NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

SHIRE OF EUROA.—BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Euroa made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Euroa, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Euroa Riding of the Shire of Euroa as proclaimed in the Victorian *Government Gazette* of the 3rd of May, 1906, page 2288.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in every such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by super-heated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This resolution making this By-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Euroa on the 27th day of November, 1909, and confirmed on the 22nd day of January, 1910.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

APPPLICATION BY THE DEFENCE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR AN ORDER UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER ACT 1896 AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION AND USE OF AN ELECTRIC LINE WITHIN THE SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK AND THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

THE WOMEN'S HOSPITAL AND INFIRMARY FOR DISEASES PECULIAR TO WOMEN.

AT a Special Meeting of the Subscribers and Life Governors of the above Corporation, held at the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 11th March, 1910, it was resolved:—

That By-laws Nos. 24 to 33 inclusive be repealed, and the following new by-laws be enacted in lieu thereof:—

24. The honorary medical staff shall consist of twelve honorary medical officers, four of whom shall be called infirmiry surgeons, and shall have charge of the infirmiry department; four shall be called assistant surgeons, and shall assist the infirmiry surgeons in the treatment of indoor patients, and shall have charge of the out-door department; the other four shall be called midwifery surgeons, and shall have charge of the midwifery department; but all appointments of these officers shall be in respect to either the infirmiry department, the out-door department, or the midwifery department.

25. In addition to the twelve honorary medical officers appointed, the committee may in their discretion appoint the Lecturer on Obstetrics at the Melbourne University to be ex-officio a member of the honorary medical staff of this hospital, provided he be qualified under By-law 26; any such lecturer so appointed shall be attached to the hospital, and his appointment shall be for such time as the committee think fit, and the committee may define his duties in connexion with the aforesaid appointment.

26. No person shall be an honorary medical officer in this corporation unless, in addition to the requirements of the *Medical Act 1890*, he possesses a degree in medicine of an Australian University, or a degree in medicine of one of the recognised Universities of the United Kingdom, or of some foreign University recognised by the University of Melbourne, or be a member or licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London, Edinburgh, or Ireland, and in addition to the above he shall possess a degree in surgery of some University in the Australian States or in the United Kingdom, or be a member, fellow, or licentiate of some college of surgeons in the United Kingdom,

and shall have been engaged in the actual practice of his profession not less than five years. One year of actual practice in a hospital for treatment of diseases peculiar to women is to be considered and counted as equal to two years of ordinary practice, but not more than one year is to be thus counted in favour of any one candidate. No member of the Medical Staff of any other Metropolitan Hospital shall be eligible for appointment, or hold office as an Honorary Medical Officer in this Corporation.

27. All honorary medical officers, except such as hold office under By-law 25, shall be appointed for a period of seven years, and shall be eligible for, but not entitled to, reappointment to the positions previously held by them respectively for a second similar period. Provided that all honorary medical officers, whether holding office as University lecturers or otherwise, shall, upon attaining the age of 60 years, cease to hold office in the hospital.

28 (a) When a vacancy occurs in the office of infirmary surgeon, the senior assistant surgeon shall, if he is not disqualified from further service under By-law 27, be appointed by the committee to the vacancy, unless the advisory board shall recommend otherwise. If the advisory board recommend otherwise, the assistant surgeon next in seniority shall be appointed by the committee to the vacancy, unless the advisory board shall recommend otherwise, and so on.

When a vacancy occurs in the office of assistant surgeon, the senior midwifery surgeon shall, if he is not disqualified from further service under By-law 27, be appointed by the committee to the vacancy, unless the advisory board shall recommend otherwise. If the advisory board recommend otherwise, the midwifery surgeon next in seniority shall be appointed by the committee to the vacancy, unless the advisory board shall recommend otherwise, and so on.

In the event of equal seniority, the committee shall elect one from among the seniors to the vacancy after report from the advisory board.

An assistant surgeon or a midwifery surgeon succeeding to office as infirmary surgeon or assistant surgeon respectively, shall vacate his previous office.

(b) Subject to the provisions of By-law 25 and sub-section (a) of this By-law, the honorary medical staff shall be from time to time appointed by the committee after report from the advisory board.

(c) The advisory board shall consist of twelve members, six to be chosen by the committee, two by the medical staff of the hospital, two by the Council of the University of Melbourne, and two by the Faculty of Medicine in the University of Melbourne. The members of the advisory board shall be chosen annually, and shall hold office till their successors are appointed. Any casual vacancy may be filled for the remainder of the annual term by the body among whose representatives the vacancy has occurred. The advisory board shall elect a chairman from among the members chosen by the committee. The chairman shall have a vote, and, if necessary, a casting vote. The quorum for the advisory board shall be seven.

(d) The advisory board shall not recommend that an assistant surgeon or a midwifery surgeon be not transferred, as mentioned in sub-section (a) of this By-law, except by resolution of an absolute majority of the board.

29. Not less than seven days before the occurrence of any vacancy in the honorary medical staff, the committee shall cause an advertisement to be inserted in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne, notifying that such vacancy is about to occur, and inviting applications for appointment thereto.

30. All applications for appointment as surgeons must be in writing, and lodged with the superintendent within fourteen days from the date of the advertisement referred to in By-law 29, and must be accompanied by evidence of qualification. A meeting of the advisory board shall be convened for a date as early as possible after the expiration of such fourteen days, and all applications so received shall be submitted to the advisory board for report thereon to the committee.

31. Where, at the expiration of such period of fourteen days, there is only a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates for the position or positions vacant, the committee may, subject to By-law 28 (a), and after report from the advisory board, declare him, her, or them to be duly appointed, or in their discretion may from time to time postpone the appointment, and may advertise anew as hereinbefore directed, provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.

32. Where, at the expiration of such period of fourteen days, there are more than a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates for the vacant position or positions, the superintendent shall convene a special general meeting of the committee for the appointment by such meeting of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, and shall give to each member of the committee not less than seven days' notice in writing of such meeting, and of the names of such candidates, and

the committee shall at such meeting, or at any adjournment thereof (subject to By-law 28 (a), and after report from the advisory board) appoint the necessary number of surgeons required to fill the vacancy or vacancies.

33. No honorary medical officer shall be absent from the hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days without permission from the committee. If absent for more than seven days one of the other honorary medical officers shall be appointed to take charge of his patients, and in case of absence on leave for more than a month the committee may, after report from the advisory board, a meeting of whom shall be convened forthwith for the purpose, appoint a qualified *locum tenens*, who shall be subject to the same rules as the honorary medical officers.
