REGULATIONS.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Acts and the Lunacy Act No. 1873, hereby repeals the Regulations heretofore made under such Acts, and makes the following Regulations to take effect from the 1st July, 1909:—

In these Regulations "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane appointed under the Lunacy Act No. 1873.

The Regulations are divided into the following Chapters, viz.:—

Chapter I.—Professional Division, Classification of.

Chapter II.—General Division, Appointment to the.

Chapter III.—General Division, Classification of.

CHAPTER I.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE PROFESSIONAL DIVISION—LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

Public Service Act, No. 1133, Section 59 (i), and Act No. 1721, Section 13, and Lunacy Act No. 1873, Section 12.

1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the Professional Division it shall, unless it be absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who, in the opinion of the Inspector-General of the Insane, possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

2. In the case of appointments, transfers, and promotions made on or after the 1st August, 1905, to any such office, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of such office in such Schedule in the "Yearly rate of Pay."

3. When a minimum rate and a maximum rate of salary are attached to any office, the person holding such office shall be paid such amount, being not less than the minimum nor more than the maximum rate, as shall be from time to time approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Service shall be paid the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office in the Professional Division shall thereupon be the junior officer in such office or grade to which he is promoted or transferred, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto, he shall be paid a salary not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion, provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office.

5. The following are the classes of the Professional Division which apply to officers appointed, transferred, or promoted under these Regulations.

NOTE.—All members of the Medical Staff shall be provided with quarters, and in addition thereto the following allowances:—

Medical Superintendents and Senior Medical Officers.—Water, vegetables, milk, and washing. Medical Superintendents and Senior Medical Officers are provided with fuel and light, but are charged at the rate of £18 a year therefor. They are also allowed to graze a horse and a cow on the Reserve on payment of £3 per annum for each animal.

Junior Medical Officers.—Fuel, light, water, vegetables, milk, washing, grazing for horse and cow, quarters partly furnished.

Unmarried Junior Medical Officers may be provided with rations and attendance in addition to the other allowances, but will be charged £50 a year therefor.

CHAPTER II.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION IN THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 1133, Section 59 (v.), (vi.), and (vii.), and Act No. 1873, Section 12).

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

1. Every applicant (except for the position of Messenger) must at the date of his application be between the ages of twenty-one and forty-one years, and must forward to the office of the Inspector-General of the Insane an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of birth, and the particular appointment or class of appointment which he desires to obtain. He must also send in a certificate of good moral character and industry, as well as a certificate of suitability for employment from either the Inspector-General of the Insane or the Medical Superintendent of one of the Hospitals.

Nurses should be 5 feet 3 inches in height, and Attendants 5 feet 8 inches, with correspondingly good physical development, and in their form of application they should state what their previous occupation or work has been.

Applicants for the positions of Messenger must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty; Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of twenty-one years.

2. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Inspector-General, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

3. On the production of these certificates applicants may have their names entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment," and will be nominated as vacancies occur. Prior to nomination, however, it will be necessary for applicants to furnish a certificate of good physical health.

4. New appointments, all things being equal, will be made from among those persons whose names are entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment" according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled, and the Educational Test Examination having been passed; but the Inspector-General may nominate any applicant who has special qualifications without regard to his position on the Register.

5. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name will thereupon be removed from the Register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the Register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Inspector-General respecting his nomination to the Lunacy Department addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Inspector-General.

6. No name of any person shall remain on the Register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one years.

Educational Examination.

7. Any person appointed under these Regulations will be on probation for twelve months, and the Attendants and Nurses will be required prior to their probationary appointment to pass an examination which will prove the sufficiency of their education.

The subjects of examination shall be those specified hereunder:—

- (a) Handwriting: to be tested by copying out at least 200 words from a passage of simple English.
- (b) Spelling: to be tested by writing from dictation an extract from a newspaper—not less than 100 words.
- (c) Arithmetic: first four rules, simple and money.

NOTE.—At the discretion of the Inspector-General of the Insane, Arithmetic may be omitted in the case of Nurses.

Applicants who have passed any examination for candidates for appointment in the Public Service of Victoria, or any like examination, will be exempted from this examination. Persons appointed to positions in the General Division other than those of Attendants and Nurses will not be required to pass the Educational Examination, i.e., Hospital Trained Nurses, Artisans, and Servants.

First Departmental Examination.

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regulations must qualify themselves for retention on the staff of the Lunacy Department and for subsequent increments to their salaries by attending the necessary courses of lectures in Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, First Aid to the Injured, and General Duties.

Failure of an Attendant or Nurse to pass the Departmental Examinations within the times specified will be considered to be evidence of incapacity to discharge the duties of his or her office; and the retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Nurse will be retained on the staff of the Lunacy Department unless he or she has passed the First Departmental Examination.

9. The First Departmental Examination cannot be undertaken before the Attendant or Nurse has been in the service of the Lunacy Department for a period of one year, and must be passed before the expiration of the second year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. In the event of a failure to pass at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of a second opportunity to pass the examination being given.

Second Departmental Examination.

10. The Second Departmental Examination—in general and mental nursing—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the third year of service in the Lunacy Department, but the Attendants and Nurses must present themselves for this Examination before the end of the fourth year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. On the passing of this Examination a certificate will be given to the successful examinee setting forth that he or she is considered as a trained mental Attendant or Nurse of the Lunacy Department. In the event of a failure to pass this second examination at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of other opportunities to pass the examination being given. In the event of a second failure to pass, however, the services of the unsuccessful candidate may be dispensed with.

11. The first increment will only be recommended to the Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Departmental Examination having been passed, and if he or she is approved of by the Medical Superintendent, and the Inspector-General, and on the production of a certificate of good conduct and diligence from the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane where he or she is employed. The third increment will not be recommended until the Second Departmental Examination has been passed.

12. In determining the claims of officers to promotion, consideration will be given in respect of merit to the following qualifications:—

- (a) Ability and knowledge required to fulfil the duties of the superior office, and the possession of the necessary tact and judgment.
- (b) Industrious habits and careful performance of work.

- (c) Good conduct, regular attendance, and prompt and cheerful service on urgent occasions.
- (d) Mental vigour and sound bodily health.
- (e) Performance of valuable services of a special nature.

In determining the claims to promotion of an Attendant or Nurse in a Hospital for the Insane, consideration in respect of merit will be given to evidence of nursing qualifications as shown by having passed the examinations held by the Department.

13. No Attendant or Nurse will be eligible for promotion to the Second Grade until the Second Departmental Examination is passed.

14. For promotion to the First Grade selection will be made from among those Attendants and Nurses who have passed into the Second Grade, and who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.

15. Except in a case in which the Inspector-General shall certify that some particular office in the Lunacy Department should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, the person to fill the position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse may be selected from among the Attendants and Nurses who have demonstrated their capacity for the special work required of them.

16. It will be necessary for the Chief Nurses, the Hospital Attendants, and the Hospital Nurses to pass a special Examination in mental nursing before their appointments are confirmed.

17. Officers appointed to any position in the Lunacy Department shall not, until they shall have served for a period of 5 years on the staff of the Department, be transferred to any other Department or Branch unless such transfer is determined to be in the interests of the Public Service.

Board of Examiners.

18. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted by a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the Inspector-General or his Deputy and two Medical Superintendents or Deputy Superintendents appointed by the Inspector-General.

19. The subjects for the First and Second Departmental Examinations shall be those set forth in the syllabus of lectures adopted from time to time and issued to each Hospital for the Insane, the text-book being as prescribed from time to time.

20. The employés at the Idiot Asylum and the Reception House so far as is practicable will be subject to the same rules as the employés in the Hospitals for the Insane.

21. In accordance with the exigencies of the Department, and in order to facilitate the better training of Attendants and Nurses, the Inspector-General may transfer an Attendant or Nurse from one Hospital to another, or from the female side to the male side of the same Hospital where the nursing of male patients is undertaken by female Nurses.

22. All probationers and persons appointed on the staff of the Lunacy Department will be required to sign the agreement hereunder at the time of entry on duty.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

I hereby acknowledge to have received and read a copy of rules and instructions appended hereto and marked A and B which are now in force for the guidance of in the Lunacy Department. I fully understand that during my connexion with this Department and in consideration of being employed, I am obliged to obey and carry out these rules and instructions, and all other rules, instructions and orders which may be in force during my employment within the Hospital for the Insane in which I may at any time be employed, and also that I must be careful of the property of the Government of Victoria and must promote so far as I am able the interests and objects of any such Hospital, avoid gossiping about its inmates or affairs, and endeavour generally by my own conduct and demeanour to sustain the reputation of the establishment. I further understand that I am liable to be called upon to perform any duty assigned to me, although not of a nature I usually perform, should I be required to do so by the Medical Superintendent or his representatives; that it is my duty if anything improper is done in my presence or to my knowledge in the Hospital wherein I may be employed, to report it to the Medical Superintendent; and I understand and agree that I am liable to be punished or have my services dispensed with or be dismissed for any transgression of any instruction, order or rule of the Hospital, or of any instruction, order or rule applying to and further I understand the principles laid down in the Rules and Regulations for promotion by merit, good behaviour and suitability (and, for the Attendants and Nurses, that the possession of the Departmental Nursing certificates), are the only means by which I may expect promotion, and that any attempt to gain promotion by

CHAPTER III.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 1133, Section 59 (viii.), and Act No. 1721, Section 13, and Act No. 1873, Section 12).

1. In the case of appointments, promotions or transfers to any office in the General Division in the Lunacy Department, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay (1)," provided, however, that the rates of pay specified in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay (2)" shall apply to officers appointed as described in the heading or the footnotes.

2. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.

3. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate, every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General of the Insane, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Department shall be paid at not more than the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any class or grade shall thereupon be deemed to be junior to any officer already in such class or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion. Officers who are transferred to the Attendants' or Nurses' staff from the Artisans' and Servants' staff, and who are in receipt of salaries at or above the maximum of the Third Grade, may be transferred to the Second Grade on the recommendation of the Inspector-General without regard to their seniority. They will, however, be required to pass the Educational and Departmental Examinations prior to being so transferred.

5. In the case of Attendants and Nurses, promotion from Grade to Grade may be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, and shall be regulated in accordance with the special regulations for Attendants and Nurses.

6. Increments may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the following Schedule, on the scale shown hereunder, viz. :-

For Staff, Artisans and Servants, Attendants and Nurses :

When the difference exceeds £45 :

Three increments each equal to one-third of the difference between the minimum and maximum, to be payable as follows :-

First increment, after an interval of one year from appointment, or, in the case of an officer transferred, after an interval of one year from the date upon which he commences duty in his new office.

Second increment, after a further interval of two years.

Third increment, after a further interval of three years.

When the difference does not exceed £45 :

First and second increments as above.

Third increment after a further interval of two years.

7. In cases where officers are in receipt of salaries between the minimum and maximum assigned to their several offices, increments may be granted on the scale shown hereunder, viz. :-

Three increments each equal to one-third of the difference between the salary of the officer at the date of his transfer or promotion and the maximum of his office, to be payable as under the preceding clauses :

Provided that where the difference between the salary of an officer and the maximum of his office does not exceed the sum of £10, one increment of the amount of such difference, or increments of any less amount, may be granted at an interval or intervals of one year.

8. Where an officer previously to his transfer from one office to another has been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

9. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department and of the Inspector-General that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service.

10. If any officer is in receipt of pay greater than the maximum rate, he shall continue to receive such pay until he can be employed upon work equivalent to his salary.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry; plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (viewed *roce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 56 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

LIGHTHOUSE AT CAPE BRETT.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 95 of the 11th November, 1909, notice is hereby given that on and after the night of Monday, the 21st February, 1910, a light will be exhibited from the tower which has been erected on Cape Brett, the south-eastern point of the Bay of Islands, in lat. 35 deg. 11 min. S., and long. 174 deg. 21 min. E. (approximate). The light will be a group-flashing white one of the first order, with two flashes in quick succession every half-minute. The focal plane of the light will be 510 feet above high water, and it should be visible, except when obscured by the land, over an arc of 240 deg. for a distance of thirty miles and a half.

SHIRE OF MORWELL.—BY-LAW No. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Morwell, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Maryvale (Morwell), Yinnar, and Boolarra, and such parts of the Shire as are included within a boundary formed by a line being the circumference of a circle of which the Railway Station of each of the townships is the centre, and a radius being 110 chains for the township of Maryvale (Morwell), and for the townships of Yinnar and Boolarra a radius of 50 chains.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil,

and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Council on the twenty-fourth day of November, 1909.

'SHIRE OF BIRCHIP.—BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Birchip, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

This By-law shall apply to that part of the Shire of Birchip comprised and within the Township of Birchip and to that part of the said Shire comprised and within the following boundaries:—

Commencing on Marlbed-road at a distance of 5 chains north of Percy-street, in the township of Birchip; thence westerly for a distance of 52 chains; thence southerly along the reserve west of Show Grounds and across Ballapur-road, for a distance of 50 chains; thence easterly for a distance of 11 chains in allotment 16, parish of Wirmbirchip; thence southerly for a distance of 17 chains; thence easterly for a distance of 36 chains to the south-east corner of old reservoir on Morton Plains-road; thence southerly along Morton Plains-road for a distance of 14 chains; thence easterly across Morton Plains-road and through Irving's paddock (part allotment 38, parish of Narraport), and continuing across railway line and through allotment 38 (McClelland's), parish of Narraport, to Corack-road at south-east corner of Morrison's tank; thence northerly through allotment 2 (T. H. Grace's), parish of Karyrie, across Wycheproof-road and into allotment 1 (Morris's) at a distance of 43 chains from Wycheproof-road; thence westerly for a distance of 25 chains across railway line and along northern side of allotments 61 and 1, parish of Karyrie, and across Marlbed-road to point of commencement, about 5 chains north of Percy-street, parish of Wirmbirchip.

(1) All former By-laws and Regulations on the matter and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed except as to the acts done and penalties incurred and proceedings in law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) The ordinary system of pans for night-service is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.

(4) The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service herein provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

(5) The Council of the said Shire may at any time, and from time to time, license or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the above-described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.

(6) No occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises save in accordance with this By-law.

(7) Once at least in each week the Council shall cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a cart or other conveyance having springs and covered in, so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia, and at the time of such removal as aforesaid a pan cleansed by some efficient means shall be left in the place of the pan so removed.

(8) All night-soil, when removed, shall be deposited only at such place or places and in such manner within the Shire as the Officer of Health or Inspector of Nuisances shall approve.

(9) The system will be known as the Double-pan Day System.

(10) Every occupier or other person having the control or management of any premises shall provide and keep in use in every closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

(11) No person shall place any slops, rubbish, or kitchen refuse in any pan, or anything that may prove injurious to the pan.

(12) No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, urine, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, and no person shall place or deposit any such filth or rubbish in any public drain or in any position from which it may be carried to the drains by a flow of water or other liquid.

(13) No closet door or trap shall abut upon or be within six feet of any footpath, lane, street, or right-of-way.

(14) Every occupier of any premises shall collect all dust, mud, ashes, broken glass, crockery, tins, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, and for the temporary deposit of such refuse shall provide and keep on the premises one or more covered boxes sufficient to contain the collection of one week. The dimensions of each box shall not exceed 3 cubic feet, and in weight, when filled, 112 lbs., so that the same may, with the contents thereof, be readily and conveniently movable by one man. Every occupier or person having control of premises shall cause all such refuse to be deposited, as soon as convenient, in such box or receptacle.

(15) The Council shall have power to make a sanitary rate, or any charge as the Council may seem meet, for the work herein specified; also a charge on each occupier for the first pan supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

(16) Any person guilty of any breach of this By-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting Justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.), or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) nor less than Five shillings (5s.) for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the thirtieth day of August, 1909, and confirmed on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1909.

PART II.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.—
CHAPTER IX.—MISCELLANEOUS LICENCES.—SECTION 145,
LAND ACT 1901.—REGISTRATION OF LIENS.

1. Any licensee who desires to obtain a loan on the security of his improvements shall apply to the Minister in the form prescribed in Schedule 58A hereto, who may, if he thinks fit, consent to the licensee giving a lien in the form prescribed in Schedule 58B, on condition that a building and other improvements to the combined value of not less than the amount of such lien be forthwith placed or effected on the land under licence.

2. Liens shall be executed in the form prescribed in Schedule 58A hereto.

3. Every application for permission to register a lien on a licence under section 145, *Land Act 1901*, for occupation of land as a site for a dwelling and garden, shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule 58C hereto.

4. A lien shall not be registered in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne, unless all rents due to date have been paid, and a building and other improvements to the combined value of not less than the amount of the lien have been placed or effected on the land, which value shall be verified by a Bailiff of Crown Lands or other officer whom the Minister may appoint.

5. The indorsement of the lien upon the licence shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 58D hereto.

6. No fee shall be charged for registration of lien.
