- 14. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.
- 15. Every such candidate shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall
- pay a fee of 5s. .

 16. Every such candidate shail, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

- 17. Every such candidate shall produce to the Examiners a certificate of having passed an examination qualifying him to matriculate at the Melbourne University, and shall also pass an examination in drawing.
- 18. Every such candidate shall produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firm or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years.
- 19. The Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—
 - We, the undersigned, duly appointed Examiners under the "Railways Acts," do hereby certify that on the "190 we examined for the position of Engineering Student in the Railway Construction Branch of the Board of Land and Works, and allotted him marks, and accordingly certify that he is for such employment.

Examiners.

20. After examination by the Examiners, the successful candidates, provided that the number of such candidates be not in excess of the number required by the Board, shall be employed in order of merit according to the number of marks respectively allotted them by such Examiners, but if the successful candidates for employment be in excess of the number required by the Board, the successful candidates shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz:--

Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates for the particular grade.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

- 21. Every successful candidate in excess of the number required by the Board shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade that may occur during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of such determination without further or other examination.
- 22. Every appointment shall be made on probation for a period of six months and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Board, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the employé whilst in the service of the Board have been satisfactory. No probationer shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Victorian Railways Commissioners.
- 23. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employé shall, without previous notice, be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation without his having any claim whatsoever against the Board of Land and Works, if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
 - A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least tendays before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no cortificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Roard, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

- 8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.
- 9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.
