That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females or more than two boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females and two boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the construction of a line of railway to be called the Gheringhap and Maroona Railway has been authorized by the *Gheringhap and Maroona Railway Construction Act 1909*, subject to the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Acts*: And whereas it is necessary that the requirements of section 8 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* be now complied with: Now therefore I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby announce that unless I receive within the period by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* mentioned a petition signed as therein required praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the said Gheringhap and Maroona Railway be not constructed, it is my intention to constitute, after the expiration of one month from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Order, the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the Gheringhap

and Maroona Railway Construction District, that is to say, all the land included within the following boundaries:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE CITY OF ESSENDON.

WE, the Council of the City of Essendon, the duly appointed Committee of Management for the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 4th May, 1909, as a site for a Public Park and other purposes of Public Recreation in the City of Essendon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees; shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling or booth or other structure in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. The Commonwealth Ladies' Rifle Club shall not, after the first day of July, 1910, erect or construct in the Reserve any target, stop-butt, club house, or appurtenances in connexion with the Rifle Range, without the approval of the Minister of Defence, and the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. The land permissively occupied by the Commonwealth Ladies' Rifle Club in the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except such portion or portions thereof as it may be necessary to close at any time to insure the safety of the public during rifle shooting.

12. The Commonwealth Ladies' Rifle Club shall, upon receiving six months' notice, in writing, from the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, vacate the land permissively occupied by the club, and after determination by the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey of the permissive occupancy, shall, if required, have power to remove such targets, stop-butts, club house, and appurtenances therefrom, and failing such removal the Committee of Management shall have power to remove such targets, stop-butts, club house, and appurtenances at the expense of and without compensation to the club.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Applications (with uncanceled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, 3rd August, 1910.

The amount to be paid for each allotment is shown on Schedule hereto.

Now, the Council of the City of South Melbourne, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the said Act, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

No carcass (other than the carcasses of lambs), whether intended for human consumption or not, shall within the City of South Melbourne be dressed or caused or allowed to be dressed in the manner or by the method known as back-setting, nor shall any caul fat be attached to any such carcass or otherwise used in the dressing thereof.

The head shall not be cut off or detached from the carcass of any lamb until such lamb or carcass has been inspected by the Meat Inspector at the abattoirs where such carcass is being dressed and passed by him as lamb.

For the purpose of these Regulations the presence of any permanent teeth in any carcass shall be sufficient evidence that such carcass is not the carcass of a lamb.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of South Melbourne.
