Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905 (No. 2013).

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION BOARD.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16, sub-section (1), of the *Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905* upon the Teachers and Schools Registration Board, enabling the Board to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council), "providing for the approval of the registers and mode of registering and making additions or revisions; defining what schools shall, for the purposes of this Act respectively be sub-primary schools, primary schools, or secondary schools (as the case may be); and generally for carrying this Act into effect," the Board doth hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following additions to Regulations VIII.—Register of Teachers and IX.—Register of Schools respectively:—

VIII.—REGISTER OF TEACHERS.

8. In the event of the decease of any registered teacher the Board shall, upon information being received, remove the name of such teacher from the register of teachers.

9. The Board may, from time to time, write, or cause a letter to be written, to any registered teacher, addressed to him according to his last-known address, to inquire whether he is engaged in teaching or has changed his residence, and such letter shall be sent by registered post; if no answer be returned to such letter within a period of six months from the sending thereof, the Board may erase the name of such person from the Register of Teachers, and may, if it shall afterwards think fit to do so, restore the same to the Register.

IX.—REGISTER OF SCHOOLS.

6. The name of any school may be removed from the Register of Schools when the Board is satisfied—

- (a) that such school is no longer being conducted at the address stated in the Register; or
- (b) that there has been any change in the proprietorship of any such school; or
- (c) that the average attendance at such school does not exceed two pupils for three consecutive months.

7. The Board may, at the request of the proprietors or head teachers of any two or more schools, amalgamate such schools for the purposes of registration, but the Board may at the time of such amalgamation revise the classification of the amalgamated school.

8. The classification of any school in the Register of Schools may be revised and altered by the Board if it is satisfied that the course of study or the instruction given or the teaching staff of such school has been materially altered subsequent to the registration of such school.

9. In order to ascertain whether the staff, the course of study, and the instruction are being maintained up to the full standard of the division or divisions in which any school is registered, the Board, or any person appointed by it, may at any time, with or without previous notice, enter any building in which such school is being held and inspect all school records and registers (omitting those of a financial character), observe the teaching given, and make such inquiries into the control and conduct of such school as may be deemed necessary to ascertain the standard of work therein.

10. If, as a result of such inspection and report, the Board is satisfied that the staff, the course of study, or the instruction in any school is not being maintained up to the standard of the division or divisions in which the school is registered, the Board shall send, or cause to be sent, a written notice to that effect to the proprietor or head teacher of such school, informing him that it is proposed to revise and alter the registration of such school.

11. The proprietor or head teacher of any such school shall be entitled to obtain a copy of such report following upon inspection of the school, and unless within two calendar months from the date of notice it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Board that the lowering in standard of work in the school is due to temporary causes and is not likely to be permanent, the registration of such school shall be revised and altered accordingly.

12. The Board may require the proprietor or head teacher of every registered school to forward once a year to the Registrar a return showing the name and full Christian name of every teacher employed in his school, whether as head teacher, assistant teacher, visiting teacher, or student teacher, giving the registered number of each registered teacher employed in his school, and indicating the division or divisions of the register in which such teacher's name is recorded.

The *Marine Act 1890*.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION RELATING TO THE EQUIPMENT OF SHIPS WITH LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

Such Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Equipment of Ships with Life-saving Appliances" made by the Board on the third day of February, 1899, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-fourth day of February, 1899, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

Stowage of Boats.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the aforesaid Regulations it shall be permissible in the case of such passenger or emigrant steam-ships as are thereby required to carry eight or more boats placed under davits, for boats, not exceeding in all one-fourth of the number required by the Regulations to be placed under davits, to be carried inboard; provided that each boat carried inboard is stowed alongside a boat which is placed directly under davits, and is so arranged that it can be launched promptly. A boat which is carried inboard under this Regulation need not be always attached to the davit tackles.

The foregoing additional Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and ten.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date hereof, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of December, 1909, *re* restrictions on netting, &c., in Gippsland Lakes during thirty hours in each week, and also to make a Proclamation to the following effect, *viz.* :—

- (1.) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets, or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, within the waters known as the Gippsland Lakes, from Ten (10) o'clock in the morning of each Friday until sunrise on each Sunday following throughout the year.
- (2.) Restricting the lengths of nets to be used in the waters known as the Gippsland Lakes as follows, *viz.* :—Seine nets not to exceed 400 fathoms; mesh or set nets not to exceed 700 fathoms for those with meshes measuring less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches between knots, or 1,200 fathoms for those with meshes measuring 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches and upwards between knots; and providing that only one fleet of net (of any class) shall be allowed for each licensed fisherman of 16 years and upwards.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT FOR THAT PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF BOOLA BOOLA, KNOWN AS "THE SANDBANK RESERVE."

WE, Thomas Allard Pettit, George Pentland, John Norman Matheson, Henry Oliver Cornell, Thomas Albert Williams, and William Arthur Porter, the duly appointed Committee of Management of such portion of the reserve for public purposes in the parish of Boola Boola as is known as "The Sandbank Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports, *fêtes*, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or deface in any way any trees, tree guards, fences, gates, seats, buildings, or other improvements of any description whatever in the reserve.
4. No person shall roll or throw stones or use slings or catapults in the reserve, or light any fire therein, without the consent of the Committee of Management, and then only in such place or places as may be provided for the purpose.
5. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, intoxicating liquor, or goods of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the reserve on Sundays.
7. No person shall offer, make, or pay any wager in the reserve.
8. No person shall put into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
9. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with, or take away any animal or eggs of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, or snares within the reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. 3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with, within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. 10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW No. 16.

A By-law of the Shire of Nunawading, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 16, for regulating traffic within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, any person who between any sunset and the following sunrise shall, in, upon, or along any of the roads, streets, or thoroughfares within the Shire of Nunawading, drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, or for the conveyance of persons as well as of goods, wares, or merchandise, or for the conveyance of persons only, or any private vehicle, without having a good and serviceable carriage lamp securely fixed and properly lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

2. Any person riding, driving, or propelling any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other similar vehicle between sunset and the following sunrise in, upon, or along any of the roads, streets, or thoroughfares within the Shire of Nunawading without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed and properly lighted in front of any such vehicle shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.
