YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW
FOR 1911.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law for the year 1911.

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4. For every water-trough, a charge of Ten shillings.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Ten shillings for every horse power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling, to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1911.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1911.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1911, commencing on 1st January, 1911, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable by half-yearly instalments on 1st January, 1911, and 1st July, 1911.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1911, and 1st July, 1911.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust on the 29th day of November, 1910.

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING BY-LAW.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW NO. 36.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1911, of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1911, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1911. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1911, and the second instalment upon the first day of July in the same year. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and recover the said rate.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.— RATING BY-LAW FOR 1911.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:—

(1) The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1911. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1911, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:—

(2) On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

(3) On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

(4) On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

(5) On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

(6) On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

(7) The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in diameter.

(8) For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering shall be made; or if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

CASES WHERE WATER IS NOT LAID ON.

(9) On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

(10) On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water-main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

(11) Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE.

(12) The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) Twenty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

(13) No person shall be allowed to irrigate lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust. The Secretary may issue a permit to irrigate subject to the approval of the Trust. The fee for such permit shall be One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre, or portion of one-eighth, in area of the portion of land irrigated. No consumer shall be permitted to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an acre of land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person irrigating any such land without a permit shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

(14) The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

(15) The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

(16) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each One hundred (100) gallons.

(17) In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(18) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

(19) In the construction of this By-law the words "Annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1911; the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement," as used herein, shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1911.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1911, and the first day of July, 1911, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, Two pounds.
3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Twenty

pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1911.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.
4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order or delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. A By-law of the Borough of Sebastopol, made under sections 41 and 44, Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered Six, for suppressing the wandering cattle nuisance.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol order as follows:—

1. Section 41, Part I., of the 13th Schedule.—If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them—

(a) In any street or

(2) Upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act* 1890, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence,

the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.

2. Section 44, Part I., of 13th Schedule.—It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district, or any parts thereof, by boundaries set forth in such regulation, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other State to any other part, and to provide, if they see fit, in such regulation, separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person drives any such cattle contrary to such regulation, he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke.

3. By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BY-LAW NO. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 30, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the Shire of Bairnsdale, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

THAT in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. That By-laws Nos. 25 and 26 be repealed.

2. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 497 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the Shire of Bairnsdale be impounded.

3. That the above order be carried out under the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said Shire, and occupiers of land fronting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impoundings of ten head of cattle or five head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

4. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, quarterly in advance, at the rate of 3s. per quarter for every head of such cattle and 6s. per quarter for every head of horses so exempted, half such payment to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by this Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

5. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register such head of horses and cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a chain and a numbered tag on the same and in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

6. The Council will not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass and water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of the Schedule No. 1 attached hereto.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to the limit of that age.

9. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

10. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and the owners requiring exemption for the ensuing quarter are required to present their stock for registration at such musters. Stock may be registered during any period between musters on payment of the full quarter's fee.

11. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

12. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

13. No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than six miles in each day, between sunset and sunrise.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing the same shall be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registration period.

15. The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from the streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the inspector of nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

16. While persons retain chain and tag they will be held responsible for registration fees, and the charge for hire of tag and chain will be continued while holding same, and on returning the chain and tag the charge made for hire of same will be refunded.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the East, West, and South Ridings, and such portion of the Centre Riding of the Shire of Bairnsdale as is not included in the area described in Schedule No. 2 attached hereto.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
