"An Act to provide for the setting apart of a Site for the erection of a Memorial in honour of the late Marquis of Linlithgow."

## SHIRE OF LEXTON.

## BY-LAW NO. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Lexton, made under section 31 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 13, in the interests of the public health.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lexton order as follows:—

1. All the clauses except 1, 2, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17 of a By-law of the Shire of Lexton, numbered 1, made under the provisions of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, dated the 9th day of February, 1887, are hereby repealed.

2. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

3. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to two cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Council at the expense of such occupier.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any house, premises, or workshop, shall construct or cause to be constructed thereon, a proper privy in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the surrounding ground, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same.

Every privy attached to any school, public building, or hotel, shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material.

All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

No privy or trap door shall abut or open upon a street.

Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such privy or closet to be immediately, on such deposit, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

5. Every privy or closet shall be provided, by the occupiers of every house or public building, with a closet pan of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and the dimensions of such pan shall be at least 15 inches long and 12 inches wide and 15 inches in height, or circular 15 inches diameter and 15 inches in height.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, the pan or pans for the reception of night-soil, in every privy or closet belonging to such premises.

7. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any privy, closet, cesspool, or other place, shall deposit same in trenches at least two feet deep, and shall immediately cover same with a layer of earth not less than one foot in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the Council at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, nor less than Five shillings, or in like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Lexton.

The whole of the provisions of By-law No. 55 shall apply to and have operation within the last-named area also.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE.

The petitioners state that the town of Shepparton is their market town and commercial centre, and their interests are, and have been for years, identified with that town. That Shepparton is the County and Assize Court town for the district desired to be severed, and that geographically the area ought to form a part of the Shire of Shepparton, &c., &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the portion of the Shire of Euroa above described, and annex same as a separate Riding to the Shire of Shepparton.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the fourteenth day of September, 1910, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1911, and shall be payable on the 10th day of December, 1910, at the office of the said Commission at Tatura.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, by J. A. Carey, valuer, returned on the eighth day of October, 1910, and adopted by the said Commission on the 14th day of November, 1910, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the said *Water Act 1905*, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.  
—SHEPPARTON IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject matter herein in respect of the Shepparton Irrigation and Water Supply District, formerly part of the Waterworks District of the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, shall be, and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such persons may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions

of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of November, 1910, to the 31st day of May, 1911, shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of November, 1910, to the 31st day of May, 1911, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring water.

6. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purposes of this and any By-law, making an Irrigation Charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

7. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

8. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Tatura, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

10. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner, as the Commission may direct.

11. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

*Chaff and Stock Food Act 1909.*  
REGULATIONS UNDER THE CHAFF AND STOCK FOOD ACT 1909.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the *Chaff and Stock Food Act 1909* to make regulations prescribing "foreign ingredients," the amount of "foreign ingredients" that may be contained in "stock food," prescribing fees for any analysis, and of penalties under the Act, and for the purpose of giving effect to the Act: Now therefore the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following regulations:—

1. The substances mentioned and set forth in the second column of the Schedule hereunder are hereby prescribed to be "foreign ingredients" relative to "stock food." The proportion or amount of such "foreign ingredients" which may be contained in any kind of "stock food" shall not exceed the proportion or amount placed in the third column of the said Schedule opposite the name or description of such kind of "stock food" in the first column of such Schedule.

Kind of Stock Food.	Substances (Foreign Ingredients).	Proportion or Amount allowed.
"Stock Food" (any kind)...	Any substance of whatever character in itself deleterious to the life or health of stock	None
"Stock Food" (any kind)...	Any substance of whatever character added for the purpose only of fraudulently increasing the weight of the article sold or offered or exposed for sale	None
"Stock Food" (any kind)...	Salt ... ..	By weight 0.5 per cent. unless the amount is declared in the invoice, circular, agreement, or advertisement relating thereto
Grain (whether whole or crushed)	Any grain other than the grain named as sold or offered or exposed for sale, or other substance	5 per cent. by weight (unless the amount is declared in the invoice, agreement, circular, or advertisement relating thereto)
Hay ... ..	Any hay other than the species of hay named as sold or offered or exposed for sale, or other substance	10 per cent.
Hay Chaff ... ..	Any hay chaff other than the species of hay chaff named as sold or offered or exposed for sale, or other substance	10 per cent.

2. On the sale or offering or exposure for sale of any hay or hay chaff the vendor shall set forth in every invoice, agreement, or circular, or advertisement relating thereto, the nature of the cereal or cereals, legume or legumes, grass or grasses, whereof the same has been, or is to be, made, and if not made wholly from one sort of cereal, legume, or grass, the relative proportions of the constituents thereof.

3. On the sale or offering or exposure for sale of any mixed, concentrated, or prepared stock food or by-products the vendor shall set forth in every invoice, agreement, circular, or advertisement relating thereto the relative proportions of the constituents thereof.

4. On the face of every document delivered as an "invoice" under the Act the "vendor" shall cause to be legibly printed or written the word "invoice."

5. The fee for any analysis under the Act shall be Ten shillings and sixpence per statutory sample (or for any sample of equal amount).

6. Every vendor shall keep a copy of these regulations constantly affixed in legible characters in or on some conspicuous place in every shop, shed, warehouse, or other place whatsoever (whether enclosed or not) where he or any employé or agent of him shall be engaged in cutting, selling, or distributing chaff.

7. The penalty for any contravention of these regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by section 3, sub-section 2, of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any Regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order "that, subject to Regulations that may be made by the Governor in Council, on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall be brought from that portion of Victoria described in the attached Schedule hereto, and contained within the municipal districts of Melbourne, to any other portion of Victoria."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3, sub-section 2, of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any Regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order "that, subject to Regulations that may be made by the Governor in Council, on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall be brought from those portions of Victoria described in the attached Schedule hereto, and contained within the Town of Geelong, the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, the Borough of West Geelong, and the Parish of Moorpanyal, to any other portion of Victoria."

**MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.**

**T**HE land is situated on the Ouyen-Cow Plains railway line, now in course of construction, and is from 31 to 48 miles south-west from Ouyen.

Applications (with uncanceled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 24th December, 1910.

Not more than one allotment can be included in any application, but any number of applications may be lodged, with the prescribed fee in each case.

No person who already holds the area of mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to select, but holders of less than such area will be entitled to apply for the difference between the area held and that which the classification of the land entitles them to select.

The land will be granted under agricultural allotment licence, and at the end of 6 years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, a lease for 34 years will be granted, or, if desired, on expiry of licence, or at any time within the period of 34 years, a Crown grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £9 to £11 per allotment.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the third class, improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the licence, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

The first half-year's rent and licence-fee must be paid prior to issue of licence, and, provided improvements equivalent in value to the amount of rent due for each year be expended on the land during each of such years, in addition to the value required by the ordinary improvement condition, as set forth above, further payment of rent may be suspended until the end of the third year, and such suspended payments, without interest, will be collected in instalments during the remaining term of the licence.

That the licensee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the licence, and shall reside on the land during the continuance of such licence, and shall also clear and cultivate at least one-fourth of his allotment within two years of obtaining a permit to occupy the land.

That the licensee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession, or grant the use of the whole, or any part of the allotment, during the currency of the licence.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of agriculture, grazing, and residence, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,500 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the licensee shall preserve the timber on an area, or otherwise plant an area, of not less than 3 per cent. of the total area of his holding, preferably along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern.

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and wind breaks.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated on the Mildura railway line, and is from 5 to 11 miles north-west from Ouyen.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, 25th January, 1911.

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and

the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence. If in the second class, improvements to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre must be made during the like periods, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

The first half-year's rent and licence-fee must be paid prior to issue of licence, and, provided improvements equivalent in value to the amount of rent due for each year be expended on the land during each of such years, in addition to the value required by the ordinary improvement condition, as set forth above, further payment of rent may be suspended until the end of the third year, and such suspended payments, without interest, will be collected in instalments during the remaining term of the licence.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. By-LAW No. 23.

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale made under section 625 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 23, for regulating the Market place and the buildings and pens therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences, and for regulating the use of any Weighing Machine provided by the council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Lillydale Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market, situated in the township of Lillydale, at the corner of Clarke and Market streets, and the said market shall be used for the sale of live stock, produce, sundries, &c.

The said market shall be open for the reception, delivery, and sale of stock, produce, sundries, &c., on every Monday from sunrise to sunset, but in the event of any weekly market day falling on a public holiday, the council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said weekly market.

3. The Council shall appoint a Market Inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—

To see that this By-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903* relating to Markets are duly observed. To demand and collect all market tolls and dues. To allot the principal and drafting yards to persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such a manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before 5 o'clock p.m. on the day of sale, except with the consent of such inspector. No persons shall obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duties, or release or remove any cattle from the said market without the consent of the Market Inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

4. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied, and if any cattle be not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

5. All auctioneers doing business in the market shall draw lots on the morning of each market day for priority of sale for each class of cattle at such time and in such manner as the Council by regulation shall direct.

6. The horses, dairy, fat, and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers in such rotation as the Council by regulation shall direct.

7. No auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than three minutes in offering any one lot for sale, or more than two hours in disposing of stock in his hands for sale. In case an auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands within the specified time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the

market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale. And in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to sell stock by auction at the same time.

8. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to sell by auction, the decision of the Market Inspector shall be final.

9. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

10. The Council may license any yards or premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, provided such yards or premises are distant not less than 5 miles by road from the Lillydale Corporation Sale Yards, and the annual licence fee shall be Five pounds for each yard or premises so licensed.

11. Any person offering any cattle for sale in the market which are not sold who shall afterwards sell same privately without having first paid the dues, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

12. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this By-law, shall, on conviction before any Court of competent jurisdiction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
