COMMISSION TO INQUIRE AND REPORT AS TO CERTAIN MATTERS ARISING OUT OF CONTRACT FOR THE ERECTION OF FLINDERS-STREET NEW STATION BUILDINGS.

CANCELLATION OF A WINE AND SPIRIT MERCHANT'S LICENCE.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.—
BROADFORD GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 30 shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Broadford General Cemetery, and from and after publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* all rules and regulations hitherto made shall be rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted) from Two p.m. to Nine p.m.

3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the Cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order obtained, and the fees where not remitted paid.

4. The fees mentioned in the scale shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be payable at time of making application for any order.

5. A burial right shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining permission of the Trustees as hereafter mentioned to erect or maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. A permit in writing will, on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, or other erection therein if approved by Trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

7. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the Trustees.

8. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of slate, stone, or iron securely cemented.

9. Any tomb or monumental material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected by the owner.

10. No person other than the owner or his agent duly authorized, in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave, vault, or enclosure except by special permission of the Trustees.

11. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in proper repair by and at expense of the owner.

12. Any public grave may, on approval of the Trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for in the scale.

13. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult, and not more than one adult unless the grave be seven feet deep shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to one adult.

14. Notice of any burial shall be given at the Cemetery eight working hours prior to time fixed for the burial.

15. Before a private grave shall be re-opened the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give same shall be given.

16. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead plate with the distinguishing number for burial stamped thereon.

17. No order for burial shall be given until there has been deposited at the office of the Trust a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or a Registrar of Deaths, and in case of re-interment, on removal from one cemetery to another, verified copies of such certificate and the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

18. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the Trustees, shall be on week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Four p.m.

19. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

20. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

21. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the Cemetery except as approved by the Trustees.

22. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., and in all cases the Trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions, any non-compliance therewith being a breach of these Rules.

23. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation involving extra sinking or labour.

24. No firearms shall be discharged in the Cemetery.

25. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any shrub or plant from the Cemetery unless by authority of the Trustees first had and obtained.

26. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

27. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open from sunrise to sunset throughout the year, but the Trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers, and servants, to remove from the Cemetery all misconducting themselves or violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or

injuring any tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 1072 or any Act made or to be made amending same.

28. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from the Trustees.

29. Any workman employed in the Cemetery, though not in the employment of the Trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the Cemetery.

30. Any material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 121.—GENERAL RATE.

WESTERN WIMMERA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of section 62 of the *Water Act* 1905, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Western Wimmera Waterworks District, except within any urban district thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands and for watering cattle or other stock:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Horsham, the office of the Municipality of Arapiles at Noradjuha, the office of the Municipality of Borung at Warracknabeal, the office of the Municipality of Dimboola at Dimboola, the office of the Municipality of Horsham at Horsham, the Post Office at Brimpaen, the Post Office at Jeparit, the Post Office at Jung Jung, and the Post Office at Natimuk, a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan, a rate of Threepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan, a rate of One and one-half pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made, and shall be levied for the half-year beginning with the first day of January, 1910, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1910, and shall be payable on the sixteenth day of April, 1910, at the office of the said Commission at Horsham.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by F. Bassett, valuer, and adopted by the said Commission on the twenty-ninth day of September, 1909, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act* 1905, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1910.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st March, 1910.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick-work, or plastering.

WHEREAS by section 87 of the *Water Act* 1905 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may, in such Order, amongst other things, increase or diminish the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of November, 1894, a Trust, known as the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks Trust were, in and by such Order in Council, defined and limited.

And whereas it is deemed necessary to increase the Waterworks District of the said Trust.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that the Waterworks District of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby increased

by the addition thereto of the lands comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Trust's area at its intersection with the south-eastern railway line; thence easterly along the railway to the western boundary of Crown allotment 31, parish of Korumburra; thence south to the south-western angle of the said allotment; thence along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 1, section 5; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said allotment; thence south to the south-east angle of Crown allotment 1, section 7A; thence along the southern boundary of Crown allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 7A; thence north-westerly to the south-east angle of Crown allotment 26, section F; thence south-westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 26 and part of allotment 25 to the Trust's boundary; thence north along the said boundary to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are as shown upon an Order in Council plan deposited in the Office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

And the Honorable George Graham, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADDITION TO REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACTS.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act* 1901 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made under the *Land Act* 1901 (that is to say):—

Addition to the Regulations made on 8th January, 1902.
PART V.—VILLAGE SETTLEMENTS.—CHAPTER II., DIVISION I.
—VILLAGE COMMUNITIES.

In Clause 13 of Chapter 2 of the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, after the word "hereto" the following words shall be added:—"and shall be subject to such other exceptions reservations covenants and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct."

THE LAMPLOUGH GOLD-FIELD COMMON is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom nine acres, more or less, of land in the parish of Glenmona, being the portions lying between the east boundary of E. A. Curtis' licensed block and Rutherfords Creek, and between the west boundary of W. H. Curtis' licensed block and Rutherfords Creek.—(10.C.47307 & 47308.)

THE YACKANDANDAH GOLD-FIELD COMMON is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom two acres, more or less, of land in the parish of Yackandandah, being the portion lying between J. T. Lansdown's licensed block and the Yackandandah Creek.—(99.C.47184.)

THE YANDOIT GOLD-FIELD COMMON is hereby abolished.—(99.C.46114.)

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

1. The term shall be twenty-one (21) years (the maximum allowed under the Act), commencing at the expiry of one (1) calendar month from the date of sale, but parliamentary authority will be sought for an extension of the term to 33 years, and if such be granted no increased rental will be charged.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 12. 15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7.
