

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT TO 30TH JUNE, 1910.

COMPILED FROM OFFICIAL RETURNS IN THE OFFICE OF THE
GOVERNMENT STATIST.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH JUNE, 1910.

Population.—The estimated population on 31st March, 1910, was 1,302,934—656,675 males, 646,259 females; on 30th June, 1910, it was 1,307,076—659,114 males, 647,962 females—thus showing an increase of 4,142 persons. The natural increase during the quarter was 4,499, but the excess of emigration was 357. Western Australia gained from this State 941 persons, New South Wales 686, Queensland 552, and South Australia 321. Tasmania lost 1,970 persons and New Zealand 359.

Vital Statistics of the State.—Compared with the previous quarter, the marriages increased by 23 in the quarter under review, the births by 443, and the deaths decreased by 127, which gave an increase in the excess of births over deaths of 570. Of the total number of deaths (3,693), 260 were due to phthisis, and 49 to other tubercular diseases; 284 to cancer; 66 to typhoid fever; and 34 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 3,330. This includes one case of triplets, 30 cases of twins, and 280 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,759, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,571. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 23, from typhoid fever 26, and from tubercular diseases 156, as against 7, 17, and 148 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,759, of whom 291 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 196 deaths, 23 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 178 deaths, 35 were of infants, and in Geelong, of 95 deaths, 10 were of infants. In Melbourne and Suburbs the deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 8·74 per cent. of the births—a rate higher than that of the whole State, viz., 7·45. In the four towns mentioned there were 753 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 34 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,411,630—an increase of £329,528 on the corresponding quarter of the previous year—the principal sources being Railways £1,105,030, and balance of Commonwealth revenue £485,912. The total expenditure was £2,027,757, an increase of £60,553 on that of the corresponding quarter of 1909.

Commonwealth Revenue and Expenditure in Account with the State of Victoria.—The total Commonwealth Revenue credited to this State was £1,022,172, as against £840,196 in the corresponding period of 1909, being an increase of £181,976 for the quarter under review. The principal sources were import duties on Stimulants and Narcotics, £229,054; Agricultural Products and Groceries, £45,022; Apparel and Textiles, £81,698; and on Metals and Machinery, £54,442. From excise, Spirits yielded £24,099; Beer, £40,078; Tobacco, £46,690; and Sugar, £45,839. The total expenditure on transferred services was £314,757 (Defence, £75,881; Postmaster-General, £218,272; Trade and Customs, £17,198), and "new" expenditure, £168,916—a total of £483,673, as against £445,700 in the corresponding quarter of 1909—an increase of £37,973.

Railways.—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £104,319, the expenditure by £220,258, train miles run by 258,033, passengers carried by 1,084,489, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 180,857.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On 30th June the total liabilities of the banks were £43,090,890 and the assets £43,830,890, as against £39,782,082 and £42,085,909 on 30th June, 1909. The reserves amounted to £6,778,899; paid-up capital to £13,737,409. The ratio of coin and bullion to liabilities was 19·12 per cent.

Savings Banks.—On 30th June the amount at credit of the 560,515 depositors was £15,416,862. During the quarter 26,424 accounts were opened, and 18,313 were closed; the deposits made were £3,075,260, and the withdrawals £2,836,719.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of June, 1910, is 71,675,066 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £5,822,783, of which £1,880,819 were from the other States of Australia. The total exports during the same period were valued at £5,516,580, of which £3,405,182 were exported to Australian States. The exports of Australian produce were valued at £12,519,521.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the second quarter in 1910, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £238,420, of which £187,465 went to the United Kingdom £13,964 to South Africa, and £36,991 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £68,670; Mutton and Lamb, £122,286; Fruit, £21,622; and Beef, £16,297.
