A By-law of the Borough of Creswick, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1993 and section 35 of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 4t, for prohibiting spitting and expectorating in certain places, and for preventing nuisances and securing the health-fulness of the said borough and its inhabitants.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903 and by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling it in this hebalf, the Council of the Borough of Creswick, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, orders as follows, that is to say:—

1. No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpath of any street or road, or on any pavement, floor, or wall of any place open to or frequented by the public.

2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this Bylaw shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

CAPITAIN GEORGE HOOPER, R.N.R., of the Government s.s. Amokura, reports the existence of a rocky patch bearing N. 25 deg. E. magnetic from N.W. point of Indian Island, Dusky Sound, and distant upwards of one cable and a half from the point and one cable from the foreshore. The least water found over the rock was 12 feet at L.W.O.S. The rocky patch is in extent a quarter of a cable E.N.E., and slightly less in width, and is steepto on north and west sides, having channel between it and the foreshore carrying from 6 to 17 fathoms of water. Excepting this patch the channel on N.W. side of Indian Island appears clear, the ship failing to find anything else with 20-fathom sounders constantly trailed. This is no doubt the rocky patch on which the s.s. Waikare struck.

WARRACKNABEAL PUBLIC CEMETERY.-RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.

RULES, AND REGULATIONS.

THE Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 27 shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Warracknabeal Public Cemetery, and after the publication hereof in the Government Gazette all Rules and Regulations here-

Public Cemetery, and after the publication hereof in the Government Gasette all Rules and Regulations here-tofore made shall be rescinded.

2. Before any interment shall take place application for permission must be made to the secretary, all charges paid and information recorded, when an order to the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to be made.

3. A Burial Right, Schedule B, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

5. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the Cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.

6. The name, age, last place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

of giving the order.

7. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

8. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours will be from Two p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.

9. The charge may be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the Trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

10. Application for permission to make a vault or crect a monument in the Cemetery to be made to the Trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

A certificate of property of the following formula applying.

11. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees, or

some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

12. No re-interment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in thus behalf. in that behalf.

13. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

14. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, state, or iron.

slate, or iron.

15. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

16. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the Trustees.

17. A plan of the Cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the secretary.

18. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the Cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

20. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.

21. The Cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

22. Three of the Trustees to form a quorum.

23. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground.

24. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Charges and Regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. (Second.) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

26. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the Trustees.

27. Any workman employed in the Cemetery, though not in the employment of the Trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their Secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the Cemetery.
