1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of One pound sterling, except for unoccupied lands where no water is laid on, and on these the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of valuation.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds and not exceeding Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.
4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Two hundred pounds and not exceeding Three hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.
5. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Three hundred pounds, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.
6. Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.
7. Such person as shall be appointed by the Commissioners (from time to time) for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates hereby made.

**WHEREAS** the Governor in Council is empowered by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1906* to make regulations regarding the transfer or removal within Victoria of any particular kind of tree, plant, or vegetable likely in opinion of the Governor in Council to spread any disease or insect in any specified portion of Victoria; and whereas the Governor in Council has proclaimed certain portions from which the removal of potatoes is, subject to regulations, prohibited: Now therefore the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. No potatoes shall be removed from any proclaimed portion of Victoria unless accompanied by a certificate from an Inspector appointed by the Minister of Agriculture setting forth that the potatoes have been inspected and are to the best of his knowledge free from disease.

2. Every grower of potatoes in any proclaimed portion of Victoria shall notify the Secretary for Agriculture that he is planting potatoes, and shall state the area under crop. Such notice shall be given within fourteen days of the date of planting of the potatoes.

3. All consignments of potatoes from any proclaimed portion of Victoria shall be forwarded (1) direct to a Government store at Melbourne; or (2) to the ship's side, and shall not be removed from the railway truck at the ship's side unless so permitted by an officer of the Department of Agriculture. The final destination of all such potatoes shall be subject to the approval of the officer aforesaid.

4. The consignor at the railway station whence the potatoes are forwarded shall sign a statement in the form of Schedule A that he will comply with the above-mentioned conditions.

5. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of, or who shall fail to comply with, these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty, for the first offence, not exceeding One pound, and for any subsequent offence, not exceeding Ten pounds.

## CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

1. The term shall be twenty-one (21) years (the maximum allowed under the Act), commencing at the expiry of one (1) calendar month from the date of sale, but parliamentary authority will be sought for an extension of the term to 33 years, and if such be granted no increased rental will be charged.

AT COHUNA.
