#### COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT CONCERNING LANDS ACQUISITION BY THE LANDS PURCHASE AND MANAGEMENT BOARD, ETC.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 16th day of September, 1910, appointed

JOHN BURNETT BOX, Esquire, a Judge of the County Courts of the State of Victoria,

a Royal Commission to inquire and report into and concerning the several matters following, that is to say:—

1. The circumstances connected with or incidental to the acquisition since the first January 1908 by the Lands Purchase and Management Board of Lands in the parishes of Macorna, Gunbower and Gunbower West, all in the county of Gunbower acquired by it for the purpose of Closer Settlement under the Closer Settlement Acts of the said State.

2. The nature of and the circumstances connected with or incidental to any dealings or transactions in relation to any of such lands that may have taken place or occurred between the first day of January 1908 and this date, between any body person or persons who during that period had or could at any time claim any estate or interest either at law or in equity in any of such lands and any body person or persons other than the Lands Purchase and Management Board.

3. As to whether in connexion with any purchase or projected or possible purchase of land generally in the neighbourhood or of any particular land or lands, any information official, or otherwise has been prematurely or at any time improperly or in breach of good faith or at all disclosed or made use of by any official or other person on whose reticence discretion or secrecy the authorities were entitled to rely and as to whether any such official or other person made any use of information acquired in any official fiduciary or confidential capacity to benefit himself or some other person in any of the cases aforesaid, the name of the official or officials concerned as well as that of any person or persons benefited or intended so to be with the nature of the transaction or transactions and the character of the official's connexion with the matter to be given.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING  
TO THE LICENSING OF SAILING AND MOTOR  
BOATS, ETC.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

This Regulation shall form portion of "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations, 1908," made by the Board on the seventh day of September, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the thirtieth day of September, 1908, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1910, on which date paragraph 23 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraph, namely:—

23. *Extinguishing Fire*.—Every Motor Boat and every Motor Sailing Boat fitted with an engine generating power by petrol or other oil, and in respect of which application is made for the granting of a licence under these Regulations, shall, for the purpose of extinguishing fire, be furnished with and at all times carry, in a position approved by the inspecting officer:—

(a) A proportionate quantity of dry sand, equal to one-half of a cubic foot for every complete 12 feet in length of the hull; such sand, together with a suitable scoop or shovel, shall be kept in a box readily accessible for use in case of emergency.

(b) A fire bucket, painted red, with suitable lanyard attached, to be used only in case of fire.

The foregoing amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this second day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and ten.

*The Marine Act 1890.*AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS  
RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION  
OF MASTERS AND MATES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the regulations following, that is to say:—

- (1) These regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations), and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the first day of November, 1910, on which date clauses (d), (e), (j), and (l) of paragraph 53, and clauses (a) and (u) of paragraph 64 of the aforesaid regulations shall be repealed.

- (2) *Physical or Mental Disability*.—If during the progress of an examination the examiner finds that a candidate is afflicted with deafness, with an impediment in his speech, or with some other physical or mental infirmity, and he is satisfied upon further investigation that the degree of deafness or of the impediment or other infirmity is such as to render the candidate incompetent to discharge the ordinary duties of a mate or master at sea, he shall immediately discontinue the examination of such candidate, and report the circumstances to the Board, and the examination fee paid by the candidate shall be returned to him by the Secretary.

If the candidate subsequently produces a medical certificate to the effect that his hearing, speech, or physical or mental condition has improved, or is normal, the Board will take into consideration the question of allowing the candidate to present himself again for examination.

## CERTIFICATES FOR FOREIGN-GOING SHIPS.

- (3) *Second Mates' Examination in Navigation*.—To clause (l) of paragraph 35 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

He will also be required to state what the small numbers and Roman numerals found on a chart indicate, and give a method of finding approximately the time of high water at any given place without the aid of the Admiralty or other Tide Tables.

- (4) *First or Only Mates' Examination in Navigation*.—After clause (m) of paragraph 39 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

(m<sup>2</sup>) To find on a chart or plan the course to steer by compass in order to counteract the effect of a given current, and find the distance the ship will make good towards a given point in a given time; to fix a ship's position on a chart or plan by horizontal sextant angles, using a station pointer; and to work out practically the correction to apply to soundings taken at a given time and place to compare with the depth marked on the chart.

And after clause (p) of the same paragraph there shall be added the following, namely:—

- (q) The measurement and equipment of ships' life-boats, and number of persons allowed to be carried in each class of boat.

- (r) Testing of life-buoys and life-belts.
- (s) The screening of ships' side lights.
- (5) *First or Only Mates' Examination in Seamanship.*—After clause (g) of paragraph 40 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely :—
  - (g<sup>2</sup>) The stowage of grain cargoes.

#### CERTIFICATES OF FOREIGN-GOING STEAM-SHIPS.

- (6) *Second Mates' Examination in Seamanship.*—For clauses (d), (e), (j), and (l) respectively of paragraph 53 of the principal regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely :—
  - (d) Seeing everything in readiness and clear for getting under way, and the precautions to be then observed with regard to steering gear and connexions, engines, propeller, &c.
  - (e) Care and usage of patent logs and leads.
  - (j) The marking and use of the ordinary lead and log lines.
  - (l) Engine-room and other telegraphs used on board ship, and deck appliances generally.
- (7) *First or Only Mates' Examination in Seamanship.*—After clause (f) of paragraph 57 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely :—
  - (f<sup>2</sup>) The stowage of grain cargoes.
- (8) *Masters' Examination in Seamanship.*—After clause (f) of paragraph 60 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely :—
  - (f<sup>2</sup>) Economy in coal consumption

#### EXTRA AND HONORARY CERTIFICATES.

- (9) *Extra Masters' Examination in Navigation.*—For clause (n) of paragraph 64 of the principal regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely :—
  - (n) To construct a plan or chart on Mercator's principle, and solve a given problem thereon.
 And after clause (o) of the same paragraph there shall be added the following, namely :—
  - (o<sup>2</sup>) To give written answers to from six to ten questions on naval architecture, and sketches where required.

#### CERTIFICATES FOR HOME TRADE SHIPS.

- (10) *Mates' Examination in Navigation.*—To paragraph 71 of the principal regulations there shall be added the following, namely :—

He will also be required to state what the small numbers and Roman numerals found on a chart indicate, and give a method of finding approximately the time of high water at any given place without the aid of the Admiralty or other Tide Tables.

4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF FORSTER AND COMPANY PROPRIETARY LIMITED, WHITEWORKERS AND COSTUMIERS, HOSIER-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 12th September, 1910, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-five hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE DISPOSAL OF LANDS ACQUIRED UNDER THE CLOSER SETTLEMENT ACTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of September, 1910.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Closer Settlement Acts it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing, amongst other things, the regulation of meetings and procedure of the Board, and generally for fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, to have effect from and after the first day of March, 1910, that is to say:—

The Regulations approved of by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 3rd day of December, 1907, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th December, 1907, are hereby rescinded.

The following additions and alterations are made in Regulations made on the 10th day of May, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th May, 1910:—

## CHAPTER I.

In clause 7, after the word "applicants" in the third line, all the words are rescinded.

Clause 8 is hereby rescinded.

The following clauses shall be added:—

21A. The ordinary lease shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, with the appropriate modifications as indicated applicable to the class of allotment applied for. In the case of an allotment where special conditions are to be inserted, the ordinary form shall be used with such additions and alterations as the circumstances may require.

23A. The lease shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and may contain such additional provisions, not inconsistent with the Closer Settlement Acts, or these regulations, as the Board thinks fit.

30A. The lease shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and may contain such additional provisions, not inconsistent with the Closer Settlement Acts, or these regulations, as the Board thinks fit.

## CHAPTER II.

In clause 5, after the words "set forth" in the sixth line, the words "the amount so advanced or" shall be added.

## CHAPTER III.

In clause 3, at the end of the second line, the word "one" is hereby rescinded, and the word "four" substituted.

7. Crown grants of land sold under the provisions of the sections of the Closer Settlement Acts hereinafter referred to and Part 3 of the *Land Act 1898*, and Part 4 of the *Land Act 1901*, except land acquired under the *Brunswick Lands Purchase Act 1900*, shall be in the forms prescribed in the Thirty-fourth, Thirty-fifth, and Thirty-sixth Schedules, and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

8. Crown grants under the provisions of section 57 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* as amended by sections 10 and 11 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1906* shall be in a form to the like effect as the Thirty-fourth Schedule, except that the words "as amended by the *Closer Settlement Act 1906*" shall be added after the first and third references to the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* and the words "as so amended" shall be added at the end of the parenthetical clause in the recital.

9A. Crown grants of land acquired under the *Brunswick Lands Purchase Act 1900*, leased under Part 3 of the *Land Act 1898* and Part 4 of the *Land Act 1901*, shall be in the forms prescribed in the Thirty-seventh Schedule, and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

9B. Crown grants under the provisions of section 60 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904*, and of section 60 of the

*Closer Settlement Act 1904*, as amended by section 12 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1906*, or section 77 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1909* (No. 2), with consequential amendments, shall be in the form prescribed in the Thirty-fifth Schedule, and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

Clause 14 is hereby rescinded, and the following clause is substituted:—

14. A preferable lien on crops to be given by the lessee, if required by the Board when the overdue instalments, either of purchase money or advances, exceed 60 per cent. of the unencumbered value of improvements, shall be in the form of the Ninth Schedule of the *Instruments Act 1890*, with the modifications in the form as prescribed in the Twentieth Schedule hereto.

## Miscellaneous.

15. That where the lessee is in arrear with payment of the instalments due under his lease or has obtained suspension of payments, he shall insure all buildings situated on the land, up to at least three-fifths of the value of the said buildings, in the name of himself and the Secretary of the Lands Purchase and Management Board, and shall pay the premiums thereon as they fall due. The policy shall be lodged with the Board and also the premium receipts.

16. That where the Board makes an advance for building or other purposes, the lessee shall insure all buildings to their full value in the name of the Secretary of the Lands Purchase and Management Board, and shall pay the premiums thereon as they fall due. The policy shall be lodged with the Board and also the premium receipts.

## CHAPTER IV.

11A. The applicant for an advance shall sign the form of charge set forth on the Tenth Schedule hereto, which charge shall be indorsed on the applicant's Conditional Purchase lease, and shall set forth the amount of such advance which, together with interest thereon at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, shall be paid by the lessee by equal instalments, extending over such period, being not more than ten years, as the Board thinks fit to determine.

In the Fourteenth Schedule of the said Regulations, wherever the words "31 days" appear there shall be substituted the words "two months."

The Twentieth Schedule of the said Regulations is hereby rescinded, and a form as prescribed in the Twentieth Schedule hereto substituted.

cessors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever in upon and under the said demised premises together with liberty for His Majesty his heirs and successors and his or their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times during the continuance of this demise to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein or thereon for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to remove therefrom any gold silver auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining: Provided that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals or minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter thereon and to mine and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those which persons so qualified had at the date of these presents to mine in and upon Crown lands: Provided that compensation shall be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns by any such person for surface damage to be done to such land by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by law and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry: Yielding and paying therefor the sum of £ s. d. by equal half-yearly instalments of £ s. d. each and a final instalment of £ s. d. on the first day of \_\_\_\_\_ and the first day of \_\_\_\_\_ in every year clear of all deductions: Payment of the first of such half-yearly instalments having been made the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of \_\_\_\_\_ that will be in the year One thousand nine hundred and \_\_\_\_\_ and the final instalment to be made on the first day of \_\_\_\_\_ next following the expiration of the term hereby created: And the lessee doth hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant and agree with His Majesty his heirs and successors and with the Board that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will observe and perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

1. That he or they will pay the instalments payable hereunder at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. That he or they will during the continuance of this demise pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises.

3. That these presents are upon this condition that the lessee unless prevented by illness certified to the satisfaction of the Board will during the currency of this lease personally reside on the land demised eight months during each year this condition of personal residence may be complied with to the satisfaction of the Board in accordance with the provisions of section 84 of the *Land Act 1901* and these presents are on this further condition that upon a transfer of these presents pursuant to law the transferee shall personally reside on the allotment for eight months during each and every year of the currency of this lease: Provided that for the purposes of this condition a residence shall be deemed to be complied with if the lessee with the consent of the Board resides with his family either on any part of the estate of which this allotment formed a portion when acquired by the Board or on any land adjoining or separated only by a road or water-course from such allotment.

4. That these presents are upon this further condition that neither he nor they will transfer assign mortgage sublet or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised within the first six years of this lease: Provided that in the case at any time of the insolvency or death of the lessee that firstly it shall not be obligatory on the assignee or trustee in insolvency or on the executors or administrator of the lessee to comply with the condition of residence hereinbefore contained and secondly that it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency or for the executors or administrator of the lessee at any time within twelve months from the date of such insolvency or death to assign with the written consent of the Board these presents to any person who is qualified for becoming a lessee under the Closer Settlement Acts and such person shall thereupon be with respect to this lease in the same position as though he had been the original lessee: Provided in case this lease is assigned to any person by such assignee or trustee in insolvency or the

executors or administrators of the lessee such lessee not having personally resided on the allotment pursuant to the conditions of these presents in that behalf or no proof satisfactory to the Board being given of such residence the Governor in Council may date such assigned lease so as to enable the new lessee to comply with the said condition of residence and may make such adjustments of the purchase money as are necessary and these presents shall be read and construed accordingly.

5. That he or they after the expiration of the six years in the last preceding clause mentioned will not transfer assign or mortgage any part of the land hereby demised without the written consent of the Board first had and obtained it being a condition of these presents that if at any time after the expiration of the first six years hereof the Board is satisfied that all the covenants and conditions hereof have been complied with that the lessee may with the written consent of the Board transfer assign mortgage sublet or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised.

No. 2240) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations generally for carrying the said Act into execution: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Order of the 1st March, 1910, making Regulations relating to Miners' Accidents Relief, in so far as the said Order refers to Regulation No. 25, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT 1909, NO. 2240, DIVISION 14—MINERS' ACCIDENTS RELIEF.

### Committee's Expenses.

25. For the purpose of remunerating its officers and of paying local expenses under the Act and the Regulations not otherwise provided for, each Committee or joint Committee shall be paid from the fund an amount equal to

seven and a half per centum on the moneys received by it in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, but not being greater than £37 10s. nor less than £2 10s. per annum.

The first payment after the commencement of this Act shall be made on the moneys so received by the Committee from the date of its appointment, subsequent payments shall be made on the moneys so received after the date of the last receipts on which payment was made.

The payments to Committees for such expenses shall be made quarterly, and shall be paid direct to the Committees by the Board.

And the said Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts and the Regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by such rules, the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order of the 6th day of July, 1908.

WHEREAS the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Water Acts under the provisions of said Acts has, by writing under his hand, published his declaration in due form, that the lands included in the area defined in such declaration ought to be constituted a Waterworks District, which declaration has been published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 22nd day of June, 1910, and also in the *Poulett Express* of the 8th July, 1910, a newspaper circulating generally within the said area, and a copy of such declaration has lain before Parliament for thirty days: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers conferred upon him by the

said Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth order as follows, that is to say:—

That the area included within the boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted a Waterworks District (and as on and from the date hereof such area shall be deemed to be so constituted):—

- (1) That the boundaries of such district shall be those set out and described in the aforesaid Schedule.
- (2) That the name of such district shall be Wonthaggi Waterworks District.
- (3) That the scheme of works for the service of such district shall be a storage reservoir on Lance Creek, a supply main therefrom, service basin, elevated tank, pumping station, and reticulation pipes in the said Waterworks District.
- (4) That the estimated cost of such scheme is £59,000.
- (5) That the source from which the district is to be supplied with water shall be the Lance Creek.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish or abolish (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE CARNHAM AND CHEPSTOWE UNITED GOLD-FIELD AND TOWN COMMON is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom one thousand eight hundred acres, more or less, of land in the parishes of Argyle and Carnham, being the portion comprised in the Lintons State Forest, as set out in the First Schedule to the *Forests Act 1907*.—(10.C.47811.)

THE CHILTERN COMMON is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom such portions as are not comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the east boundary of the parish of Chiltern where the north boundary of the Chiltern United Borough and Gold-field Common abuts thereon; thence west by the last-mentioned boundary to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 14 of section 11, parish of

Chiltern; thence north-westerly and westerly by that road to the east boundary of B. Donckis' block; thence north-easterly and westerly by that block to the north-west angle thereof; thence north by a line about fifty-eight chains fifty links; thence east by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section A; thence easterly by the south boundary of that allotment, and by a direct line to the south-west angle of allotment 24 of section 19; thence east by the south boundary of that allotment and a line to the east boundary of the parish of Chiltern; and thence south by that boundary to the point of commencement.
