IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. The Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1898.

Order announcing the intention of the Governor in Council to constitute the Councils of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost, and Tambo the Railway Construction Trust for the proposed Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction District.

WHEREAS the Councils of the Municipalities of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost, and Tambo have agreed in writing that the said Councils shall be constituted the Railway Construction Trust for the Railway Construction District with respect to the Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway authorized to be constructed by the

Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction Act 1909, and such Councils have, by petition under their common seals, applied to the Governor in Council that the said Councils be constituted the Railway Construction Trust for such Railway Construction District: And whereas the whole of the proposed Railway Construction District is contained in the municipal districts of the said Councils so petitioning: Now therefore I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, upon the petition aforesaid of the said Councils of the Municipalities of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost, and Tambo, do by this my Order, under the powers conferred by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1898* and all other powers in that behalf me enabling, announce my intention to constitute the Councils of the Municipalities of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost, and Tambo the Railway Construction Trust for the proposed Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction District, to be constituted under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts with respect to the Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway authorized to be constructed by the *Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction Act 1909*, No. 2223.
