This By-law shall apply to and have operation within that portion of the Shire described as follows:—Commencing at the junction of the boundaries of the City of Bendigo and Borough of Eaglehawk, at Sparrowhawk; thence by a line running along the western boundary of the said borough between the said borough and the said shire up to where it crosses the main Coliban water race; thence running south and west along such race to where it crosses the one-chain road ruining from the Maiden Gully-road to the Sparrowhawk-road; thence by such gully easterly to the boundary of the City of Bendigo; and thence by such boundary to the commencing point.

3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the said area from the operation of this By-law.

4. The occupier or owner of any premises upon which there may be any cesspool shall forthwith cause the same to be emptied, cleansed, disinfected, and filled with clean carth.

5. Every closet within the said area shall be furnished

5. Every closet within the said area shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Shire Council.

6. At least once a week the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart.

7. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on analy assumer for such service.

7. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service.

8. Every occupier or owner of any house or premises shall provide and maintain on their premises a proper close to privy building constructed with openings or flues to supply ventilation, and the floor of such closet shall be at no point less than three inches above the adjoining ground, and shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleaning the same.

9. Every such occupier or owner shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil.

10. Every privy, closet, or urinal, whether already built or hereafter to be built, shall have a door and be properly screened and fenced from public view.

11. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected or allowed to remain in or in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 4 feet from any public highway, or from any dividing fence unless such adjoining tenements shall be divided by a brick or stone wall 8½ inches thick, not less than 6 feet high, and 8 feet long.

12. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material therein except for deodorizing other than night-soil, or shall remove or interfere with or damage such pans and lids in any manner whatsoever.

or shall remove or interfere with or damage such pans and lids in any manner withstoever.

13. No occupier or person shall employ any other persons save those authorized by the Shire Council for the removal of night-soil, and no person shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption under this By-law.

14. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Shire Council, or be trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the Shire Council.

ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the Shire Council.

15. Immediately on receipt of any night-soil or refuse, the person in charge, or proprietor of any depôt or place appointed for the deposit of night-soil shall bury the same in properly constructed trenches to a depth of not less than I foot from the surface and cover the same by a surface of earth of not less than 9 inches, such burial to be to the satisfaction of the Health Officer of the Shire Council.

16. In so far only as they may be inconsistent with this By-law, the provisions of paragraphs 7, 8, 9, and 12 of By-law No. 1 of the said Shire shall not apply to the

Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £15 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before

2. FAT PIGS FOR SLAUGHTER.

That the prohibition contained in the Regulations of 30th August, 1904, as regards the introduction of swine from New South Wales shall not apply provided such

- (a) are introduced in trucks by rail at a gazetted crossing place on the land border or by ship at the Port of Melbourne;
- (b) are removed direct from the ship or train to a licensed abattoir within the Metropolitan Meat Area, and there slaughtered within fourteen days from debarkation or detrainment, and the owner shall, immediately on slaughter, forward to the Chief Veterinary Inspector a written statement setting forth the number, sexes, place, and date of slaughter of such pigs, such statement to be indorsed as correct and signed by the Meat Inspector of such abattoir; or
