REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,  
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practices of Surveying.*

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

*Use of instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

*Drawing.*

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

## LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

## Pure Food Act 1905.

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS UNDER PURE FOOD ACT.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make this present regulation amending the following regulations, by excising therefrom the clause in each setting out the penalties to which, on conviction, any person who manufactures or prepares or sells or keeps for sale any article of food or substance or compound in contravention of the Pure Food Act is liable, namely:—

Regulations made by the Board of Public Health,

- (1) as to milk and meat and their products, dated 17th August, 1906;
- (2) as to tea, coffee, cocoa, jam, confectionery, ice creams, beverages, and other articles of food, dated 12th October, 1906; and
- (3) as to infants' food, bread, flour, fruit, preservative substances, vegetables, oils, spices, and other articles of food, colouring matter, and drugs, dated 23rd November, 1906.

This regulation shall take effect from the first day of March, 1910.

BY-LAW FOR 1910.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1910, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

**HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING

**T**HE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1910 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of McIvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.
2. A rate of Five shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.
6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and first of July, 1910.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
5. For every allotment or piece of land, vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate that would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1910.

#### SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING BY-LAW FOR 1910.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1910.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1910 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone work, brick work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing so to do.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, in the said year 1910. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Commencing at a point on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay at the centre of Park-street, Elwood; thence easterly along Park-street to St. Kilda-street; thence northerly along St. Kilda-street to Glenhuntly-road; thence westerly along Glenhuntly-road to Mitford-street; thence north-westerly along Mitford-street to Barkly-street; thence northerly along Barkly-street to its intersection with Grey-street, and north-westerly along Grey-street to centre of Robe-street, and along that street south-westerly to the Esplanade, and continued on in the same direction to the foreshore of Hobson's Bay:

And whereas the Minister administering for the time being the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1905* has approved of such application to prohibit as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part of such specified area of the Municipal District of St. Kilda, in the State of Victoria aforesaid, on and after the first day of April, 1910.
