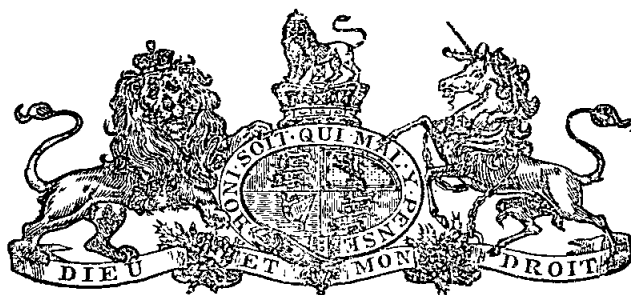

RE PROHIBITION OF NETTING IN McMILLAN'S STRAITS AND NEWLAND'S BACKWATER.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation, namely:—

No. 347.

No vessel any part whereof or of the cargo wherein is on fire, or (if carrying cargo which shall consist entirely or principally of oils, chemicals, or any other substance of a dangerous or inflammable nature) on which a fire existed within twenty-four hours previously to her arrival in the Port, or being in such a leaky or otherwise unusual condition as may in the opinion of the Harbor Master endanger the safety or navigation of the Port, shall enter the River without the permission in writing of the Harbor Master.

The Master of such vessel shall forthwith on arrival in Port notify in writing to the Harbor Master the existence of such fire, or the fact that a fire had existed on board thereof within twenty-four hours previously to her arrival or the condition of such vessel as the case may be.

Any Master committing or suffering a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than £50.

This Regulation shall be incorporated with, form part of, and be construed with the Regulations of the said Commissioners made and passed on the 27th day of September, 1907.

BATHING HORSES AT BRIGHTON.—ALTERATION OF PORT RULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf contained in Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165), hereby repeal Regulation 56A for Ports in Victoria, having reference to Bathing of Horses at Brighton, which Regulation was made by Proclamation dated the sixth day of March, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th March, 1896, page 1418, and was amended by Proclamation dated the twenty-third day of October, 1906, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st October, 1906, page 4499, and in lieu thereof do substitute the following Regulation, viz.:—

56A. Bathing of Horses is prohibited from any part of the foreshore extending from opposite to and in line with the north side of Head-street (formerly called Park-street), Elsternwick, thence southwards to Martin-street, and in line with the north side thereof, and from the north side of the North-road Pier southward to South-road, Brighton Beach, and in line with the north side thereof, except between the hours of Six a.m. and Eight a.m.

Bathing of Horses is also prohibited from any part of the foreshore extending from opposite to and in line with the north side of Martin-street aforesaid southward to the north side of the North-road Pier aforesaid on days other than Sundays except between the hours of Six a.m. and Eight a.m., unless such horses are led by or from a boat or boats, and on Sundays is prohibited under any circumstances.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williams' town districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form, as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall, as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself.
