Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

—RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject matter herein in respect of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be, and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such persons may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1910), to the 31st day of March in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1910), to the 31st day of March in each succeeding year shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring water.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands shall be—

During the period from the 1st day of April to the 31st day of May in every year (beginning with the year 1911), Five shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the period from 1st day of August to the 30th day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1911), Two shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

7. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purposes of this and any By-law, making an Irrigation Charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Tatura, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner, as the Commission may direct.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WOORT WOORT.

WE, Walter Archibald Jeans, Joseph Ethelbert Hodges, Thomas Cooke, Albert Andrew Simmonds, and Daniel Thomas McKee, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 18th January, 1909, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Woort Woort, having framed the following regulations for care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

- (1) The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty-four in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve.
- (2) No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall light therein any fire.
- (4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- (5) No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
- (6) No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

(7) No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF DUNED, AND KNOWN AS THE "MOUNT DUNED RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Alfred Gilbert White, George Williams, James Rainford, Robert Preston, David McLaren White-law, Patrick Fechan, and August Forster, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 8th February, 1886, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Duned, and known as the "Mount Duned Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—
 - For the admission of every person not less than fifteen years of age, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
 - For the admission of every person under the age of fifteen years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding the sum of Sixpence.
 - For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

3. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, and then only in such place or places as the Committee of Management shall indicate, and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with any live or dead timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, rockeries, or any vegetation of any kind in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or cut names on the fences, gates, pavilions, bowers, or seats in the Reserve, or damage in any way any of the buildings, bowers, seats, or other erections or other improvements therein, or roll or throw stones or any other missiles in the Reserve.

5. No person shall discharge firearms in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, or leave therein any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish of any kind. No person shall stick bills or advertisements on any fence, gate, or building or any erection in the Reserve.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale any article of any description in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any of the plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

9. No person shall behave in a disorderly or objectionable manner in the Reserve, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct therein.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve or allow to stray therein any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, or poultry without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____" as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

The conditions of contract are those under "Firewood," published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th August, 1910, page 3895.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
