SHIRE OF BORUNG.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Borung, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 9, for prohibiting spitting and expectorating in certain places, and for preventing nuisances and securing the healthfulness of the said Shire and its inhabitants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and by the Health Acts, and every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Borung, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, orders as follows, that is to say:—

1. No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpath of any street or road, or on any pavement, floor, or wall of any place open to or frequented by the public.
2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the said Shire.
4. Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council the 21st day of May, 1910, and confirmed the 17th day of June, 1910.

CITY OF COLLINGWOOD.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Collingwood, numbered 52, and made under the provisions of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the Victoria Park within the said City.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood do hereby order as follows—

1. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the Victoria Park and to make a charge for admission thereto.

2. The Council shall have power to let the Park to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

3. No charge or fee for admission to such Park shall exceed 2s. for each adult person and 1s. for each child under the age of 12 years unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.

4. No person except the Mayor, Councillors, and Officers of the Council shall enter any portion of such Park when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

5. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of admission paid by him.

6. Such Park shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days and at such hours as a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.

7. No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever.

8. No person shall ride any bicycle or tricycle in or through the Park.

9. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the Park without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

10. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such Park.

11. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employes engaged in the Park by conversation or otherwise.

12. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such Park any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.

13. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency within the Park.

14. No person shall remain in such Park at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employe of the Council to leave the same.

15. No person shall spit or expectorate on any structure or erection in such Park.

16. All dogs and goats and all poultry found within the Park will be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.

17. *Definition.*—"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Collingwood. "Park" shall mean Victoria Park.

18. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

PROPOSED SHEPPARTON-IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The season at which such supply is to be received is to embrace the whole year.

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1910.

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1910 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the 1st day of August, 1910.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—PROPOSED BY-LAWS.—BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks District Trust, which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-laws:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid urban district and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July—

- (1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds or under, the rate shall be of such percentage according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year as shall produce the sum of Thirty shillings.
 - (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.
2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—
- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every One thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of Two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.
 - (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, in advance, or as may be agreed upon.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
- Passed this twentieth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and ten.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 1.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation. If such maximum quantity be exceeded such ratepayer shall pay by measure at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) For water supplied by measure, a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per annum.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1910, and shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of August, 1910.

Such persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time, for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks District Trust, which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-laws:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding £20 annual value ($\frac{1}{2}$) half-inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding £20 annual value ($\frac{3}{4}$) three-quarter inch; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case, except when special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables or manufacturing purposes or irrigation purposes.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering, nor shall any such person water by means of such hose or pipe the ground, trees, plants, or shrubs, or wash any house, walls, or carriage, or use such hose or pipe for any similar purpose unless where the water is charged for by meter; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach. To be enforced in case of shortage of water after notice is given.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

9. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects and capable of hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than twelve inches on public property and six inches on private property.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved, by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying on of a service pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring, or opening any lock, valve, pipe, or other work belonging to the Trust, or turning any tap, or carelessly or wilfully doing any other act whereby the water of the Trust may be wasted, or who carelessly or wilfully does any of the aforementioned acts with the intent that the water of the Trust may be wasted, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the By-law and not otherwise.

20. In the construction of these By-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Broadford Waterworks Trust.

21. No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first

affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Before any person licensed under clause 7 of this By-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £1, and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £1 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

23. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

24. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe work, weir, channel, reservoir, or injure the property of the Trust, and who shall wilfully trespass on the Trust's work or property, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

WHEREAS it is provided by the *Audit Act 1890* that the Governor in Council may from time to time frame such regulations (not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act) as may appear to be necessary and expedient for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas power is conferred under the *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* to rescind, revoke, amend, or vary such regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Repeal of previous Regulations.*—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of August, 1910, on which date the Regulations made on the 24th June, 1879, under the Act 22 Vict. No. 86, shall cease to be of any force or effect, and from which date the same are hereby rescinded.

2. The Registrar-General and Registrar of Titles shall make arrangements so that all public letters received at his office and containing money shall be opened by himself or in his absence by such officer as he may depute; and moneys so received must be brought to account forthwith, or if in fee stamps dealt with according to the Regulations under the Stamps Acts.

3. Should remittances in money or stamps be received by any other officer of the said office, the same shall be handed forthwith to the said Registrar and dealt with by him in the same manner as if such money or stamps had been received in a public letter. In such cases, however, a printed circular shall be used acknowledging such moneys or stamps and acquainting the remitter that such moneys or stamps should be forwarded to the said Registrar only.

4. The offices of the Registrar-General and Registrar of Titles and of the Collector of Imposts (Stamps Acts) and Comptroller of Stamps shall, except during the months of June, July, and August, be open to the public for the payment of fees, the filing, recording, and registering of documents, and for the purpose of making searches, from 10 o'clock in the forenoon till 1 o'clock in the afternoon, and from 1.45 until 4 o'clock in the afternoon, excepting on Saturdays, when the said offices shall be open for the above purposes from 10 o'clock till 11.30 o'clock in the forenoon. During the months of June, July, and August the said offices shall be open for the above purposes from 10 o'clock in the forenoon till 1 o'clock in the afternoon, and from 1.45 o'clock until 3.30 o'clock in the afternoon, excepting on Saturdays, when the said offices shall be open from 10 o'clock till 11.30 o'clock in the forenoon.

And the Honorable George Graham, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Treasurer for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANTING OF CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY, VICTORIA.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby revoke the Regulations providing for the granting of Certificates of Qualification as Engineers of Water Supply made on the 28th day of August 1906, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th September, 1906, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations providing for the issue by the Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply, of Certificates of Qualification as Engineers of Water Supply.

Regulations.

The Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply will issue Certificates of Qualification as Engineers of Water Supply, after examination or without examination, as the case may be, to such candidates as shall comply with some one of the conditions following:—

- (I.) After examination—to every such candidate as shall satisfactorily pass the examination conducted by such Board in accordance with regulations from time to time made for that purpose by the Governor in Council; every such candidate having first satisfied such Board that he has been properly educated, and trained during not less than two years, for the profession of a civil engineer, and has been further engaged for not less than two years (exclusive of any such period of training or pupilage) in active engineering work, not less than one year of which further period shall have been in connexion with hydraulic work.
- (II.) Without examination—to every such candidate as shall satisfy such Board in respect of one of the following matters:—

That he is a corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers of London:

That he is a certificated engineer or master of engineering of a university of one of the Australian States or New Zealand, or of one of the universities of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of a university whose graduates are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*:

That he has been appointed to the office of engineer in charge of the construction of waterworks carried out under the provisions of some Act of Parliament repealed by the *Water Act* 1905.

But no certificate without examination will be issued to any candidate unless he shall further satisfy the Board that he has been employed for not less than five years in some responsible professional capacity in charge of the construction and management of hydraulic works.

Condition 1.—Certificates after Examination.

Examinations of candidates for Certificates of Qualification shall be held in Melbourne at such place as the Board may from time to time name for the purpose, in the months of March and September in each year.

An intending candidate must, prior to the date of examination, give at least fourteen days' notice, in writing, of his intention to present himself, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that he has been properly educated and trained as required by Regulation (I.), and has been engaged for not less than two years in active engineering work, not less than one year of which period shall have been in connexion with hydraulic work.

Upon his application being approved by the Board, the candidate shall pay a fee of Three pounds three shillings into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and shall forward the receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

Candidates whose applications have been approved by the Board shall be required to pass an examination in the following subjects:—

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

I.—*Surveying.*

Topographical surveying.
Engineering trial surveys.

Permanent engineering surveys, including the setting out of work.
Quantities surveying.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors, or of the Board of Examiners for Mining Surveyors in Victoria, or who have taken a degree in Engineering in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in surveying; unless, in the opinion of the Board, the examination for such certificate or degree did not cover the same ground as the Board's examination in surveying; in which case they may be required to pass such further examination therein as the Board shall decide.

II.—*General Principles of Civil Engineering.*

Strength of materials, co-efficients of strength.
Production and transmission of strains in structures.
General laws of statics.
Principles of dynamics.
Factors of safety in strength and in stability.

III.—*Engineering Structures.*

Principles of engineering construction.
Special structures in stone masonry, brick-work, carpentry, cast and wrought iron.
Combined structures.
Composition and use of lime and cement mortars and concretes.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Municipal Surveyors Board in Victoria, or who have taken a degree in Civil Engineering in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in General Principles of Civil Engineering and in Engineering Structures.

IV.—*Hydraulic Engineering.*

Part I.—*Theoretical Hydraulic Science.*

1. *Hydrostatics.*—Water pressure and its transmission.
2. *Hydraulics.*—Velocity of discharge of water through orifices; through pipes, tubes, and other closed conduits; discharge over weirs; flow of water in rivers and canals; water as a source of power; principles of the construction of water meters; dynamics of flowing water.
3. *Sources of Water Supply.*—Rainfall and river discharge; discharge from water-sheds and its relation to rainfall; losses by evaporation, percolation, &c.
4. *Quantity and Quality of Supplies.*—Demand for domestic water supply in towns, in rural districts; demands for stock supply, for irrigation.

Part II.—*Practical Hydraulic Science.*

1. *Structures.*—Principles of construction of masonry dams; their stability; of earthen dams; of timber weirs; of compound structures; setting out and construction of channels, flumes, syphons, sluices, and head gates.

(N.B.—The candidate may be required to describe important structures with which he is acquainted, either by personal observation or from reading and study.)

2. *Water Supply.*—Gravitation and pumping schemes; purification of water by filtration, by precipitation; storage of water; distribution and pressure reservoirs, and water towers; pipe reticulations; valves and fittings; fire-plugs and hydrants; control and maintenance of water supply systems.

3. *Irrigation.*—Application of water in irrigation; duty of water; distributing channels; sluices, regulators, and escapes; preparation and drainage of irrigated land.

4. *Pumping.*—Suction pumps; plunger and other force pumps; centrifugal pumps; pumping engines; steam pumps; hydraulic motors; turbines.

Note.—Candidates who have taken a degree in Engineering in the University of Melbourne will be exempt from the examination in Hydraulic Engineering, Parts I. and II.; unless, in the opinion of the Board, the examination for such degree did not cover the same ground as the Board's examination; in which case they may be required to pass such further examination therein as the Board shall decide.

Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. A selection of manuals of formulæ and books of tables, such as ordinarily used by draughtsmen and computers, will be available, and may be referred to by candidates, in the examination room; lists of such manuals and books may be obtained from the Secretary to the Board; but no candidate will be permitted to refer to any other manual or book, or to leave the room, during the progress of the examination.

Condition II.—Certificates without Examination.

A candidate applying for a Certificate of Qualification without examination must submit proof that he is qualified under some one of the provisions of Regulation (II.).

Upon his application being approved by the Board, the candidate shall pay a fee of Three pounds three shillings into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward the receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

Any candidate who shall have passed the examination prescribed by Condition I. of these Regulations, or who shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Board that he has complied with the requirements of Condition II., shall be entitled to and shall receive the certificate of the Board that he is duly qualified to act as an Engineer of Water Supply under the provisions of the *Water Acts*.

Every such certificate shall show whether it has been issued in respect of the candidate having passed the examination prescribed by Condition I. of these Regulations, or without examination, under Condition II.; and if without examination shall state in respect of what pre-existing qualification it has been issued.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF
THE MILDURA COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to the Common made by the Governor in Council, on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Managers of the Mildura Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person entitled to use the Common for depasturing purposes shall be at liberty to place stock thereon in accordance with the following Regulations:

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year:—

For every horse, at the rate of 5s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, at the rate of 5s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, at the rate of 2s. 6d. per annum.

Progeny, under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free.

3. The Managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the Managers and herdsman shall attend at such time and places for the purpose aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand.

4. All cattle, excepting horses, depasturing on the Common shall have round the neck the Common chain, padlock, and brand.

5. All unregistered stock found depasturing on the Common, except travelling cattle, shall be liable to be immediately impounded or the owners thereof prosecuted.

6. No bull, entire horse, or pig shall be depastured on the Common without the consent, in writing, of the Managers. Sheep shall be depastured on such portion only of the Common as the Managers may set apart for the purpose.

7. All cattle suspected of being diseased shall be removed by the owners within 24 hours after notice to do so has been given to them, and in default of compliance with such notice, the Managers shall be at liberty to destroy such cattle at the expense of the owners thereof.

8. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcass be not removed after six (6) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the Managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owners thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expense so incurred has been paid.

9. Carriers and other travellers shall be allowed to depasture teams 24 hours on the Common free of charge; after that time a fee of One shilling (1s.) per week per head, or Threepence (3d.) per head per night for part of week, will be charged.

10. The Managers reserve the right to muster at any time all or any part of the herd depasturing on the Common; the expense of such musters to be paid out of the Common Fund.

11. The herdsman shall immediately report to the Managers any disease in the stock on the Common. The Managers shall not be liable for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the Common. The herdsman shall visit and inspect all stock depasturing on the Common three times at least in each week, and in the event of any having strayed, he shall give notice, in writing, to the owners of such stock within 24 hours of missing same, and in the event of stock straying from the Common and being impounded, the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners thereof for the impounding expenses and the safe return of such stock, if the foregoing notice shall not have been given.

Every person offending against any of the preceding Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

4. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in any cabmen's shelter.

5. No person shall in any cabmen's shelter behave in a disorderly or noisy manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall do any damage to or soil or injure any cabmen's shelter, or the furniture or fittings thereof.

7. No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement on the outside or inside of any cabmen's shelter, or on any furniture or fittings thereof, without the permission of the said Council.

8. No person shall expectorate on the floor or the outside or inside walls of any cabmen's shelter, or on any furniture or fittings thereof.

9. No person shall play any unlawful game in any cabmen's shelter.

10. No person, whether licensed or not, shall enter or remain in any cabmen's shelter between the hours of half-past Twelve o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the same morning unless he is employed by the Council of the said city.

11. This By-law shall come into operation on the first day of September, One thousand nine hundred and ten.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the city.
