Preliminary Notice.—Any Municipal Council, before making application for an Order authorizing the construction of tramways under the provisions of the Act 54 Victoria, No. 1148, shall intimate its intention of doing so by publishing a notice in the *Government Gazette*, and in one or more newspapers circulating in the district; and such notice shall describe the routes to be followed, and call upon any persons objecting to same to lodge their objections, and their reasons for so objecting, with the Council within fourteen days of the date of such notice.

Form of Application.—Application is hereby made on behalf of the Council of the of under the provisions of the Act 54 Victoria, No. 1148, for authority to construct tramways within the said municipality, and the following information and particulars are furnished in compliance with the Second Schedule of the said Act, and the rules made thereunder.

Particulars to be furnished with the application:—

Give date of publication of the preliminary notice, and, if objections were lodged, furnish copies of same.

State if it is the intention of the Council to construct the tramways, or delegate its authority under the provisions of Act 54 Victoria, No. 1148.

State whether Council intend to borrow money for the purposes of the Order, and, if so, have the requirements of the Act 3 Edward VII., No. 1893, been complied with.

State the various routes to be followed, and the widths of the streets.

Give the minimum curve, and the average and ruling grades.

State the proposed maximum speed.

State the nature of the traffic, whether passengers, goods, or live stock.

State the proposed tolls and charges to be imposed.

State if any railway or tramway constructed, or proposed to be constructed, will be affected.

State if tramway runs along any street or road forming the boundary with any other municipal district, and, if so, whether the Council of such district or districts concur in the proposal or object to same.

TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.—BY-LAW No. 28.

A By-law of the Town of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 28, for the purposes of regulating charges of admission to, and the conduct of persons at or within the gardens within the said town.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in any of the gardens, and to make a charge for admission thereto.
2. The Council shall have power to let any of the gardens to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.
3. No charge or fee for admission to such garden shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.
4. No person except the members of the Council, the town clerk, town surveyor, and employes of the Council on duty shall enter any portion of such garden when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.
5. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission, until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.
6. All the gardens situated in the town and belonging to the Council, as set out in the schedule hereto, shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days and at such hours as the Council may appoint or when a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.
7. No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever.
8. No person shall carry firearms in or through the gardens, or shoot, snare or destroy any birds therein unless by authority of the Council.
9. No person shall ride any bicycle or tricycle in or through the gardens.
10. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the gardens without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

11. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such gardens.

12. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work, any of the Council's employes engaged in the gardens by conversation or otherwise.

13. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such gardens any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.

14. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency within the gardens.

15. No person shall remain in such gardens at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employe of the Council to leave the same.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such gardens.

17. No cart or other vehicle shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven in or through any of the gardens.

18. No horses or cattle shall be allowed in the gardens without the authority of the Council.

19. All goats, fowls, ducks, geese, or other poultry found within the gardens will be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.

20. Definitions.—“Council” shall mean the Council of the Town of Camberwell. “The Gardens” shall mean each and every piece of land provided and set apart by the Council, and set out in the schedule hereto, for the use and enjoyment of the burgesses as pleasure grounds, places of public resort, or public recreation.

21. Penalty.—Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds.

The gardens and reserves to which the foregoing By-law shall apply are as follows:—

- (1) Camberwell Sports Ground, Camberwell-road, Camberwell.
- (2) Broadway Gardens, Broadway, Camberwell.
- (3) Canterbury Gardens, Canterbury-road, Canterbury.
- (4) Surrey Gardens, Union-road, Surrey Hills.
- (5) East Boroondara Reserve, Croydon-road, Surrey Hills.

Order of the Council of the Shire, of Whittlesea, made on the 14th day of April, 1909.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 475 and 479 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea doth hereby order that the land firstly hereinafter described shall be declared a public highway, and that such land so described shall be in lieu of portion of the existing road, secondly and thirdly hereinafter described.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME, ETC.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of sections 3 and 4 of the *Game Act 1890* and sections 4 and 14 of the *Game Act 1896*, do by this Proclamation direct that throughout the State of Victoria, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December, sections five and seven of the *Game Act 1890* shall not be in operation as regards any birds not indigenous to Australia other than Californian Quail, English Skylarks, English Thrushes, Java Turtle Doves, Pheasants, and White Swans:

And do further direct that after the expiration of the period mentioned in this Proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the Birds and Other Animals mentioned in the list following shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1890*, and that the period of the year during which the Game Acts shall be in operation as regards such birds and other animals respectively shall be the period set opposite the name of each such bird or other animal in the said list.

This Proclamation shall come into force after the expiration of a period of one week from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued (see exception below), and may be broken (see posters). Holiday excursion tickets issued on 22nd till 24th March are not available for the return journey till 25th March.

NOTE.—On Holiday Excursion Tickets issued at Spencer-street, Flinders-street, Prince's-bridge, and the Victorian Tourist Bureau, from 22nd till 28th March, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return from 25th March till 18th April inclusive.

Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane.—Excursion tickets available for return for three calendar months will be issued at Melbourne from 19th till 28th March inclusive, at the following return fares, viz.:—Sydney, *via* Southern Line, first class, £5; second class, £3 15s.; Sydney, *via* Harden and Blayney, first class, £5 6s.; second class, £3 19s. Adelaide, first class, £4; second class, £2 10s. Broken Hill, first class, £7 3s.; second class, £4 10s. Brisbane, first class, £10; second class, £6 15s.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Barrier Tickets.—Platform tickets will not be issued at Spencer-street or Ballarat on 23rd and 24th March.

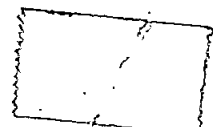

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

MUNICIPAL ABATTOIRS.—BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

REGULATION No. 4.

REGULATIONS of the Borough of Oakleigh made under section forty-four (44) of the Meat Supervision Act 1900, for—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which any animals may be received into or supplied from any abattoirs;
- (b) Prescribing the duties of meat inspectors;
- (c) Fixing the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Councils for the use of abattoirs of which they are the owners;
- (d) The feeding, watering, and tending, and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and for the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs;
- (e) Examining animals by meat inspectors before slaughter, and prescribing the mode of dealing with animals at abattoirs, when suspected of being affected with communicable disease;
- (f) Prescribing the mode of slaughtering animals, of flaying and of dressing carcasses, and for preserving the cleanliness of appliances used therefor;
- (g) Examining by meat inspectors the different parts of a carcass after slaughter at abattoirs, and for preventing the parts of one carcass being mixed with those of another prior to examination;
- (h) Fixing the fees for examining of animals, for examining and branding of carcasses, and for giving certificates as to any examination of any animal, or carcass, or meat made by or under the direction of a meat inspector;
- (i) Prescribing the mode of removing condemned carcasses of meat, and of rendering the same unusable for human consumption, and of disposing of or destroying the same, and prescribing the mode of removing and destroying of blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure from abattoirs;
- (j) Prescribing the nature of the particulars to be entered in the register as to animals examined or slaughtered at or supplied or removed from any abattoir, and as to carcasses of meat dealt with thereat;
- (k) And generally for carrying into effect the objects of the Meat Supervision Acts, and for imposing penalties for non-compliance with the regulations made in accordance therewith.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh make the following regulations, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Oakleigh.

(a).—RECEPTION OR REMOVAL OF ANIMALS.

1. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the public abattoir on such days and at such times as the Councils may determine, provided always that animals shall not be received into the public abattoir on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
2. All animals received or placed into the public abattoir, if not slaughtered or otherwise dealt with as by law provided, must be removed from the public abattoir by the owner or the person in charge thereof within a period of not more than forty-eight hours in all from the time such animals were first received into the public abattoir, otherwise the said animals may be removed by order of the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner thereof, who shall also pay all subsequent charges incurred.

(b).—DUTIES OF INSPECTOR.

3. The following shall be included in the duties of meat inspectors:—

- To keep a register of all animals received into or placed in, or slaughtered or condemned in, or removed from the public abattoir, and to keep such books, accounts, registers, and records, and furnish such reports as the Councils may from time to time direct or require.
- To inspect all animals received or placed into the public abattoir before the same are slaughtered.
- To direct the management and care of animals during the time they are at the public abattoir pending slaughter or removal.
- To direct the removal of all animals that have been longer than eighteen hours in the public abattoir.
- To examine all carcasses, organs, viscera, and offal, and other parts of animals immediately on being slaughtered, and to brand or cause to be branded under his direction, in accordance with the regulations made by the Board of Public Health under the Meat Supervision Acts, all such carcasses, organs, viscera, offal, and parts as are intended to be exposed for sale for human consumption.
- To demand and receive the fees hereinafter appointed to be paid in respect of such examination and branding; also to collect the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoir, or for the slaughtering of animals.
- To superintend and direct the carrying out of all cleansing methods and sanitary measures and requirements in and about abattoirs.
- To keep a register of all butchers, salesmen, slaughtermen, and others engaged or doing business at the public abattoir, and to control and direct the operations and enforce propriety of conduct of all such persons.
- To prevent summarily any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering or cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, and to report to the Council the names of every person guilty of such cruelty.
- To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts, Butchers and Abattoirs Act, by-laws and regulations relating to public abattoirs.

(c).—SLAUGHTERING FEES.

4. The sums stated hereunder shall be the rates of slaughtering fees or dues (including the examining and branding of carcasses slaughtered at the abattoirs) payable to the Councils for the use of the public abattoir, viz. :—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer ...	0	1	9
For every sheep, or lamb, or goat ...	0	0	2
For every head of swine ...	0	0	10
For every calf ...	0	0	9

And such said sums shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the public abattoir, whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

(d).—FEEDING, WATERING, ETC.—CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, ETC.

5. Every person who shall bring animals into the public abattoir shall cause them to be provided with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and if the same remain in the public abattoir for a longer period than twenty-four hours, shall also provide such animals with sufficient food: Provided always that no animal shall be allowed to remain in the public abattoir after three hours' notice shall have been given by the inspector to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove same, and such owner or person in charge shall remove same accordingly.

6. Animals shall be placed in such numbers only as the inspector may direct in any of the pens, stalls, yards, or standing in the public abattoir, and every person failing to observe the directions of the inspector in this respect shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

7. Every person who shall cause any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering any animal, or be guilty of any cruelty to any animal in the public abattoir, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations. All milch animals in the public abattoir shall be milked by the owner or person in charge thereof at such time and place as the inspector may direct, either verbally or in writing.

(e).—EXAMINATION, ETC., OF ANIMALS BEFORE SLAUGHTERING AND COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.

8. Every animal received into or placed in the public abattoir shall be examined by the inspector before any such animal shall be slaughtered, and every owner or person in charge of any animal who shall permit the same to be slaughtered before being so examined, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

9. No animal shall be removed from the public abattoir if affected with, or if, in the opinion of the inspector, there are reasonable grounds for believing it to be affected with any of the following diseases, viz.:—Tuberculosis, anthrax, quarterill, pleuro-pneumonia, swine fever (hog cholera), swine erysipelas, lymphatic abscess, actinomycosis (lumpy jaw), or any communicable, contagious, or infectious disease, and no animal so affected shall be received into the public abattoir, except by the direct permission of the inspector, and when so ordered by the inspector, either verbally or in writing, the owner or person in charge of any diseased animal shall forthwith destroy such animal in the manner directed by the inspector, whereupon the carcass of such animal shall be forthwith dealt with by the inspector so as to render it unfit for human consumption, and the carcass shall be disposed of (at the expense and risk of the owner thereof) in such manner as the inspector may direct.

(f).—MODE OF SLAUGHTERING, ETC.—CLEANLINESS OF APPLIANCES.

10. The owner or person in charge of any animal brought into the public abattoir may slaughter such animal and flay and dress the carcass thereof in such manner, at such time, and in such place or portion of the public abattoir as the inspector shall direct.

11. Every person engaged in slaughtering, dressing, or tending or caring for any animal or carcass in the public abattoir shall take all means and precautions so as to secure perfect cleanliness of his person, dress, and of all appliances of every kind used or to be used by him in the public abattoir, and the inspector shall decide whether all such means and precautions have been taken, and the inspector shall have the authority to forthwith order, either verbally or in writing, any person to at once leave the public abattoir who shall not have so complied in regard to the cleanliness of his person or the appliances used, or to be used by him, and every person who has not so complied shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

(g).—EXAMINATION OF CARCASS AFTER SLAUGHTER, ETC.

12. The carcass, organs, viscera, and offal of every animal shall, immediately upon being slaughtered in the public abattoir, be examined by the inspector, and no person shall cut away or remove from any animal any portion of the carcass or the organs, viscera, or offal thereof, except in such manner as the inspector may direct.

(h).—FEES FOR EXAMINING AND BRANDING CARCASSES.

13. The fees to be demanded and recovered for examining and branding the carcasses or meat brought to the abattoir, or animals fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, which premises are situated outside the meat area, by or under the direction of the meat inspector, shall be as follows:—

(i).—REMOVAL OF CONDEMNED CARCASSES, OFFAL, ETC.

15. Upon the carcass of any animal being condemned by the inspector as unfit for human consumption, it shall be destroyed or dealt with as the inspector may direct, provided always that such carcass will not be removed or retained by the owner thereof, or by any person acting for such owner, but the proceeds or any portion thereof of the disposal of the carcass may, if the inspector so determines, be given to the owner of such carcass.

(j).—REGISTER, ETC., OF ANIMALS.

18. The inspector shall enter, in a book to be kept in the public abattoir, a description of all animals brought into the public abattoir, including the particulars of the class of each animal, the colours, brands, and sex of every head of the same. The date on which such animals were received, examined, slaughtered, or condemned in, or removed from, the public abattoir, and the amount of fees paid for examining, slaughtering, and branding of all such animals, together with the names of the persons who are owners of all such animals.

19. The inspector shall enter, in a book to be kept in the public abattoir, a complete description of all diseases of animals which he inspects, either before or after slaughter, and in such description there shall be included the names of the owners of the animals, the sex, and age, and kind of animals, also of the particulars of the manner in which all such animals have been disposed of.

(k).—CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

21. Any person who in any portion of the establishment shall be drunk, or shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language or of obscenity or indecency, or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty the inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed by the Councils to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any such inspector, assistant, officer, or person, made in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, or of such regulation as shall for the time being be lawfully in force at the establishment, or shall deposit any blood, offal, filth, or refuse matter upon any portion of the establishment or on any land or road abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided and appointed for reception of the same, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

25. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of these regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
