REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

### CHAPTER XIII.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby repeals Clauses 3 and 44 of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made on the 28th June, 1909, and substitutes the following clause in lieu thereof, viz.:—

Clause 3. Hours of Business.—The hours of business to be observed by officers shall, unless otherwise ordered, be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m., except during the months of June, July, and August in each year, when the hours of attendance shall be from Nine o'clock a.m. to half-past Four o'clock p.m., and except on Saturdays, when the ordinary hours of attendance shall be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon;

I'S Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 17th day of May, 1910, under the provisions of section 148 of the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Williamstown, directed that the provisions of the Voting by Post Act 1909, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said Town, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (r) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said Town.
