REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,  
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practices of Surveying.*

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

*Use of instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telescope, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

*Drawing.*

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*visu roce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

## LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Re EASTERN ENTRANCE CHANNEL, PORT ALBERT.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 62, dated the 25th of January, 1910, relating to the removal of the Fairway Buoy at the Eastern Entrance to Port Albert, owing to the Entrance having become unnavigable through siltation, mariners and others are hereby further notified that all the buoys marking such Eastern Entrance are now being removed. It is also hereby notified as follows:—

The present entrance is off the west end of the Bar Bank. The leading buoys are almost in a direct line due south from the west end of Snake Island. After crossing the bar vessels must follow the line of beacons, keeping close to those coloured red on the inner side of the Bar Bank, and when clear thereof, turn to the west instead of to the east as hitherto. The line of beacons will guide through a well defined and deep channel, passing Snake and La Trobe Islands on the port side, then round the west end of Sunday Island into the Midge Channel, where the course into Port Albert will become clear. Care must be exercised to keep a distance of between 50 and 60 feet from the red beacons all the way round such Sunday Island Channel. The lowest depth is 9 feet at low water and 7 feet on the bar. As the currents run very strong, way should be maintained on the vessel in passing narrow places to prevent being set aground on the banks.

**Caution.**—Masters of vessels are warned against attempting to navigate the channel leading to Port Albert without having at least once done so with the assistance of a pilot.

## AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGHATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SUM OF THREE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£3,150), GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT TO AGRICULTURAL AND POULTRY SOCIETIES, 1909-10.

**E**ACH Society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 31st March, 1910, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement, so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the Treasurer of each Society a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and, if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. No Society located within twenty miles of any other Society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such Society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

4. The Royal Agricultural Society shall not participate in the Vote for the year 1909-10.

5. A sum not exceeding Eighty-five pounds may be paid out of the above vote for medals awarded as Grand National Prizes at the Colac Agricultural Society's Show.

6. A sum of One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid out of the above vote as a special grant in aid to the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club of Victoria.

7. If the sums claimed be in excess of the balance remaining after payment of above amounts of £85 and £150, and the amount of £200, Regulation gazetted 1/9/09, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

8. Subsidy shall not be paid to any Society which has not complied with conditions A., B., and C.

A.—That the awards of prizes in all classes for stallions three years old and over at the Society's show must be subject to the possession by the exhibit of a Government certificate of soundness.

B.—That the Society arrange for—

- (1) The holding of agricultural students' classes; or
- (2) The holding of a series of at least four lectures or demonstrations on agricultural or live stock matters.

C.—That the Society—

- (1) arrange for the carrying out of field experiments on an area and in a locality to be approved by the Department; or
- (2) provide and offer a substantial prize (the amount to be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, but not less than Five pounds) for improvements in farm practice and management, or the cultivation of special crops in the district.

THAT each Society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 31st March, 1910, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for Horticultural Exhibits will be allotted to each Society having a claim, and be made payable to the Treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Two hundred and seventy-nine pounds ten shillings, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly. A sum of Ten pounds ten shillings may be paid out of the above vote to the Royal Horticultural Society as a special prize for best exhibit of export fruit at its show in 1910.

3. No Society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1909, and the 31st December, 1909, amounts in the total to less than Twenty-five pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

**REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.**

**UNDER** the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the Municipal Clerk of the Municipal District of the Borough of Creswick, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Municipal District of the Borough of Creswick shall be closed on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from the hour of Five o'clock.

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**VESTING OF LANDS FORMING THE WATER-SHED OF THE LIGAR BELLELL OR O'SHANASSY RIVER, COUNTY OF EVELYN, IN THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by the *Forests Act* 1907 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Lands, the Minister of Forests, and the Minister of Mines, excise either temporarily or permanently from any permanent forest any portion thereof which may be required for water supply purposes, and that any land so excised for water supply purposes may be vested by the Governor in Council (subject to such terms, conditions, and reservations as he may think fit) in any authority as defined in section 3 of the *Water Act* 1905, or in any corporate body now or hereafter to be created by Parliament to construct, manage, and control waterworks: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 11th day of January, 1910, the lands forming the water-shed of the Ligar or Bellell River, containing an estimated area of thirty-seven thousand seven hundred and sixty acres, in the county of Evelyn, in the State of Victoria, were excised from the State Forests for the purposes of water supply: And whereas the said Ligar or Bellell River is also commonly known or described as the O'Shanassy River: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the said Order in Council dated the 11th day of January, 1910, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said *Forests Act* 1907, do hereby vest all the lands forming the water-shed of the Ligar Bellell or O'Shanassy River (estimated to contain an area of thirty-seven thousand seven hundred and sixty acres, but its exact dimensions to be ascertained by actual survey hereafter, hereinafter referred to as "the said water-shed") in The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter referred to as the said Board) upon trust for the purpose of supplying water to the inhabitants of the metropolis and its surroundings, subject to the terms conditions and reservations to the following effect, viz.:—

- (1) Reserving to His Majesty the right to resume possession at any time without payment of compensation of any of the said lands forming the said water-shed required for any public purpose with the consent of Parliament or for public highways.
- (2) The said Board shall maintain and keep in repair all public roads through the said lands forming the said water-shed, and shall keep open and in passable condition and for the use of the public all tracks existing at the time of the passing of the said Order in Council of 11th January, 1910, through any part of such water-shed, and in the event of any dispute arising as to the operation of this clause the Governor in Council shall decide.
- (3) No growing or live timber shall be cut, removed or sold from the lands forming the said water-shed by the said Board or by any other corporation or person save and except under the authority of a special Act of Parliament.

Upon the determination of the boundaries of the said lands forming the said water-shed by survey at the expense of the said Board, but under the direction of the Surveyor-General of the State of Victoria, a Crown grant shall issue to The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works of the said lands forming the said water-shed, subject (in addition to the ordinary terms conditions and reservations contained in Crown grants) to the terms conditions and reservations hereinbefore contained or to others to the like effect.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid this twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and ten, and in the tenth year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 113 and 132 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

## THE MARIBYRNONG ESTATE.

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## BOROUGH OF HORSHAM.

## BY-LAW NO. 15.

A By-law of the Borough of Horsham, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 15, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Horsham order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride, drive, or impel a motor car, motor cycle or bicycle along or across any street, thoroughfare, or road furiously or negligently or at such rate of speed as to endanger the safety of, or injure any person or property in the street, thoroughfare, or road, along or across which such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle is being ridden, driven, or impelled.

2. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or upon any street, thoroughfare or road at a greater speed than—

(a) Ten miles an hour within the boundaries of the township of Horsham, other than at the intersection of Firebrace-street with Baillie-street, and at the intersection of Firebrace-street with Wilson-street, where the speed shall not exceed five miles an hour.

(b) Fifteen miles an hour within the remaining limits of the borough.

3. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, along or across any footpath within the said borough save across such footpath at a place to which a proper approach shall have been made and direct to or from any premises abutting on such footpath, and then in that case at no greater speed than two miles per hour.

4. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any street, thoroughfare or road or across any footpath within the said borough during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle. Such lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle.

5. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road; and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or any other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, shall keep to the right or off side thereof; and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or any other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden or any foot passenger proceeding along any road, shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

6. In every case where a person driving any motor car meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving such motor car shall stop the same, and shall keep the same at a standstill so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. In every case where a person riding or impelling any motor cycle or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding or impelling such motor cycle or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

8. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on the conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds. Provided that upon convictions for any second offence or subsequent offence the minimum penalty shall be Five shillings.

9. Clause 2 of By-law No. 12, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, for regulating traffic and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality of the Borough of Horsham, and so much of clause 3 thereof as applies to clause 2 thereof is hereby repealed.

(71) The driver of every cart, during the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day, in any street or public place within the prescribed space for any municipality or other place where this By-law is in force, shall keep a light attached to or suspended from the off or right side of such cart so as to be plainly visible to the driver of any carriage proceeding along or through such street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first mentioned cart is directed, and in the case of a night-cart only such light shall be such and be so disposed as to appear white in front and red at the outer side; and every driver who fails to comply with this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

In every case where a person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding or driving such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall remain dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

5. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### MELBOURNE HOSPITAL.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following By-laws, adopted by the Committee of Management of the Melbourne Hospital, were confirmed at a Special Meeting of Contributors to the Institution, held at the Athenæum Hall, Collins-street, Melbourne, on Friday, 4th February, 1910:—

#### THE MEDICAL STAFF.

46. The medical staff of the Hospital shall consist of three parts:—(1) The consulting physicians and the consulting surgeons; (2) the physicians and the surgeons; (3) the medical officers in charge of special departments, that is to say: the ophthalmologist, the medical officer for diseases of the ear, nose and throat, the dermatologist, the gynaecologist.

47. There shall be five physicians and five surgeons having charge of in-patients and five physicians and five surgeons having charge of out-patients; provided that after the Committee shall have declared the out-patient department of the wards of the new Hospital to be in readiness, the Committee may, respectively, by an absolute majority, increase the number of either physicians or surgeons to out-patients to a number not exceeding seven, and the number of either physicians or surgeons to in-patients to a number not exceeding six.

48. 49. (As at present, substituting the words "Medical Act 1890" for the words "Medical Practitioners Statute 1865," wherever occurring.)

50. (As at present.)

50A. The medical officers in charge of special departments shall be registered medical practitioners under the Medical Act 1890.

51. Every physician and every surgeon and every medical officer in charge of a special department hereafter elected shall, subject to the by-laws and rules now or hereafter in force, hold office for five years from the date of his election, and no longer, but shall be eligible for re-election. Provided that when the Committee shall have increased the number of physicians and surgeons to twelve the word "five" shall be replaced by the word "six" in this by-law, and the by-law shall thereupon read accordingly.

51A. The term of office of one physician to in-patients and of one surgeon to in-patients, and of one physician to out-patients and of one surgeon to out-patients, shall expire in each year. The Committee shall take action as it may think fit by extension of the term of office of any physicians and any surgeons or by appointing any new physicians to in-patients or any new surgeon to in-patients, or any new physician to out-patients or any new surgeon to out-patients, for a shorter term, in order to bring such annual retirement into operation, and to keep it in operation, provided that no physician or surgeon now holding office shall, for this purpose, be called upon to retire until the expiry of the term for which he has already been elected by the governors. The Committee shall decide by lot the order of retirement.

52. Every physician and every surgeon and every medical officer in charge of a special department shall vacate such office, and be ineligible for re-appointment, on attaining the age of 60 years, and every physician to in-patients and every surgeon to in-patients and every medical officer in charge of a special department shall vacate such office, and be ineligible for re-appointment, on completing sixteen years of service in that office subsequent to the coming in force of this by-law.

53. The physicians and the surgeons and the medical officers in charge of special departments shall be appointed by the Committee after report from the Advisory Board.

54. The Advisory Board shall consist of twelve members, six being chosen by the Committee, two by the medical staff of the Hospital, two by the Council of the University of Melbourne, and two by the Faculty of Medicine in the University of Melbourne. The members of the Advisory Board shall be chosen annually, and shall hold office till their successors are appointed. Any casual vacancy may be filled for the remainder of the annual term by the body among whose representatives the vacancy has occurred. The Advisory Board shall elect a chairman from among the members chosen by the Committee. The chairman shall have a vote, and, if necessary, a casting vote. The quorum for the Advisory Board shall be seven.

55. When a vacancy occurs by effluxion of time in the office of physician or surgeon or medical officer in charge of a special department, and the retiring physician or surgeon or medical officer is not disqualified from further service under By-law 52, such physician or surgeon or medical officer shall be re-appointed by the Committee unless the Advisory Board shall recommend otherwise.

56. When a vacancy occurs in the office of physician to in-patients or of surgeon to in-patients, and such vacancy is not filled under By-law 55, the senior physician to out-patients or the senior surgeon to out-patients, as the case may be, shall be appointed by the Committee to the vacancy, unless the Advisory Board shall recommend otherwise. If the Advisory Board recommend otherwise, the physician to out-patients or the surgeon to out-patients, as the case may be, next in seniority, shall be appointed by the Committee to the vacancy, unless the Advisory Board shall recommend otherwise, and so on. In the event of equal seniority the Committee shall elect one from among the seniors to the vacancy, after report from the Advisory Board. A physician to out-patients or a surgeon to out-patients succeeding to office as physician to in-patients or surgeon to in-patients shall vacate his previous office.

56A. For the purposes of By-laws 55 and 56, the Advisory Board shall not recommend that a physician or a surgeon be not re-appointed or be not transferred from the out-door to the in-door staff, except by resolution of an absolute majority of the Board.

57. When a vacancy occurs in the office of physician to out-patients or of surgeon to out-patients or of medical officer in charge of a special department, and such vacancy is not filled under By-law 55, the Committee shall, within one month, give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time not less than twenty-one clear days from the date of such notice, within which candidates shall lodge at the Hospital with the officer appointed for the purpose their notice of candidature, and the evidence of their qualifications and attainments. A meeting of the Advisory Board shall be convened for a date as early as possible after the time so appointed, and all applications so received shall be submitted to the Advisory Board for report thereon to the Committee.

58. 59. (As at present.)

59A. Prior to any appointment of a *locum tenens* for any physician to out-patients or surgeon to out-patients for any period exceeding two calendar months, the Committee shall give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time not less than seven clear days from the date of such notice within which candidates shall lodge at the Hospital with the officer appointed for the purpose notice of candidature, and evidence of qualifications and attainments, and the Committee shall fill the vacancy after report from the Advisory Board.

60. The Committee may, by an absolute majority of the whole Committee, suspend any member of the medical staff from office. If such member shall, within seven days of such suspension, lodge at the Secretary's office a notice of appeal, the Committee shall, within two weeks of the reception of such notice of appeal, convene a special meeting of the Governors, and shall report to such meeting the suspension and the reason thereof. In the absence of such notice of appeal within seven days, or if the Governors of such special meeting confirm the order of suspension by the Committee, the office of the person so suspended shall thereupon become vacant; and if the Governors refuse to confirm such order the suspension shall thereupon cease.

61. (As at present.)

#### OTHER HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS AND HONORARY DENTIST AND HONORARY MASSEURS AND HONORARY MASSEUSES.

61A. There shall be the following other honorary medical officers:—(1) A pathologist; (2) two or more senior assistant pathologists, of whom one may be appointed director of the histological laboratory, one may be appointed director of the bacteriological laboratory, and one



may be appointed director of the chemical laboratory; (3) two or more junior assistant pathologists; (4) an anaesthetist and assistant anaesthetist; (5) two or more medical electricians; (6) medical skiagraphist, and one or more assistant medical skiagraphists; (7) one or more clinical assistants to each physician to out-patients, and one or more clinical assistants to each surgeon to out-patients. There shall also be: (8) An honorary dentist; (9) honorary masseurs and honorary masseuses with assistants. The honorary medical officers under this by-law shall be registered medical practitioners under the *Medical Act* 1840. The honorary dentist shall be a registered dentist under the *Dental Act*. All officers under this by-law shall be appointed, and may be re-appointed, and may be removed from office, by the Committee, after report from the Advisory Board. The pathologist and the senior assistant pathologists shall hold office for the same term of years as the physicians and surgeons, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The junior assistant pathologists shall hold office for one year, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The remaining officers under this by-law shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. No officers under this by-law shall hold office after attaining the age of sixty. Provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the Committee from time to time, after report from the Advisory Board, may appoint the professor of pathology for the time being in the University of Melbourne to be pathologist, or may appoint him consulting pathologist, with such powers and duties as the Committee may determine: such appointment being terminable at any time by resolution of an absolute majority of the Committee.

## ACCOUNTS.

63. All bequests received on and after 20th March, 1910, may, subject to any conditions under which such bequests are made, be in the first instance paid into the Maintenance Fund, and shall be available for the maintenance of the Hospital; but in the event of the Maintenance Fund being in credit at the close of any financial year, amounts received from bequests in that year may, as far as the balance will provide, be transferred to the Endowment Fund. All or any moneys for the time being in the Endowment Fund may be from time to time invested or re-invested in such manner as the Committee may direct, and the income arising from such investments shall be paid into the Maintenance Fund and shall be available for the maintenance of the institution.

64. All or any principal moneys bequeathed to the institution and paid to the Endowment Fund shall, subject to any conditions under which such bequests are made, be available for the purposes of purchasing lands, buildings, and premises for the institution for hospital purposes, or for erecting new buildings, or in pulling down, altering, adding to, or improving the premises for the time being used by the institution for hospital purposes. Provided always that no such moneys shall be expended in the purchase of land or premises unless and until such expenditure, both as to general object and aggregate amount, shall have been approved of by the resolution of the majority of the Governors present, and voting by ballot, at a general or special meeting of Governors, such ballot to be conducted in manner prescribed by By-law 23. But, subject to the foregoing provision, the moneys hereby or by such resolution as aforesaid authorized to be expended for any such purposes as aforesaid may be applied by the Committee to the purposes so authorized in such particular manner and amounts, and at such time or times as a majority of the whole Committee, at a meeting or meetings specially convened for that purpose, of which not less than fourteen days' notice shall be given to the members, shall in its discretion direct.
