PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon:—

TUESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1910, at Gisborne;

FRIDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF DECEMBER, 1910, at Peshurst;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1910, at Camperdown, Dandenong, and Kew;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1910, at Hamilton.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.

4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of less than Twenty-seven pounds, the sum of One pound.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant unoccupied allotments of land shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate be less than Ten shillings.
4. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per One thousand gallons, or such price as may be fixed by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 (Twenty thousand) gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at the price named would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the occupier or owner would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1911, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive such rates and charges.

The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Ten shillings.

3. For all house properties built during the year 1911, a proportion of such general rate or minimum rate shall be paid from the beginning of the month after commencement of the building to the end of December.

4. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 26,000 gallons per annum.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January, and the second on the first day of July, 1911.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1911.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1911 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has, for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, been proclaimed an Urban District, also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence (£1 2s. 6d.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Three pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Three pounds and under Seven pounds the sum of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.). When such value is Seven pounds or over, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For gardens or lawns to which water is supplied, and the area of which does not exceed one-eighth of an acre, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, and for every additional eighth of an acre or portion thereof, the sum of Ten shillings per annum; but the Trust reserves the right to specify, from time to time, the hours during which water for these purposes may be used.

4. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property, if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st of December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st of February, 1911.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF RESERVES FOR PUBLIC
PURPOSES, AND FOR THE PROTECTION
OF GRAVES RESPECTIVELY, ALL IN THE
BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public purposes in Murphy-street, and of the reserves for public purposes, and for the protection of graves in Faithful-street respectively, all in the borough of Wangaratta, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves, or any of them, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, or any of them; nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or on any buildings in the Reserves, or any of them, or cut names on the fences, trees, buildings, or seats, or otherwise injure or deface the same, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserves, or any of them, any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and no person shall put any such animals on the said site for the protection of graves. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserves, or any of them, any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect in the Reserves, or any of them, any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; and no person shall enter any building in the Reserves, or any of them, without the consent of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a Police Constable or Crown Lands Bailiff.
8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserves, or any of them, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, desecrate, open, dig, or otherwise interfere with the ground within the said site for the protection of graves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff, of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WE, Michael Ivers, John Thomas McLeod, John Coleman Keegan, Thomas Martin Goonan, John Billsborrow, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Dederang, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the

preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1st. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusement, on any of which occasions such sums as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for the admission for every adult to the Reserve.

2nd. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4th. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences or sent, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5th. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6th. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dogs unless led by a chain or cord without the authority of the Committee of Management.

7th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8th. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

No person who already holds the area of mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to select, but holders of less than such area will be entitled to apply for the difference between the area held and that which the classification of the land entitles them to select.

Applicants will be hereafter notified as to the date and place of hearing of their applications by Local Land Board.

The land will be granted under agricultural allotment licence, and at the end of 6 years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, a lease for 34 years will be granted, or, if desired, on expiry of licence, or at any time within the period of 34 years, a Crown grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £9 to £11 per allotment.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the third class, improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the licence, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

That the licensee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the licence, and shall reside on the land during the continuance of such licence, and shall also clear and cultivate at least one-fourth of his allotment within two years of obtaining a permit to occupy the land.

That the licensee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession, or grant the use of the whole, or any part of the allotment, during the currency of the licence.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of agriculture, grazing, and residence, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,500 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the licensee shall preserve the timber on an area, or otherwise plant an area, of not less than 3 per cent. of the total area of his holding, preferably along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern.

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and wind breaks.

TOWN OF MALVERN.

REGULATION No. 17.

A Regulation of the Town of Malvern, numbered 17, made under the first section of Part 5 of 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the town by virtue of a By-law of the above-named town, numbered 37, for regulating the height, thickness, construction, and materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing same.

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Malvern make the Regulation following:—

1. The whole of this Regulation shall apply to and have force and effect throughout the said Town of Malvern with respect to all buildings which are constructed or erected within 100 feet of the building line of the streets mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

2. No building, the external walls of which are of other materials than stone or brick, shall be built in any of the streets specified in the Schedule hereto, nor for a distance of 50 feet on either side of such streets, except Great Valley-road, to which one side only is referred.

Great Valley-road, east side; York-road, both sides; Elm-road, both sides, between York-road and Great Valley-road; Oak-road, both sides, between York-road and Great Valley-road; and Wills-street, between York-road and Great Valley-road.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

REGULATION FOR THE SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

Regulation No. 8 of the Shire of Nunawading made under section forty-four (44) of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for:—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which any animals may be received into or supplied from any abattoirs.
- (b) Prescribing the duties of meat inspectors.
- (c) Fixing the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of abattoirs of which they are the owners.
- (d) The feeding, watering, and tending, and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and for the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs.
- (e) Examining animals by meat inspectors before slaughter, and prescribing the mode of dealing with animals at abattoirs when suspected of being affected with communicable disease.
- (f) Prescribing the mode of slaughtering animals, of flaying and of dressing carcasses, and for preserving the cleanliness of appliances used therefor.
- (g) Examining by meat inspectors the different parts of a carcass after slaughter at abattoirs, and for preventing the parts of one carcass being mixed with those of another prior to examination.
- (h) Fixing the fees for examining of animals, for examining and branding of carcasses, and for giving certificates as to any examination of any animal, or carcass, or meat made by or under the direction of a meat inspector.
- (i) Prescribing the mode of removing condemned carcasses of meat, and of rendering the same unusable for human consumption, and of disposing of or destroying the same, and prescribing the mode of removing and destroying of blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure from abattoirs.
- (j) Prescribing the nature of the particulars to be entered in the register as to animals examined or slaughtered at or supplied or removed from any abattoir, and as to carcasses of meat dealt with thereat.
- (k) And generally for carrying into effect the objects of the Meat Supervision Acts, and for imposing penalties for non-compliance with the Regulations made in accordance therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Nunawading.

A.—RECEPTION OR REMOVAL OF ANIMALS.

1. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the public abattoir on such days and at such times as the Council may determine provided always that animals shall not be received into the public abattoir on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
2. All animals received or placed into the public abattoir, if not slaughtered or otherwise dealt with as by law provided, must be removed from the public abattoir by the owner or the person in charge thereof within a period of not more than forty-eight hours in all from the time such animals were first received into the public abattoir, otherwise the said animals may be removed by order of the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner thereof, who shall also pay all subsequent charges incurred.

B.—DUTIES OF INSPECTOR.

3. The following shall be included in the duties of meat inspectors:—

- To keep a register of all animals received into or placed in or slaughtered or condemned in or removed from the public abattoir, and to keep such books, accounts, registers, and records, and furnish such reports as the Council may from time to time direct or require.
- To inspect all animals received or placed into the public abattoir before the same are slaughtered.
- To direct the management and care of animals during the time they are at the public abattoir pending slaughter or removal.
- To direct the removal of all animals that have been longer than eighteen hours in the public abattoir.
- To examine all carcasses, organs, viscera, and offal, and other parts of animals immediately on being slaughtered, and to brand or cause to be branded under his direction, in accordance with the Regulations made by the Board of Public Health under the Meat Supervision Acts, all such carcasses, organs, viscera, offal, and parts as are intended to be exposed for sale for human consumption.
- To demand and receive the fees hereinafter appointed to be paid in respect of such examination and branding; also to collect the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoir, or for the slaughtering of animals.
- To superintend and direct the carrying out of all cleansing methods and sanitary measures and requirements in and about abattoirs.
- To keep a register of all butchers, salesmen, slaughtermen, and others engaged or doing business at the public abattoir, and to control and direct the operations and enforce propriety of conduct of all such persons.
- To prevent summarily any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering or cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, and to report to the Council the names of every person guilty of such cruelty.
- To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts, Butchers and Abattoirs Act, By-laws and Regulations relating to public abattoirs.

C.—SLAUGHTERING FEES.

4. The sums stated hereunder shall be the rates of slaughtering fees or dues (including the examining and branding of carcasses slaughtered at the abattoirs) payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoir, viz.:—

And such said sums shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the public abattoir whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

D.—FEEDING, WATERING, ETC. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, ETC.

5. Every person who shall bring animals into the public abattoir shall cause them to be provided with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and if the same remain in the public abattoir for a longer period than twenty-four hours, shall also provide such animals with sufficient food; provided always that no animal shall be allowed to remain in the public abattoir after three hours' notice shall have been given by the inspector to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove same, and such owner or person in charge shall remove same accordingly.

6. Animals shall be placed in such numbers only as the inspector may direct in any of the pens, stalls, yards, or standings in the public abattoir, and every person failing to observe the directions of the inspector in this respect shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

7. Every person who shall cause any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering any animal, or be guilty of any cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations. All milch animals in the public abattoir shall be milked by the owner or person in charge thereof at such time and place as the inspector may direct, either verbally or in writing.

E.—EXAMINATION, ETC., OF ANIMALS BEFORE SLAUGHTERING, AND COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.

8. Every animal received into or placed in the public abattoir shall be examined by the inspector before any such animal shall be slaughtered, and every owner or person in charge of any animal who shall permit the same to be slaughtered before being so examined shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

9. No animal shall be removed from the public abattoir if affected with, or if, in the opinion of the inspector, there are reasonable grounds for believing it to be affected with any of the following diseases, viz.:—Tuberculosis, anthrax, quarterill, pleuro-pneumonia, swine fever (hog cholera), swine erysipelas, lymphatic abscess, actinomycosis (lumpy jaw), or any communicable, contagious, or infectious disease, and no animal so affected shall be received into the public abattoir except by the direct permission of the inspector, and when so ordered by the inspector, either verbally or in writing, the owner or person in charge of any diseased animal shall forthwith destroy such animal in the manner directed by the inspector, whereupon the carcass of such animal shall be forthwith dealt with by the inspector so as to render it unfit for human consumption, and the carcass shall be disposed of (at the expense and risk of the owner thereof) in such manner as the inspector may direct.

F.—MODE OF SLAUGHTERING, ETC. CLEANLINESS OF APPLIANCES.

10. The owner or person in charge of any animal brought into the public abattoir may slaughter such animal and flay and dress the carcass thereof in such manner at such time and in such place or portion of the public abattoir as the inspector shall direct.

11. Every person engaged in slaughtering, dressing, or tending or caring for any animal or carcass in the public abattoir shall take all means and precautions so as to secure perfect cleanliness of his person, dress, and of all appliances of every kind used or to be used by him in the public abattoir, and the inspector shall decide whether all such means and precautions have been taken, and the inspector shall have the authority to forthwith order, either verbally or in writing, any person to at once leave the public abattoir who shall not have so complied in regard to the cleanliness of his person or the appliances used or to be used by him, and every person who has not so complied shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

G.—EXAMINATION OF CARCASS AFTER SLAUGHTER, ETC.

12. The carcass, organs, viscera, and offal of every animal shall, immediately upon being slaughtered in the public abattoir, be examined by the inspector, and no person shall cut away or remove from any animal any portion of the carcass or the organs, viscera, or offal thereof, except in such manner as the inspector may direct.

H.—FEES FOR EXAMINING AND BRANDING CARCASSES.

13. The fees to be demanded and recovered for examining and branding the carcasses or meat brought to the abattoir of animals fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, which premises are situated outside the meat area, by or under the direction of the meat inspector, shall be as follows:—

I.—REMOVAL OF CONDEMNED CARCASSES, OFFAL, ETC.

15. Upon the carcass of any animal being condemned by the inspector as unfit for human consumption, it shall be destroyed or dealt with as the inspector may direct, provided always that such carcass will not be removed or retained by the owner thereof, or by any person acting for such owner, but the proceeds of any portion thereof of the disposal of the carcass may, if the inspector so determines, be given to the owner of such carcass.

16. Upon any animal being slaughtered in the public abattoir, the owner of such animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith thoroughly cleanse of all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure, as the inspector shall direct, the stall or place in which such animal was slaughtered.

17. Immediately after the cleansing of any stall or place as set forth in the last preceding clause, the owner of any animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith remove from the public abattoir, in such a manner as shall be approved by the Council and the inspector, all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure that may have arisen from such slaughtering of any animal, and shall dispose of the same at such place and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council and the inspector.

J.—REGISTER, ETC., OF ANIMALS.

18. The inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoir a description of all animals brought into the public abattoir, including the particulars of the class of each animal, the colours, brands, and sex of every head of the same. The date on which such animals were received, examined, slaughtered, or condemned in, or removed from the public abattoir, and the amount of fees paid for examining, slaughtering, and branding of all such animals, together with the names of the persons who are owners of all such animals.

19. The inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoir a complete description of all diseases of animals which he inspects either before or after slaughter, and in such description there shall be included the names of the owners of the animals, the sex and age, and kind of animals, also of the particulars of the manner in which all such animals have been disposed of.

K.—CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

20. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoir or butcher's shop or premises in or along any of the roads or streets of the Shire of Nunawading any meat unless such meat in any such vehicle is properly covered and surrounded by a thoroughly clean canvas or wooden covering.

21. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, any meat in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoir or butcher's shop or premises in or along any road or street in the Shire of Nunawading unless any such vehicle is in a proper, clean, and sanitary condition.

22. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, on to the premises of the abattoirs or consume thereon during working hours, any intoxicating liquor.

23. Any person who in any portion of the establishment shall be drunk, or shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language, or of obscenity or indecency, or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty the inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed by the councils to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any such inspector, assistant, officer, or person made in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation or of such Regulation as shall for the time being be lawfully in force at the establishment, or shall deposit any blood, offal, filth, or refuse matter upon any portion of the establishment or on any land or road abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided and appointed for reception of the same, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

24. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of these Regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

L.—FEES FOR EXAMINING AND BRANDING PIGS AT BACON FACTORIES.

25. The fees to be demanded and recovered for examining and branding pigs after slaughter at Bacon Factories within the Shire shall be Sixpence for each pig examined by the inspector.

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Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

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ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

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
