## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million one hundred and twenty-three thousand nine hundred and two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and ten and One thousand nine hundred and eleven.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and ten, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR TRAINING SHIP  
"JOHN MURRAY."

THE control of the Training Ship shall be vested in not more than seven (7) persons appointed by the Governor in Council, one of whom shall be appointed Chairman. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Committee, and in any question on which there is an equal division of votes he shall have a second or casting vote. In the absence of the Chairman the members of the Committee present shall select one of their number to preside at the meeting.

2. The Committee shall meet at least once in each month at such time and place as they may determine, three members to form a quorum.

The Chairman may convene a meeting of the Committee whenever he thinks fit, and any two members of the Committee may require him to convene a meeting to deal with any emergency business, which shall be set forth in the notice of such meeting.

3. The Committee may appoint and discharge all officers of the ship, provided that all such appointments or discharges shall be subject to confirmation by the Chief Secretary.

The Committee may make all requisite rules for the management of the ship and the conduct of the officers.

4. No boy shall be received who is less than 12 or more than 16 years of age, unless in cases in which the Chief Secretary shall direct otherwise. Under no circumstances whatever shall any boy be received who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour.

5. The parent or guardian of any boy shall transfer the care of the boy to the captain superintendent of the training ship in the form of the schedule hereto annexed, and a boy so transferred shall be subject to the control of the captain superintendent for the term specified in such order, unless he be sooner discharged by resolution of the Committee.

6. The sum of Ten shillings (10s.) weekly shall be chargeable for the maintenance of boys on the ship, but the charge may be remitted or reduced by the Committee in the case of parents who are unable to pay that or any lesser amount.

7. No boy shall be received on board without the approval of the Committee, who shall deal with all applications for admission in the order of their receipt, and without regard to any consideration of payment. Before admission every boy must be certified as physically fit by an approved medical officer.

8. The boys received on the ship shall be trained in details of seamanship and in such related subjects as the Committee may from time to time determine.

9. The captain superintendent shall be responsible to the Committee for the good government of the ship and for the efficient discharge of their duties by the officers under him. He shall keep such records as the Committee may from time to time direct.

10. Relatives or friends of boys may be permitted to visit them once in each month, on a day set apart for the purpose, or by special permission of the captain superintendent. No other visitors shall be admitted on board without an order from the Chief Secretary or a member of the Committee.

## THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

## BY-LAW NO. 11.—STANDING ORDERS.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board) pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*, 54 Victoria No. 1197, and in exercise of all other powers possessed by or vested in such Board doth hereby make the By-law and Regulation following:—

Clause 60 of By-law No. 1 of the By-laws and Regulations of the Board, which are therein called Standing Orders of the Board, shall be repealed as from the date hereinafter mentioned, and the following By-law and Regulation substituted therefor:—

60. In addition to the Officers and Servants' Committee required to be appointed pursuant to section 48 of the Act there shall be five permanent Committees to be respectively called "Finance," "Water Supply," "Sewerage," "Legislative," and "Farm" Committees. With the exception of the Sewerage Committee, which shall consist of ten members, and the Farm Committee, which shall consist of five members, each of the said Committees, including the Officers and Servants' Committee, shall consist of six members, and the quorum for Committees shall be as follows, namely: for the Sewerage Committee four, and for each of the other Committees three.



The above repeal shall take effect the day after the notification in the *Government Gazette* of the approval of this By-law and Regulation by the Governor in Council.

Members shall be elected by the Board to serve on the six several Committees hereinbefore mentioned, including the Officers and Servants' Committee, at the first meeting of the Board held after the publication of such notification of such approval as aforesaid or at some subsequent ordinary meeting of the Board, and upon such election being held the members so elected on the several Committees shall take the place of and be substituted for those members who were elected to such Committees (excepting the Farm Committee) at the meeting of the Board held on the 8th March, 1910.

The members so elected shall hold office until the first ordinary meeting of the Board to be held in the month of March, 1911.

The whole of the provisions of the By-laws and Regulations of the Board called Standing Orders shall apply to such Committees and to the members and proceedings thereof as if this By-law and Regulation had been one of the original By-laws and Regulations called Standing Orders.

Notwithstanding the above repeal the members of the existing "Officers and Servants," "Finance," "Water Supply," "Sewerage," and "Legislative" Committees shall continue to hold office and exercise the duties, powers, and authorities incident to and vested in such Committees until the election of members to serve on the several Committees hereinbefore provided for shall have taken place.

2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

**W**HEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890*, it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the Municipal Districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Shire of Upper Yarra.

And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed are described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Shire of Upper Yarra shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

#### ROUTE.

That the route of the said tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing at the new Railway Siding, La La Estate, Warburton, crossing the Yarra River near the Factory of the Signs Publishing Association, thence traversing the northern bank of the said river to the peg two miles ten chains; thence crossing the said river and main Wood's Point-road, and terminating at the peg two miles twenty-five chains immediately east of the said road.

#### GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be three (3) feet, and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans numbered from 1 to 4 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans so deposited as the plans referred to in this Order, and which plans are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

#### MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used shall be steam.

#### MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be twelve miles in the hour.

#### TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the approximate time required to construct the tramway is three months from the date of the approval of the Order authorizing the construction of the tramway.

#### NATURE OF TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of timber and produce only.

#### NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of passengers passing along the roads upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

That the said Council shall exercise special care for the safety of the public, and shall see that no serious inconvenience shall result owing to shunting operations on the main Wood's Point-road at its junction with the Big Pat's Creek-road.

That should the shunting operations become a nuisance or danger to the public, the said Council shall remove the "points" on the said tramway at that place.

#### TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the rates to be charged upon the said tramway for the carriage of timber and produce are as follows:—

Timber: 4d. per ton per mile, or any portion thereof.

#### CONDITIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

(a) That the Council shall execute the ordinary tramway licence required by the Victorian Railways Commissioners in connexion with private tramways entering station grounds.

(b) That the Board of Land and Works (Railway Construction Branch) or the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall be empowered to resume any Crown lands occupied by any portion of the tramway, if such land is required for railway purposes, without payment of any compensation.

#### CATTLE-PITS WHERE TRAMWAY PASSES THROUGH MR. BOOTH'S PROPERTY.

That three cattle-pits be constructed and maintained in good order at the dividing fences on Mr. Booth's property, and that notices be posted and kept in their places at the intersections of Mr. Booth's property, warning persons that they are liable for prosecution for trespassing on the line.

#### GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If, upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra shall forthwith proceed to restore the road along which the said route is laid out to its condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Victoria No. 1432), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby order that on and after the date of this Proclamation no grape vines nor cuttings whatever, nor any fruit trees, vegetables, or plants, shall be brought into that portion of Victoria constituting the Nyah Irrigation Area, more particularly described in the Order in Council dated 10th May, 1910, and appearing in the *Government Gazette* of 18th May, 1910, from any other part of Victoria, save and except upon written permit of some officer authorized generally or in any particular case to give permits, or a permit by the Minister of Agriculture for the time being, nor, unless such grape vines, cuttings, or fruit trees, plants, or vegetables be, subsequently to the granting of such permits or permit, fumigated upon arrival at Nyah, under the supervision of an officer appointed for that purpose by the Minister of Agriculture: Provided, nevertheless, in the case of fruit trees, plants, or vegetables, if the same be accompanied by a certificate certifying that the same have been fumigated and are free from disease, then and in such case fumigation of such fruit trees, plants, or vegetables, on arrival at Nyah, shall not be necessary: And I do hereby absolutely prohibit the bringing of second-hand fruit cases into that portion of Victoria constituting the Nyah Irrigation Area aforesaid.
