RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WEDDERBURN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Ceme-teries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Wedderburn Pub-Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations at is to say):— (that is to say) :-

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby
- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
- 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper
- 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

- 2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said Urban District:—

Provided that the rate for the supply of water as afore-said to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings per half-year.
 - (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
 - (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the half-year beginning with the first day of January, 1910, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1910, and shall be payable on the twelfth day of March, 1910, at the office of the said Commission at Murtoa.
- 4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 5. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO MINERAL SPRING IN THE PARISH OF GLENLYON, AT LEITCHE'S CREEK.

THE Council of the Borough of Daylesford and the Council of the Shire of Glenlyon (hereinafter termed the Committee), being the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for affording Access to Mineral Spring in the Parish of Glenlyon, at Leitche's Creek, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, r flowers in the Reserve; nor shall any fires be lighted therein.

therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall erect any buildings in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

- 6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plot or plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- . 8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works

No person shall interfere in any way with the springtaps, or prevent the flow of mineral water; and no person shall fill and deliver for fee, profit, or reward any cans or vessels with mineral water from any spring or springs in and upon the Reserve for use or consumption by any other person or persons without the consent, in writing, of the Committee; and no person shall, without the like consent, remove or carry away any mineral water from the said spring or springs for fee, profit, or reward for use or consumption by any other person or persons.
- 10. No person shall dance or hold any form of concert or other entertainment within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- rr. No person shall stand on any of the seats in any building erected within the Reserve, or cause any interference with or annoyance to visitors by playing games or musical instruments therein, or by obstructing free entrance thereto without the permission of the Committee.
- 12. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, nor bring into the Reserve on any such day any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket duly issued by the Committee authorizing the admission of such person, or horse, or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, but no such ticket shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter into any building, erection, enclosure, plantation, or cultivated plot within the Reserve
- 13. All persons paying for admission to the Reserve, or bringing therein any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which shall, upon demand, be produced, and, if required, surrendered to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized by the Committee to demand the production or surrender of tickets.
- 14. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any building or enclosure, for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall, together with any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, in his possession or care be hable to be removed from the Reserve by any gatekeeper, supervisor, or other person duly authorized by the Committee or by any police constable, notwith-standing that such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, beyele, vehicle, or horse shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, mo.or car, notor cycle, bleyele, vehicle, or horse shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and, whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off-side thereot, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall within a reasonable distance from, or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or any other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where any such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible and render assistance if required, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.
