BY-LAW NO. 122.—GENERAL RATE.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of section 62 of the *Water Act 1905*, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except within any urban district thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands and for watering cattle or other stock—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Murtoa, the office of the Municipality of Birchip at Birchip, the office of the Municipality of Borung at Warracknabeal, the office of the Municipality of Donald at Donald, the office of the Municipality of Dunmunkie at Rupanyup, the Post Office at Areegra, the Post Office at Brim, the Post Office at Minyip, the Post Office at Watchem, and the Post Office at Banyena, a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands:
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan, a rate of Threepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan, a rate of One and one-halfpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made, and shall be levied for the half-year beginning with the first day of January, 1910, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1910, and shall be payable on the twenty-eighth day of April, 1910, at the office of the said Commission at Murtoa.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by F. Bassett, valuer, adopted by the said Commission on the twenty-ninth day of September, 1909, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act 1905*, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

Each schedule can be tendered for, and will be dealt with, separately.

The price must be expressed without alterations or erasures, and the total amount of the tender must be stated.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates quoted are considered reasonable.

The tenderers must state where the supplies have been, or are to be manufactured. Paper of British manufacture will receive preference over that of foreign manufacture.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt (in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board), or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Printing Papers, &c.," and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Where samples are provided for, the supplies are to be equal in quality, finish, and in all other respects to, and of the same colour as, the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification. In cases where supplies of a particular maker or of a particular brand or trade mark or of a particular distinguishing mark of such maker, brand, or trade mark are required, the supplies shall conform in all respects with the specified requirements. All supplies are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

10. The packages, cases, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

11. In the event of any alteration in the duties of Customs now being collected, which may affect any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.

12. As regards supplies of Commonwealth manufacture no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the paper, envelopes, &c., tendered for in these schedules shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £2 5s. per week for a man, and £1 per week for a woman respectively, or such other wages as may be determined by any special board under the Factories and Shops Acts which may be appointed during the period of the contract to fix the rate of wages in the papermaking trade, and a copy of those conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tender Forms can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Land Offices in the country.

Tenders should be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box on or before Thursday, 28th April, 1910.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the period from 1st May, 1910, to 30th September, 1911, or to 31st October, 1911, as the case may be, and fee of Five shillings for licence, are forwarded.

TENDERS will be received on or before Thursday, 28th April, 1910, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined Special Conditions.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the Land Act 1901 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Conditions.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Acts, except under the 187th section of the Land Act 1901, or being resumed by

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act* 1901 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

A By-law of the "Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust made under the *Tramways Act 1890*," and numbered one, for all the purposes set out in Clause 14 of the Second Schedule to the said Act.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Prahran and Malvern Tramways Act, No. 2130," and all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, "The Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust" do order as follows:—

1. This By-law may for all purposes be cited as "The Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust By-law 1910."

2. In this By-law, except where otherwise clearly intended, "The Trust" means the "Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust," and any person authorized by the Trust to do any particular matter. "Conductor" means and includes any Conductor, Inspector, Officer, or servant of the Trust for the time being in charge of a tram or of any premises of the Trust. "General Manager" means the General Manager of the Trust's tramways, or any person acting in that capacity for the time being. "Tram" includes every car and vehicle used by the Trust on its tramways.

3. This By-law shall extend to all buildings, premises, and places used for or in connexion with the electric tramways system of the Trust, and to all engines, motors, and trams used in running thereon or in connexion therewith.

4. The tramway route is divided into the following sections:—

Bourke-road to Glenferrie-road, *via* Wattle-tree-road.  
 Tooronga-road to intersection of High-street and Glenferrie-road, *via* Wattle-tree-road.

Tooronga-road to Kooyong-road, *via* High-street.  
 Intersection of Wattle-tree-road and Glenferrie-road to Kooyong-road, *via* Glenferrie-road and High-street.

Kooyong-road to Williamstown.  
 Chatsworth-road to Prahran Terminus, at Charles-street.

5. Each passenger, on paying the prescribed fare, will be furnished with a ticket for the section or sections of the tramway over which such passenger desires to travel, and during the journey for which such ticket is issued he must retain such ticket, and whenever demanded by the conductor produce and show the same to him. Any passenger who shall travel without a proper ticket, or who fails to produce his ticket to the conductor, upon demand, shall pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

6. The fare shall be One penny for each passenger per section with the following exceptions:—

(a) No fare shall be demanded for children under 4 years of age and carried in arms.

(b) Children over 4 and under 12 years of age, and children under 4 who are not carried in arms, will be carried for the following fares:—

Over any two consecutive sections ... 1d.  
 Over any three consecutive sections ... 2d.  
 Minimum fare per child ... 1d.

7. No person who has or may be reasonably supposed to have any contagious or infectious disease as such term is defined in the *Health Act 1890* and any Act or Acts amending the same, shall enter into any tram or tramway waiting-room, or travel by a tram, and no person shall bring into or upon a tram or tramway waiting-room any child who has or may be reasonably supposed to have any such contagious or infectious disease.

8. No person under the age of 18 years shall occupy a seat or remain in the portion of a tram set aside for smoking after being requested by the conductor to move to a non-smoking seat.

9. No passenger or other person who is not an employé of the Trust shall enter the motorman's platform or the conductor's platform of any tram, or travel on the roof, steps, bumpers, or drawbars of any tram, or pass from one tram to another while they are in motion, and no person shall wilfully obstruct a conductor in the execution of his duty.

10. No passenger upon a tram shall permit any child who is travelling with such passenger to stand upon any seat of the tram.

11. No person, other than an employé of the Trust, shall enter or quit a tram except by the left-hand side of such tram to the direction in which the same is travelling, and no person, other than an employé of the Trust, shall enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave a tram whilst such tram is in motion.

12. No person who, in the opinion of the conductor, is in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter any premises of the Trust or to enter or mount upon any tram, and if found in or upon any such premises or tram such person shall, at the request of the conductor, leave such premises or tram, and his fare, if paid, shall be forfeited, and if he do not at once leave such premises or tram he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and, in addition, he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this By-law.

13. No passenger or other person, while riding in or upon any tram, shall solicit alms, play or perform upon any musical instrument, distribute any hand-bills or advertisements, or offer for sale any article.

14. No person, other than an employé of the Trust, shall operate or move the steps, destination signs, trolley pole, trolley cord, driving gear, or brakes of a tram, or the movable bars at the side of the tram.

15. No person shall prevent a passenger getting in or out of any tram, or shall obstruct any passenger in such ingress or egress.

16. No person shall mount or enter a tram after being informed by the conductor that same is full, or having mounted or entered, shall refuse or neglect to leave when requested by the conductor to do so.

17. No person shall swear, or use obscene or offensive language, whilst in or upon any tram, or commit any nuisance in or upon any tram, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger, and any person who, in



the opinion of the conductor, shall have committed a breach of this By-law shall leave the tram on the request of the conductor to do so upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned; and if he do not leave the tram at once he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and he shall also be liable to the penalty fixed by this By-law.

18. No person shall in any way soil or damage any tram or remove or interfere with any fastening of any tram, or remove, affix, or deface any number, plate, printed notice or advertisement, or writing on any part of, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any tram. Any person acting in contravention of this By-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this By-law, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

19. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who for any other reason might, in the opinion of the conductor, be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any tram; and any such person may be prevented from entering any tram; nor shall he enter any tram after being requested not to do so by the conductor; and any such person may be prevented from entering any tram, and if found on any such tram he shall, at the request of the conductor, leave the tram upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned; and if he do not at once leave the tram he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor; and in such cases he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this By-law.

20. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of workmen) shall not, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed in the interior or on the roof of any tram.

21. No infant under the age of 7 years will be allowed to travel by a tram unless under the charge of a passenger of at least 12 years of age.

22. No person who is not a passenger or intending passenger, or an employé of the Trust, shall enter or mount upon a tram, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a tram.

23. Smoking is strictly forbidden in or upon any portion of a tram not set apart for such purpose. The open portion of combination cars and the five rear seats of open trams are set apart for smoking.

24. No person shall expectorate in or upon the floor or any other part of a tram or waiting-room.

25. No person shall strike a match by rubbing the same on any part of a tram not specially provided for that purpose, or shall place or rest his feet on the panels or seats of a tram.

26. No person, unless authorized in writing by the general manager, shall post or stick any placard or bill within or on any tram or on any building or premises connected with the tramways.

27. No person shall, without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall lie on him), wilfully do any of the following things, namely:—

Persist in riding or driving any horse, cart, carriage, motor, bicycle, or other vehicle, or any sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock on the tramway line in front of any tram after the bell of such tram has been rung as a warning that the tram is coming behind, or overtaking such horse, cart, carriage, motor, bicycle, or vehicle, sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock.

28. Special trams plying for hire may be run at such times and between such points as the Trust may from time to time determine. Such trams shall have the destination or the word "Special," and also the fare payable, displayed thereon. Passengers travelling by such special trams shall pay the fare displayed thereon, which shall be fixed by the Trust.

29. No person shall, without the permission of the conductor, take into or upon the tram any luggage, parcels, or other articles, except small parcels which are carried by hand, and which, in the opinion of the conductor, will not be likely to interfere with the comfort of any passenger, or to damage the tram or the fittings thereof; but luggage or parcels in a portable form, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight nor measuring more than 36 inches by 24 inches, may by permission of the conductor be carried on the back platform (but not elsewhere) to the extent to which, in the opinion of the conductor, there is room for the same, and such luggage or parcels shall be carried at the owner's risk, the Trust taking no responsibility or liability for its safe carriage.

30. No person shall, without the written authority of the general manager, take or place in or upon any tram or any premises of the Trust any loaded firearm.

31. Children's carriages, when folded up closely, will only be carried on the back platform by permission of the conductor, and if there is room for them.

32. No person shall be entitled to have any dog or other animal in or on any tram.

33. No person shall give or offer a gratuity to any employé of the Trust.

34. Any person offending against or committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten shillings and not exceeding Forty shillings for each offence.

35. This By-law comes into operation from the 23rd May, 1910.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Trust the 17th day of March, 1910.

#### BY-LAWS OF THE VICTORIA RACING CLUB.

**W**E, Richard Gardiner Casey, Alexander McCracken, Harold Augustus Armytage, Robert Crawford, William Henry Croker, William Leonard, Septimus Miller, John Turnbull, Agar Wynne, and Archibald Yuille, being an absolute majority in number of the Committee of the Victoria Racing Club, do hereby, in exercise of our powers under the *Victoria Racing Club Act 1871*, make the by-laws following, that is to say:—

##### PART I.

*By-laws for regulating the election or admission of members into the club, and the expulsion of members therefrom, and for providing for the due management of the affairs of the club.*

1. *Repeal of previous By-laws.*—All the By-laws of the club heretofore made and passed shall be and are hereby repealed, provided that this repeal shall not affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability, or disqualification acquired, accrued, or incurred under any by-law so repealed, or affect any offence or any penalty in respect of any offence committed against the provisions of any by-law so repealed, or affect any proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid.

2. *Members.*—The club consists of all persons who have been duly elected members, and who have duly paid their subscriptions pursuant to the by-laws of the club.

##### MEMBERS AND ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

3. *Honorary Life Members.*—Any gentleman who shall give a plate, purse, or trophy of the value of One hundred pounds, to be run for at the races under the management of the club, may be admitted a life member of the club.

4. *Admission of Members by Committee by Ballot.*—Candidates for admission as members of the club shall be elected by the committee, by ballot. One black ball in every five votes shall exclude, and no candidate shall be so admitted unless notice of his candidature has previously been sent to each member of the committee in the circular convening the meeting for such election.

5. *Entrance Fee.*—The entrance fee for members' children under the age of 25 years, or for the widow and children (under the age of 25 years) of a deceased member (if elected within one year of such member's death), shall be Five pounds for each candidate. The entrance fee for all other candidates, except those mentioned in the proviso to By-law 8 and in the club's rule relating to non-effective members, shall be Twenty pounds. The election of a candidate shall be void if the entrance fee be not paid within one month thereafter, unless the candidate justify the delay to the satisfaction of the committee.

6. *Addresses of Members.*—All members shall communicate their address from time to time to the secretary of the club, who shall register the same, and all letters delivered at or sent by post to such address shall be sufficient. If no address be given, all letters and notices posted and addressed to the last-known place of abode of the member shall be sufficient.

##### ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION.

7. *Annual Subscription.*—The annual subscription shall be Five guineas, payable in advance to the secretary on the first day of August in each year, except in the case of a member elected after the Autumn meeting, who shall pay one-half of the annual subscription. Each member shall be entitled to tickets admitting himself and two ladies to the club's premises, as hereinafter provided:

8. *Non-payment thereof.*—If any member neglect to pay his subscription when due, notice shall be sent to him or his agent (if known) or to his last-known place of abode by the secretary; and if the subscription be not paid before the next following race meeting of the club, his name may be erased from the list of members. If his name shall have been so erased, he shall cease to be a member of the club, unless he can assign to the committee reasons which they may deem satisfactory for his neglect; if he is able to do so, then, on payment of the amount due, the committee may replace his name upon the list.

*Concession to certain Old Members.*—Provided, however, that any former member, whose payments to the club by original entrance fee (if any) and yearly subscriptions shall have amounted to not less than Thirty-five pounds, shall, upon being again elected, be admitted as a member of the club on payment of an entrance fee of Five pounds, together with the annual subscription for the then current year.

9. *Non-paying Members not to Vote.*—No member shall be competent to vote on any occasion whatever, or enjoy any of the privileges of a member, until he shall have paid his subscription.

10. *Committee to appoint and dismiss Officers and Servants.*—The committee shall have the appointment of the bankers and all officers and servants of the club, and allow such salaries, allowances, and recompenses to them respectively during their service or employment as the committee shall from time to time see fit. All such officers and servants shall be appointed during the pleasure of the committee, who shall have the power of discontinuing their services at any time on giving one month's notice, and also of immediate dismissal in the event of inefficiency, irregularity of conduct, or disobedience.

11. *Committee to enter into Contracts and Dispose of Funds of Club.*—The committee shall have power to enter into such contracts on behalf of the club as they shall think advisable, and shall at all times dispose of the funds of the club as they may deem best for carrying out the objects of the club.

12. *Committee to appoint a person to Handicap.*—The committee shall appoint one or more competent persons to frame the handicaps for the race meetings of the club; the name or names of such person or persons shall be notified to the public.

13. *Expulsion of Members.*—Any member proved to the satisfaction of the committee to have made default in payment of any stake or bet, or to have been guilty of such improper conduct or action as the committee may consider prejudicial to or subversive of the purposes or authority of the club, shall, if the committee think fit, be requested to resign, and in the event of his non-compliance with such request the committee may expel such member.

14. *Club to protect Committee and Stewards from legal proceedings.*—The committee and stewards shall be indemnified from the funds of the club against the damages, verdicts in, and costs of any legal proceedings that may be instituted against them or any of them in the exercise of their office or performance of their duties.

##### STEWARDS, SECRETARY, AND TREASURER.

15. *Committee to be Stewards.*—Each member of the committee shall be *ex officio* a steward of the club, and at all meetings of the committee as stewards four shall form a quorum.

16. *Secretary and Treasurer.*—The committee shall also appoint a secretary and a treasurer.

##### THE SECRETARY.

17. *Secretary.*—It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep full and accurate accounts of all sums of money received or expended on account of the club, to make full and accurate minutes in the books of the proceedings of all general, special, and committee meetings, to give all notices of general and special meetings, and also propositions to be brought before them, as also notices of committee meetings, and, subject to the directions of the committee, to make all disbursements of the funds of the club by cheque to be drawn upon the bank at which the club account is kept, to obtain receipts or discharges for the same, and to carry out the instructions of the committee and stewards respectively.

##### THE TREASURER.

18. *Treasurer.*—It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to present a balance-sheet of the total receipts and expenditure of the club in accordance with *The Victoria Racing Club Act 1871*.

##### CHEQUES.

19. *Cheques.*—All cheques duly authorized by the committee shall be signed by the Treasurer or chairman or vice-chairman or any other member of the committee appointed for the purpose, and countersigned by the secretary.

##### GENERAL AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

20. *Annual General Meeting.*—There shall be a general meeting of the club on the first Monday in August in each year, for the purpose of electing members of the committee, discussing the general business of the club, and receiving from the committee an abstract of the state of the accounts of the receipts and expenditure, with a report of the general concerns of the club. At such meeting the accounts shall exhibit a true statement of the total receipts and expenditure of the club during the year immediately preceding the 1st of July, with a statement of the balance of such account.

21. *Special Meetings.*—The committee may call a special meeting of the members of the club whenever they think fit, and shall call a special meeting not earlier than fourteen days nor later than twenty-eight days after the receipt of a written requisition signed by not less than one-twentieth of the members of the club, specifying the object of the meeting required, and to which object alone the discussion shall be confined.

22. *At General or Special Meetings ten a Quorum.*—At the general or any special meeting, ten members must be present to constitute a quorum before proceeding to business, but should there not be a quorum the members present may, at the expiration of half-an-hour from the time appointed for assembling, adjourn the meeting. In the event of there not being any members present at the expiration of the half-hour, the meeting shall be considered as adjourned for one week.

23. *Chairman to preside at General and Special Meetings.*—The chairman, or in his absence the vice-chairman, or in the absence of both some member of committee, or in the absence of a member of committee some member to be elected by the meeting, shall preside at the general or any special meeting. The chairman of all such meetings shall have only a casting vote. All propositions at any such meeting shall, unless a poll be demanded as hereinafter provided, be decided by a show of hands, but a ballot may be demanded by any three members after such show of hands, and such ballot shall be taken accordingly on a subsequent date to be fixed by the committee, such date to be not later than one month after such meeting. The method of taking such ballot shall be as follows:—

*Method of Balloting.*—The secretary shall forward to each member, at his registered address, an envelope addressed to the secretary, indorsed "Voting-Paper," enclosing the proposition submitted to the meeting, together with a voting-paper appropriately worded so that a member may be able to state whether he intends to vote "for" or "against" the proposition.

Any member wishing to vote without being present at the ballot shall personally erase the appropriate words in order that his intentions may be shown on the voting-paper, and shall return the voting-paper in the above-mentioned envelope, first signing his name inside.

All such envelopes returned to the secretary shall be by him handed over unopened before the close of the ballot to the scrutineers, and shall by them be then and there opened, and the voting-paper therein contained shall be placed in the ballot-box without being unfolded. Any member present at the ballot who may not have voted in the manner above prescribed, may obtain another voting-paper from the scrutineers upon satisfying them that the original paper sent to him has not been acted upon. The ballot shall commence at 3.30 p.m. and close at 6 o'clock p.m., and be taken in the presence of two scrutineers chosen by the general or special meeting at which the ballot is demanded. Provided that should any vacancy occur in the office of a scrutineer, it may be filled up by the chairman of the club. The scrutineers shall, at the close of the ballot, certify to the secretary the result of the ballot, and such result shall be and be deemed the decision of the members on the proposition submitted. Provided that in case of equality of votes the proposition submitted shall be deemed to have been lost.

24. *Notice of Propositions to be given by Members.*—No member shall, as regards any business other than the receipt and adoption of the accounts and report before mentioned, be at liberty to move at any meeting any resolution or proposition not previously approved of by the committee, unless he shall have given not less than 21 clear days' previous notice of his intention to move the same by leaving a copy thereof at the office of the club.

*Notice of Propositions to Members.*—A notice stating any resolution or proposition to be submitted at any meeting shall be posted or sent to the address of each member not less than seven days previously to such meeting.

## PART II.

*By-laws for regulating matters concerning or connected with the land by the said Act vested or now or hereafter vested in the Chairman, and the admission thereto and expulsion therefrom of Members of the Club and the public respectively, and the rates or charges to be paid for such admission.*

25. *Division of Club's Premises.*—The divisions into which the land by the said Act vested in the Chairman of the Committee of the said Club, and his successors in office, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out and known, are as follow:—

1. The Lawn, the Grand Stands, the Members' Carriage Paddock and approaches, except the reserves and enclosures for members, as hereinafter comprised in division 8.

2. The Weighing Yard, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Room, the Committee Stand, the Stewards' Stand, the Judge's Box and approaches.
3. The enclosure called "The Hill," including the Stand on the Hill and approaches.
4. The Training Ground and approaches.
5. The enclosure called the "Outer Carriage Paddock" and approaches.
6. The ground called the "Flat" and approaches.
7. The enclosure called "The Saddling Paddock" and approaches.
8. The reserves and enclosures for members.

26. *Admission Members.*—Subject to the provisions of these By-laws, all members of the Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted at all race and other meetings to all parts of the said land (with the exception of the second division hereinbefore specified), and with their own horses and carriages and motors (not being vehicles licensed for hire) to the Members' Carriage Paddock.

27. *Admission for Training Horses.*—Subject to the provisions of these By-laws, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fourth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the Committee, or the Stewards, may from time to time give, as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

28. *Admission to the Flat.*—All persons shall be admitted at all race meetings to the sixth of the said divisions free of charge.

29. *Judge's Box.*—No person shall enter the Judge's Box except the Judge and Timekeeper, or a Steward, or any person the Judge may call to his assistance.

30. *Weighing Stand and Yard.*—No person shall enter the Weighing Stand or the Weighing Yard, or the approaches thereto, except the Officers of the Club, the Jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the Owners and Trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

31. *Stewards' and Committee's Stand and Room.*—No person shall enter the Stewards' Stand, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Stand, the Committee Room, or the several approaches thereto, except the Officers of the Club and such persons as the Committee or the Stewards may invite to do so.

32. *Admission to be by Ticket.*—No person, unless otherwise permitted under these By-laws, shall enter upon the said land or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing in that behalf. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

33. *Persons Disqualified, or Defaulters, may be Expelled.*—Any person who in the opinion of the Committee has been proved to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, shall not enter or remain upon the said land, or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

34. *Adoption of other Clubs' Disqualifications, &c.*—Any person who in the opinion of the Committee has been proved to be a defaulter in payment of any bet made by him on a horse race or in payment of any money payable by him in connexion with any horse race or of any fine imposed on him by any racing club or the Committee or Stewards thereof for any act or omission in connexion with or arising out of horse-racing shall not enter or remain upon the said land or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

35. *Persons Disqualified by Club not to be Admitted.*—Any person who has been disqualified by the Committee or Stewards of the Club for suspicious or dishonest practices in connexion with horse racing, shall not enter or remain upon the said land, or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

36. *Persons Disqualified by other Clubs not to be Admitted.*—Any person who has been disqualified or warned off the turf by any other racing club or by the Committee or Stewards or governing body thereof for suspicious or dishonest practices or dishonorable conduct in connexion with horse racing shall not enter or remain upon the said land, or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

37. *Expulsion of Persons not entitled to Admission.*—Any person who in the opinion of the Committee is not a desirable person to be admitted shall not be admitted into any of the said divisions, and may be expelled therefrom, after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

38. *Prohibition of Alms Collecting.*—No person without the consent of the Secretary of the Club shall beg or solicit alms or subscriptions for any purpose on the said land or in any building thereon. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

39. *Offenders against the Law, &c., not to be Admitted.*—Any person who has been convicted in a court of law of felony or larceny or of any attempt to commit a felony or larceny or of obtaining money by false pretences or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretence or who is a reputed thief, pickpocket, balancer, welsher, or prostitute, shall not enter or remain upon the said land, or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards of the Club.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

40. *Tickets to be Produced.*—Each member of the Club, and all persons paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, and seventh divisions, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender, to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee to demand the production or surrender of the same.

41. *Remaining on Land after Races concluded prohibited.*—No person without permission shall remain on the said land or any division or part thereof for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

42. *Tenants to comply with Committee's Orders.*—Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the Grand Stands, or any portion thereof respectively, or any booth upon the said land, shall abide by any order given by the Committee or Stewards in reference to the said land, and the buildings and other erections thereon.

43. *Dogs not to be Admitted.*—No person shall take any dog on the said land, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

44. *Lost Property.*—Any officer or servant or employé of the Club, and any other person, finding any lost property or document upon any land in the use or occupation of the Club, or upon any land belonging to the Club, or in any building or premises erected on any such land, shall immediately deliver the same at the office appointed by the Committee for the reception of lost property, to the person in charge of such office; or if such office be closed, shall deliver such property at the office of the Club in Melbourne, to the person for the time being in charge of such office. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

45. *Distributing Bills or Placards prohibited.*—No person, unless duly authorized in writing by the Secretary, shall distribute or post or stick bills or placards, or assist in distributing or posting or sticking same, within or upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises of the Club. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

46. *Removal of Offenders.*—Any person committing on the said land, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, a breach of any of the By-laws of the Club or any of the following offences, may be expelled from such land, notwithstanding such person may be a member of the Club, or may have paid for admission, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, unless authorized, during a race meeting or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in the first, third, fourth, seventh, or eighth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee to demand production or surrender of the same, a ticket, duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the Stewards, or one of them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.

8. Obtaining admission to the said land, or any division or part thereof, when disentitled to such admission under these By-laws.

9. Remaining on the said land, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the said land by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards.

47. *Tolls and Charges.*—The following tolls and charges shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the said land, and the buildings thereon respectively:—
