NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

REGULATIONS.—EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 6th August, 1903, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board,

be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) A.B.

(Date)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests), of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in

elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding diplomas from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence and certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence and certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, shall be entitled to a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF APPRENTICESHIP.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which apprentices or pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration may be accompanied by evidence of the apprentice or pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination in English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of apprenticeship or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. M. COLGAN, TAILOR, HARGREAVES-STREET, BENDIGO,

for a period of five weeks from the 23rd February, 1910, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eighteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eighteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE BRIGHTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Brighton General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations which shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

1. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. Any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the Cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the Trustees thereof. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. Any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply, in writing, to the Trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval. Every permission will be subject to sections 21 and 26 of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, and no label is to be removed from any grave without written permission from the surveyor or other officer, and must be again replaced under their direction.
4. For the information of the Trustees, an English translation must accompany any inscription in a foreign language. No proposal to erect a tombstone or a monument in the portion of the Cemetery allotted to the Jews will be entertained by the Trustees unless the design and the inscription (if any) accompanying such design has previously received the approval, expressed in writing, of a duly qualified minister of a Jewish congregation.
5. Any order for interment shall be given at the office of the Trustees at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
7. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the surveyor or other officer, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
8. Every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. In the portion of the Cemetery allotted to the Jews one corpse only shall be interred in each grave of whatever character.
9. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence, that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said Cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy-Registrar of Deaths, Coroner, or Justice of the Peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the Cemetery.
12. Any public grave may, on approval of the Trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees as per Scale of Charges.
13. In the case of it being desired to exhume any body, the same shall only be done on the production, at the office of the Trustees, of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and at such hours and on the payment of such charges as the Trustees may determine.
14. In case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery or burial ground a verified copy of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf must be produced at the office of the Trustees and the usual fees paid before such re-interment.

SCHEDULE A.

CERTIFICATE OF RIGHT OF BURIAL IN THE BRIGHTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

15. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to half-past Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No interment will be allowed on Sunday except in such cases as a medical practitioner or a magistrate certifies, in writing, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.

16. No burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the Trustees.

17. The time fixed for any funeral shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

18. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance gates to the Cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Breaking out of the procession after passing the said gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery.

19. Any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

20. Any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the Cemetery without the permission of the Trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

21. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, Oamaru, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

22. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrances. No person shall be allowed to bring work into the Cemetery on a vehicle having wheels of less than 4 inches in width, unless by special permission.

23. No catacomb shall be allowed.

24. No wooden erection shall be allowed.

25. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.

26. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or any trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any Rules, Regulation, or By-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

27. No person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the Cemetery.

28. No person, other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the Trustees.

29. The surveyor or other officer so directed shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the Trustees, over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.

30. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

31. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected there; and registers of all grants are kept by the Secretary.

32. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

33. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Charges and Regulations.

BOROUGH OF TALBOT.—TALBOT BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1910.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1910 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the Municipality of the Borough of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound, or 5 per cent. upon the annual municipal value.

3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

5. Government offices supplied with water under special agreement with the Trust, the following charges shall be made:—

Post Office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 30,000 gallons per annum.

State School, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per load of not more than 400 gallons.

7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at (6d.) Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half acre, and 200,000 gallons per acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from the open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The above-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1910, and the 1st day of July, 1910, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly or as may be demanded by such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose, and shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 1st day of March, 1910, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Meredith, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said shire, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said Shire.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 25, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the Shire of Bairnsdale, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

THAT in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 22 be repealed.
2. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 407 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the Shire of Bairnsdale be impounded.

3. That the above order be carried out under the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said Shire, and occupiers of land fronting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impoundings of ten head of cattle or five head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

4. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, quarterly in advance, at the rate of 3s. per quarter for every head of such cattle and 6s. per quarter for every head of horses so exempted, half such payment to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by this Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

5. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register such head of horses and cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a chain and numbered tag on the same in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt

for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

6. Any exemption from the impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law shall not extend to any stock found wandering within the following portion of the Shire of Bairnsdale, viz., the whole of the Centre Riding of the Shire of Bairnsdale. Any stock found within such area, even though registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.

7. The Council will not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of, any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass and water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

8. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect, in the form of the Schedule attached hereto.

9. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers, free of charge, up to that limit of age.

10. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

11. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement, at the close of every half-yearly period, and the owners requiring exemption for the ensuing quarter are required to present their stock for registration at such musters. Stock may be registered during any period between the musters on payment of the full quarter's fee.

12. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

13. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

14. No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than six miles in each day, between sunset and sunrise.

15. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of registration period.

16. The council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from the streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the inspector of nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

17. While persons retain chain and tag they will be held responsible for registration fee, and the charge for hire of tag and chain will be continued while holding same, and on returning the chain and tag the charge made for hire of same will be refunded.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the East, West, and South Ridings of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
