Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COOPERS BOARD.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a cooper, has made the following determination, namely:

(1) That the determination of the Coopers Board, dated the 21st August, 1908. shall be cancelled

and annulled from and after the date upon which this present determination comes into force and is operative.

ADULT MALÈS.

(2) That except in the case of persons employed making tallow casks, who shall be paid at piecework prices or rates only, the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a cooper, and to any person or persons employed on repairs shall be One shilling and threepence half-penny per hour, or Three pounds and two shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

PROPORTION OF IMPROVERS.

(3) That the number of improvers who may be employed in any factory or work-room or shop or place in which the process, trade, or business of a cooper is carried on shall be-One improver to every three persons, and thereafter one improver to every nine additional persons receiving the prices or rates provided in this determination for adult males or piece-work.

APPRENTICES.

(4) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to male apprentices employed in the process, trade, or business of a cooper shall be as follow :-

OVERTIME.

(6) (a) That any male person (other than apprentices or improvers) over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a cooper who works for more than 48 hours per week, shall be paid for such extra time at pro rata rates, and in addition the sum of 4d. per hour.

(b) That any male apprentice or improver over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a cooper who works for more than 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of 3d. per hour, in addition to the prices or rates fixed for such apprentices or improvers by this determination.

HOLIDAYS-SPECIAL RATES FOR.

(7) That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons, or classes of persons, for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours' Day, shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons or classes of persons, and that men engaged on piece-work rates shall be paid 1s. 31d. per hour extra on their piece-work rates.

MISCELLANEOUS.

(8) (a) That all bale hoops be straightened and pieced to length by employer. If pieced to length by employé, ½d. per hoop extra. 5

(b) That all truss hoops and beak-irons be provided by employer.

(c) That rough split staves be measured at the thinnest end, and bucked or machine-dressed staves at the thickest.

(d) That where grooves exceeding 1-inch in width and not more than 1-inch in width are required, the following rates be paid :-

(e) For casks made from machine dressed and jointed timber, the responsibility of the employé for broken staves or other defects shall end after 24 hours of the cask being finished.

(f) Repairs shall include shooking and setting up casks, tightening hoops on casks, putting in staves or chimes or pieces of heads, and shortening hoops.

(g) That where linseed meal is used in grooves a charge be allowed as follows:-18 gallous and under 2d. per cask over 18 gallons 3d.

PIECE-WORK RATES.

(9) That the lowest price or rate of payment to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedule of rates shall be the price or rate fixed by such schedule in respect of such article :-
