ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller.
Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George: Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

T. THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million eight hundred and eighty-five thousand six hundred and fourteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and eleven and One thousand nine hundred and twelve."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hun-dred and eleven, and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.

FARM ALLOTMENTS IN THE NERRIN NERRIN ESTATE AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE.

No conditional purchase lease of a Farm Allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent, of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent, before the end of the sixth year.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired on payment of the balance of purchase money.

The amount of deposit (less £1.5%) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Surings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

A Regulation of the City of South Melbourne, made under Section 1 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1903, adopted by the Council by By-law No. 108, and numbered 167, for the purpose of regulating bathing within the city.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

BATHING PLACES.

1. No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing in any part of the city except at the following places, which are hereby set apart as bathing places, viz.:—

(a) That part of the foreshore of Hobson's Bay commencing at a point at the centre of Fraser-street north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point distant roo vards south-easterly from the south-eastern boundary of the Middle

from the south-eastern boundary of the Middle Park Baths.

(b) From a point roo yards north-westerly from the western side of the Middle Park Baths along the shores of Hobson's Bay north-westerly to a point distant south-easterly from the cast side of Kerferd-road Pier 100 yards.

(c) From a point distant 100 yards north-westerly from the north-western boundary of Stubbs's Gentlemen's Baths north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point 100 yards distant south-easterly from the south-eastern side of the Pickles-street Drainage Pier.

(d) At all other places within the city bathing is prohibited except in the baths permanently provided for that purpose, namely, Stubbs's Gentlemen's Baths, The Tramway Baths, Stubbs's Hot Saltwater Baths, Stubbs's Ladies' Baths, and the Middle Park Baths.

TIME.

2. No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of 2. No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing at any of the places set apart by the Council, and other than those permanently provided as aforesaid, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m., and halfpast Ten p.m. and Five a.m. on each day of the week. Sundays, Xmas Days, and Good Fridays excepted. On Sundays, Xmas Days, and Good Fridays excepted. On Sundays, the Sundays are constantly after Ten o'clock in the morning. This paragraph or section shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing after Ten o'clock in the morning. This paragraph or section shall not apply to persons under the age of 12 years.

DRESS.

3. No person shall bathe unless dressed in a Canadian bathing costume, with kilt, which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knee. So as to observe proper decency, such costume to be similar to the sample on view at the Town Hall, South Melbourne.

No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the beach or sea-shore, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing-place.

No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

view.

4. No male over the age of 12 years shall trespass on any part of the beach, or any dressing-shed reserved for the use of females, and no female over the age of 12 years shall trespass on any part of the beach or dressing-shed reserved for males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in cases of accident.

5. No person shall play games in, loiter, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, disfigure, or write upon any of the dressing-sheds or enclosures set apart by the Council.

6. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or upon any part of the beach, foreshores, or water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purposes. purpos

7. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal upon or along any part of the sea-shore at any other than a walking pace.

BATHING HORSES, ETC.

8. Bathing of horses or other animals is prohibited within the limits of the City of South Melbourne, except on that part of the foreshore between the Pickles-street Drainage Pier and a point 75 yards distant south-east

This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of South Melbourne, which is on the foreshore of Hobson's Bay, and from the building line on the north-east side of Beaconsfield-parade to within 300 vards seawards of the boundary of the city, as set forth in the said Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1903.
