NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20

scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

- (b) Reduction of traverses; computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such



Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

#### REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

#### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 169 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), doth by this Order rescind all previous regulations affecting the issue of Certificates of Competency by the Municipal Surveyors Board, and in lieu thereof His Excellency doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY BY THE MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.

1. Examinations of candidates for certificates of competency will be held in the months of February, June, and October in each year, commencing at Ten a.m. on the second Tuesday of such months unless adjourned by or on behalf of the Board. Each examination shall be held at such place in Melbourne as the Board may from time to time appoint.

2. Every candidate must be in attendance at the examination-room punctually at the appointed time, and in the event of an adjournment, at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward to the Secretary of the Board fourteen (14) clear days at least before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself, notice in writing of such intention, with satisfactory documentary evidence of having complied with one of the following conditions:—

- (a) Of having completed articles of indenture for a period of not less than three (3) years under some practising civil engineer.
- (b) Of having had three (3) years' experience in designing or executing civil engineering works.

Each candidate must submit a detailed statement of the nature and extent of the work on which he has been engaged.

4. A certificate will not be issued to any candidate until he has attained the age of twenty-three (23) years, and satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, as to respectability of character. No person will be eligible for examination who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Every candidate will be required to pay to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £3 3s. at least one week before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself.

6. The examination will occupy such times as the Board may from time to time direct.

7. Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted to use any ordinary manual of reference or book of tables, which he may bring with him into the examination-room, but will not be permitted to leave the room during the examination.

8. Any candidate receiving assistance during the examination will be disqualified.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination will be examined in the following subjects:—

#### I.—Surveying.

Principles of construction, adjustment, and use of the several instruments used in surveying.

Topographical surveying.

Leveling.

Engineering trial surveys.

Permanent engineering surveys and setting out works. Measurement of earthwork, masonry and brickwork, timber work, and iron work.

Plotting and drawing plans and sections.

Calculations connected with the foregoing.

#### II.—Principles of Engineering Construction.

General principles of statics and dynamics.

Strength of materials, co-efficients of strength.

Strength of beams, columns, and arches.

Factors of safety in strength and in stability.

Production and transmission of stresses and strains in structures.

Special structures—in stone-masonry, brickwork, concrete, carpentry, cast and wrought iron or steel, combined structures, reinforced structures.

#### III.—Drainage and Sanitary Engineering.

Discharge from watersheds, in relation to drainage, area, and rainfall.

Flow of water in open channels, in pipes and closed conduits, through orifices, and over weirs.

Determination of water-ways for bridges and culverts.

Treatment and disposal of sewage.

*IV.—Road and Street Engineering.*

- Location and grading of roads.
- Laying out of town streets as to convenience of traffic and facilities for drainage.
- Construction, maintenance, and cleansing of roads and streets.
- Design of bridges and culverts in masonry, timber, iron, or steel.
- Revetments and retaining walls in masonry and timber.

10. Any candidate who has passed the examination prescribed shall be entitled to and shall receive the Board's "Certificate of Competency" as a Municipal Surveyor.

11. Any holder of a certificate of competency issued prior to 6th August, 1903, may obtain an amended certificate of competency. When making application for such amended certificate, the certificate previously issued must be returned, accompanied by a fee of half-a-guinea (ros. 6d.).

12. Every applicant for a certificate of competency must legibly give his name in full and postal address, in the margin of his letter of application, which should be addressed to—

And the Honorable William Haslam Edgar, His Majesty's Acting Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification, without examination, as follows:—

- (a) To any holder of a certificate of qualification as municipal engineer granted after examination by the examining committee appointed under the *Local Government Act 1906* of New South Wales.
- (b) To any corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by a municipal surveyor or engineer.
- (c) To any graduate who holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*), who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by a municipal surveyor or engineer.

2. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification after partial examination as follows:—

- (a) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work, and holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*) on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering."
- (b) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work, and holds the Certificate of Engineer of Water Supply granted after examination by the Board of Examiners appointed under the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering."
- (c) To any applicant who has had two (2) years' practical experience in civil engineering work, and holds the Certificate of Land Surveyor granted after examination by the Board of Examiners for land surveyors of any Australian State or of the Dominion of New Zealand, or of Mining Surveyor granted after examination by the Mining Surveyors Board of Victoria on passing the Board's examination in "Principles of Engineering Construction," and in "Drainage and Sanitary Engineering," and in "Road and Street Engineering."

3. On each certificate of qualification shall be stated—  
(a) the qualification in respect of which it is issued;  
(b) whether it is granted without examination, or, if after partial examination, the subjects in which the applicant was examined.

4. In all cases an applicant must submit satisfactory documentary evidence in detail as to his experience, and satisfy the Board that the rights conferred by the certificate, diploma, or membership in virtue of which he makes his application have not been cancelled or suspended.

5. A certificate will not issue to any applicant until he has satisfied the Board that he has attained the age of twenty-three (23) years, and satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, as to respectability of character. No person will be eligible who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS FOR THE

In the case of carcasses or meat branded by or under the direction of a Meat Inspector of the Geelong City Council the letters of the brand shall be G C C.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *Health Act* 1890 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the parish of Cranbourne within the boundaries herein described, that is to say:—

Starting at Sladen-street; thence northerly by a centre line along Cameron-street and Lecky's-road to a point at the north-east corner of allotment 12; thence westerly by a centre line along Martin's-road to the main Bass to Melbourne road; thence by a centre line on the northern boundary of allotments 9 and 10 to a point at the north-west corner of allotment 9; thence southerly by the parish boundary of Cranbourne and Lyndhurst to a point at the north-west corner of allotment 17; thence easterly along allotment 17 on its northern boundary to a point at the main Bass to Melbourne road at north-east angle of allotment 17; and thence northerly along the centre line of said road to a point at the north-east angle of allotment 18; and thence northerly along the centre line of a one-chain Government road to the starting point shall be included in the area to which the provisions of this By-law apply.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied, and kept supplied, with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by steam or boiling water, and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

#### SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

##### BY-LAW NO. 21.

**I**N pursuance of all or any of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the Shire of Dandenong, that is to say: Commencing over the bridge over the Dandenong Creek on Hammond-road; thence along Hammond-road to Kirkham-road; thence along Kirkham-road to Frankston-road; thence along Frankston-road to the main road in a direct line to the Dandenong Creek; thence along the Dandenong Creek to Kidd's-road; thence along Kidd's-road to Ross-street; thence by Ross-street to King-street; thence by King-street to Walker's-road; thence by Walker's-road to Herbert-street; thence by Herbert-street to Henty-street; thence by Henty-street to main Dandenong-road; thence by the main Dandenong-road to Potter-street; thence by Potter-street in a straight line to the Gippsland railway line; thence by the said railway line to Hammond's-road; thence by Hammond's-road to the starting point.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any house or premises within the aforesaid area or portions of the said Shire, and to which house or premises this By-law is applicable, shall construct, or cause to be constructed thereon, a proper privy in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public house, hotel, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house shall be paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be prepared and permitted to be used for the double-pan service herein provided for.

4. The Council shall cause every closet and privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

5. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a close-fitting lid, and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place, and the night-soil removed rendered inoffensive.

6. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

7. The occupier or person as aforesaid shall not contract for the providing of pans for or removal of night-soil from such premises except such supply and removal be in accordance with this By-law.

8. No occupier or such person as aforesaid shall use a closet pan for depositing any yard or house rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

9. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other efficient deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make an annual charge on each occupier or other person as aforesaid for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. This By-law shall not apply or be deemed applicable to any holding within the said area which, according to the Rate Book of the Shire of Dandenong, exceeds (5) acres in area, and as to which the Health Officer or Sanitary Inspector of the said Shire shall, in writing, have certified in manner hereinafter appearing that in his opinion such holding need not be included in the operation of the said By-law. The owner or occupier of such a holding may at any time, at his or her own expense, apply for and obtain (if thought fit) such a certificate, and shall pay all expense caused to the Shire or the Council thereby, and such certificate shall be directed and sent to the Secretary of the said Shire by the Health Officer or Sanitary Inspector, and shall not have any effect until so sent.

12. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty at the discretion of the Court or Justices, either of Five pounds for every such breach, or Two pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such power.

This By-law and the unrepealed portions of the said By-law No. 18 shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the Shire of Dandenong, known as the Carrum District, or part of that district: Commencing at the north-west corner of Crown allotment 121, parish of Lyndhurst; thence along the Mordialloc Creek to the intersection of the drain running along the east boundaries of Crown allotments 135 to 101 in the said parish; thence to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 91; thence westerly by the Eel Race-road to the Frankston-road; thence to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 1A; thence south-westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and a straight line to Port Phillip Bay; thence along Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

3. After the words "the said Shire," in the third line of clause No. 4 of the said By-law No. 18, shall be inserted or deemed to be inserted the following words:— "and to which house or premises this By-law is applicable."

4. This By-law and the said By-law No. 18 shall not apply or be deemed applicable to any holding within the said area which, according to the rate-book of the Shire Council of Dandenong, exceeds 5 acres in area, and as to which the Health Officer or Sanitary Inspector of the said shire shall in writing have certified in manner hereinafter appearing, that in his opinion such holding need not be included in the operation of the said By-law. The owner or occupier of such a holding may at any time at his or her own expense apply for and obtain (if thought fit) such a certificate, and shall pay all expense caused to the shire or the council thereby, and such certificate shall be directed and sent to the Secretary of the said shire by the Health Officer or Sanitary Inspector, and shall not have any effect until so sent.

#### SHIRE OF MILDURA.

A By-law of the Shire of Mildura made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and section 196 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered twenty-one, for the construction of privies, disposal of night-soil, removal of refuse, and inspections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed within the limits of Block D and Williamstown any privy, except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor thereof to be at no point less than 6 inches above the adjoining ground, so that there is a clear air-space of 6 inches under the floor, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide means of ventilation, and also shall be so constructed that the pan, when placed under the seat, can be readily adjusted to receive all deposits, and galvanized iron lips shall be provided and placed under the seats in front of the openings of same to conduct all urine into the pan, and further each building shall be constructed with the requisite apparatus for the supply of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents of the pan, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and the contents thereof for emptying and cleansing the same.

2. Every privy attached to any school, licensed club, public house, coffee palace, or common lodging-house, and every public privy and every privy attached to any factory or work-room within the municipal district shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

3. No privy shall be allowed to be constructed on either the avenue or street frontage of any property within the municipal district.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficiently to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

5. No person shall, within the limit of Block D and Williamstown, empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or any place for the reception of night-soil, without a licence from the local authority having first been obtained.

6. Individual householders shall not contract for removal of night-soil or other refuse or offensive matter except in accordance with the By-laws and Regulations of the Shire Council.

7. Night-soil and other refuse or offensive matter shall only be deposited at the places set apart by the said Council for those purposes, except by special permission of the said Council, and subject to such conditions as shall be determined on by the said Council when granting permission.

8. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health.

9. The local authority or any justice may authorize and depute any inspector, peace officer, or constable from time to time to visit and inspect any butchers' shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or any house, outbuilding, lane, alley, or other place, for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed, and such person so authorized shall, if it appear that any accumulation of manure, dung, offal, filth, or other unwholesome or noxious matter whatsoever ought to be removed, give notice to the person to whom the same belongs, or to the occupier of the premises whereon it exists; to remove the same, and if, at the expiration of four days' notice, the same be not complied with, the manure, dung, offal, soil, filth, or other matter referred to shall be removed by such constable, or inspector, or other peace officer at the expense of the person to whom such notice was given, and such expense may be recovered in the manner provided for the recovery of such expenses by any Act.

10. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a covered box, or some other covered receptacle, for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

11. Any person committing any breach of this By-law shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each and every breach thereof.

12. Sections 2, 3, and 9 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district. Save as aforesaid this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district only, that is to say, that part of the Shire known as Block D and Williamstown.

13. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that Tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the *Tramways Act 1890* was amended by an Act No. 1218, extending the powers contained in the *Tramways Act 1890* so as to allow of Tramways being constructed within the Cities of Prahran and St. Kilda: And whereas the Councils of the Municipalities of the Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Malvern, and the Town of Caulfield have made an application under the common seals of the said Municipalities in accordance with the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a Tramway in the Municipal Districts of the Municipalities of the said Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Malvern, and the Town of Caulfield: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Councils of the said Municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said Councils to make the said application in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Councils of the Municipalities of the Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Malvern, and the Town of Caulfield shall be and are hereby authorized to construct a Tramway in the Municipal Districts of the Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Malvern, and the Town of Caulfield.

## ROUTE.

That the route of the said Tramway shall be as follows—Commencing at the eastern building alignment of Chapel-street; thence easterly along Dandenong-road to the intersection of Dandenong-road and Glenferrie-road.

## GAUGE.

That the gauge of such Tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said Tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 13 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

## MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said Tramway shall be electricity.

## MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said Tramway with hand-brake equipments on the cars shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power, brakes, and life guards the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

## TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the Tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of twelve months from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the Tramway.

## TRAFFIC.

That the Tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and their luggage only.

## NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said Tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such Tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Councils of the said Municipalities.

## STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the Tramway as may be convenient and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

## TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said Tramway shall be the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

- (a) For the section between Chapel-street and Orrong-road, or any part thereof, and *vice versa*, 1d.
- (b) For the section between Orrong-road and Glenferrie-road, or any part thereof, and *vice versa*, 1d.
- For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), *One penny* for one or both sections.
- (c) For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity not exceeding 36 persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of Six a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (d) For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity exceeding 36 persons, 2s. per car mile between Six a.m. and midnight, and 3s. per car mile after midnight.

The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot till its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 is. may be made for the hiring of any special car for use after midnight, and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey, for which such special car is hired.

That nothing hereinbefore contained shall, however, prevent the Councils from entering into any arrangement with the Malvern City Council, to travel over a portion of the Tramway, authorized by Order in Council, dated the 6th July, 1908, or the authority in whom the powers conferred by the Order in Council shall for the time being have become vested whereby section B, of the said Tramway may be extended from the intersection of Dandenong and Glenferrie roads northerly along Glenferrie-road to Wattle-tree-road, and that the charge to be made over the whole or part of such extended section may be but shall not exceed *One penny*, or *vice versa*, or from establishing a sectional fare of *One penny* from Kopyong-road *via* Dandenong and Glenferrie roads to the Malvern Town Hall, and *vice versa*.

COMBINED FARES OVER LINE OF TRAMWAY AUTHORIZED BY THIS ORDER AND LINES OF TRAMWAY IN THE CITIES OF PRAHRAN AND MALVERN, AUTHORIZED BY ORDERS IN COUNCIL DATED, 6TH, JULY, 1908.

Nothing hereinbefore contained shall prevent the Councils from entering into any arrangement with the Councils of the Cities of Prahran and Malvern or the authority in whom the powers conferred by the Orders in Council hereinafter mentioned are for the time being vested, having for its object and conferring the right to charge for a through continuous trip together over the whole or some part of the Tramway of the Councils, and also for the whole or some part of any Tramway or Tramways of the Councils of the Municipalities of Prahran and Malvern authorized by Orders in Council, dated, 6th July, 1908, the following entire fares:—

For a through continuous trip over any three continuous sections of which one is on the Tramway of the Councils and two are on the Tramways of the Councils of the Municipalities of Prahran and Malvern, authorized by Order in Council dated 6th July, 1908, or *vice versa*, *Two pence*, except in the case of children under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), for whom the fare shall be *One penny*, each.

For a through continuous trip over the whole of the sections of the Tramway authorized by this Order and the Tramways of the Municipalities of the Cities of Prahran and Malvern authorized by Orders in Council dated 6th July, 1908, *Fourpence*, except in the case of children under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), for whom the fare shall be *Two-pence*.

**TRACK, ETC., ON RAILWAY BRIDGES TO BE MAINTAINED BY COUNCILS.**

All costs and expenses of and incidental to the laying and maintaining of the tram track on and over the Railway Bridge in Dandenong-road, Windsor, and the approaches to the same (including the cost of any necessary structural alterations), shall be paid and borne by the Councils, as shall also, as hitherto, be all costs and expenses of and incidental to the maintaining of the public highway and paths and channels on such bridge and its approaches.

**COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES AT WINDSOR INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.**

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires at Dandenong-road, Windsor, in consequence of the introduction of a high tension or other electrical current in connexion with the Tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Councils.

**ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAY COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.**

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said Tramway which would, if placed above ground, cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or be in a position likely, if special precautions are not taken, to prejudicially affect telegraphic or telephonic communications on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners or of prejudicially affecting or interfering either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

**FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.**

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Councils from entering into any arrangement with the Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both Tramway and Railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both Tramway and Railway.

**COUNCILS NOT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN ARRANGEMENTS WITH MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.**

It is a condition of this Order that the Council shall not except as hereinafter provided by sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this condition enter into any arrangement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the Tramways now controlled by that company, nor be a party, directly or indirectly, to any arrangement whereby through passengers, that is, passengers travelling over both the Tramway now so controlled as aforesaid (hereinafter called the "Melbourne Tramway") and the Councils' Tramway, may travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both Tramways, nor shall the Councils sell Melbourne Tramway tickets or furnish passengers intending to travel by the Melbourne Tramway with transfer tickets or any means of identification or in any way assist or facilitate passengers travelling over both Tramways to travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both Tramways.

**(a) AND (b).**

(a) In respect of passengers from the Councils' Tramway travelling over the whole or any part of the Melbourne Tramway between High-street and Carlisle-street, or between High-street and St. Kilda by way of Chapel, Wellington, and Fitzroy streets, the Esplanade, and Acland-street to the terminus of the Melbourne Tramway on the last-named street, or by way of Chapel and Wellington streets and the Brighton-road to the tramway terminus at Milton-street, or between High-street and St. Kilda by way of the St. Kilda and Brighton roads to the tramway terminus at Milton-street, or by way of the St. Kilda-road, Fitzroy-street, the Esplanade, and Acland-street to the tramway terminus in the last-named street, or *vice versa*.

(b) That for the carriage over that part of the Melbourne Tramway along Chapel-street and the Toorak-road between Dandenong-road and Punt-road of passengers making a continuous trip over the whole or any of the

said part of the Melbourne Tramway, and also over the whole or any part of the Councils' Tramway, the Council may arrange with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the Tramways now controlled by such company, for a fare of not less than One penny, except in the case of children under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), for whom the Councils may arrange with the said company for a fare of not less than One halfpenny.

Provided that this exception (b) shall only continue and be of effect so long as the fare charged by the said company for carriage over its Tramway between the Punt-road and the Melbourne Hospital along the Toorak-road, Park-street, the Domain-road, the St. Kilda-road, and Swanston-street, or any part of the said Tramway is not less than Twopence, whether by tickets or otherwise, and in the case of children under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), for whom the fare is not less than One penny, whether by tickets or otherwise.

**COUNCILS NOT TO RUN OVER LINES CONTROLLED BY MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.**

It is a further condition of this Order that the Council shall not, except as hereinafter provided by sub-clause (a) of this condition, acquire the right to run, nor shall it run any of its cars or other vehicles on or along any or any part of the lines now controlled by the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or on or along any extension of any of such lines, or any part of the same, nor give a better service in connexion with the trams of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited than the service connecting with the trains of the Commissioners, nor shall the Councils permit the cars or other vehicles of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the Tramways now controlled by that company, to run over the Tramways of the Councils, nor shall such cars be so run.

(a) In respect of cars from the Councils' Tramway travelling over the whole of any part of the Melbourne Tramway between High-street and Carlisle-street, or between High-street and St. Kilda by way of Chapel, Wellington, and Fitzroy streets, the Esplanade, and Acland-street to the terminus of the Melbourne Tramway on the last-named street, or by way of Chapel and Wellington streets and the Brighton-road to the tramway terminus at Milton-street, or *vice versa*.

**TRAMWAY WHERE IT CROSSES THE RAILWAY LINE.**

That the Tramway upon so much of the route as crosses by means of the overhead bridge in Dandenong-road, Windsor, the Railway Lines from Melbourne to Sandringham shall be constructed in such manner as may be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works to meet railway requirements.

**GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.**

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said Municipalities of the Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Malvern, and the Town of Caulfield shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such Tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Councils of the said Municipalities finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in

this Order, the Councils of the said Municipalities shall take upon themselves all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable William Haslam Edgar, His Majesty's Acting Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. That there shall be excised from the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply District those portions of the same set out and described in the First Schedule hereto, which portions, as on and from the first day of July, 1911, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.
2. That there shall be excised from the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District those portions of the same set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, which portions, as on and from the first day of July, 1911, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.
3. That there shall be excised from the Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply District those portions of the same set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto, which portions as on and from the first day of July, 1911, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply District.*

Portions Excised.

Those portions comprised within the following boundaries, viz. :—

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

1. That the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply District and the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply District be united so as to form one district (and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1911, the said districts shall be deemed to be so united), to be known as Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply District, and that the boundaries of the said Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be those set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.
2. That the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District be subdivided, and that two Irrigation and Water Supply Districts be constituted thereout, to be known respectively as Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District and Gannawarra Irrigation and Water Supply District; and that the boundaries of the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District (hereby constituted) shall be those set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto; and that the boundaries of the said Gannawarra Irrigation and Water Supply District (hereby constituted), shall be those set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto:—

(2) That the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission shall make an entry in its books of account transferring the capital sums standing at the debit of each of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Districts hereby united to the debit of the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District, and such debit shall state the works in respect of which it is made.

(3) That all rates, interest thereon, and all charges on any lands and tenements in respect of any rates or interest thereon, and all other charges and sums due or payable to or leviable by the said Commission in respect of lands and tenements within the said Irrigation and Water Supply Districts hereby united so as to form the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be vested in, enforced by, paid to, and received, levied, and recovered by the said Commission as if the same had been made by and become due to the said Commission in respect of lands and tenements within the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District.

(4) That the valuations made by authority of the said Commission for the purpose of making and levying rates in respect of the lands and tenements within the said Irrigation and Water Supply Districts hereby united shall, as on and from the 1st day of July, 1911, and until a new valuation is made by authority of the Commission, be the valuations made by the said Commission in respect of the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District.

(5) That all interests and obligations of the said Commission in respect of the Irrigation and Water Supply Districts hereby united in regard to any property, income, assets, rights, and liabilities shall be deemed, as on and from the 1st day of July, 1911, to apply to the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District.

(6) That the quantities of water assigned to the said Boort Irrigation and Water Supply District, the source from which, and the seasons at which such quantities shall be received, shall be as follow:—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 21st day of July, 1911, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of North Ovens, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said Shire, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said Shire.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.  
 Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Shire of North Ovens."

Section 14 shall apply, omitting the words "pursuant to the Constitution Acts Amendment Acts" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "together" in the twenty-sixth line down to the word "such" in the twenty-ninth line; omitting the words "said sections" in the thirtieth line, substituting therefor the words "*Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the thirty-ninth line down to the end of the section, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 16 shall apply, omitting the word "posted" in the first line, and substituting therefor the words "sent through the post"; omitting all the words after the word "shall" in the second line down to the word "every" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the words "have the necessary postage thereon prepaid."

#### REGULATIONS UNDER THE VEGETATION DISEASES ACTS REGARDING THE TRANSFER OR REMOVAL WITHIN VICTORIA OF POTATOES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of July, 1911.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the Vegetation Diseases Acts to make regulations regarding the transfer or removal within Victoria of any particular kind of tree, plant, or vegetable likely in the opinion of the Governor in Council to spread any disease or insect: And whereas the Governor in Council is of opinion that the potato is a vegetable likely to spread disease: And whereas the Governor in Council has by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* prohibited, subject to Regulations, the bringing of potatoes into any portion of Victoria from certain other parts of Victoria specified in such Proclamation, and hereinafter (together with any further parts of Victoria which may hereafter be likewise proclaimed) referred to as "Potato Inspection Districts": Now the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made under the said Act on the 13th day of January, 1911, are hereby repealed.

#### Interpretation.

2. For the purposes of these Regulations—  
 "Inspector" means an inspector appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Vegetation Diseases Acts.

"Registered Mark" means any mark registered with and approved by the Department of Agriculture.

#### Concerning Potato Inspection Districts.

3. No person shall remove or cause to be removed any potatoes from any Potato Inspection District by rail or boat or otherwise unless—

(a) such potatoes shall have been, not more than four days prior to such removal, examined by the Inspector and found to the best of his knowledge and belief to be clean, free from Irish Blight (*Phytophthora infestans*), and reasonably free from other diseases of potatoes proclaimed under section 2, Act 1432;

(b) such potatoes are contained in bags, cases, or packages determined by the Inspector as sound, suitable, and clean;

- (c) the bags, cases, or packages in which such potatoes are contained shall be legibly branded or stamped with the name and address (or registered mark) of the actual grower of such potatoes, and in the case of previously-used bags, cases, or packages, all other names and marks (if any) shall have been effectively obliterated; and
- (d) a "Transport Permit" in the form of Schedule A hereto shall have been issued in respect of such potatoes by the Inspector and to the proper railway or boat official for attachment to the waybill or bill of lading as authority for the transport of such potatoes.

*Concerning Transfers within Potato Inspection Districts.*

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations an Inspector may examine any potatoes consigned from any place within any Potato Inspection District to any city or town situated within such district, and provided that all the conditions of these Regulations are complied with, may issue a "Removal Permit" as herein-under provided in respect of such potatoes, without which such removal of such potatoes will constitute an offence under these Regulations.

*Concerning other than Potato Inspection Districts.*

5. In other than Potato Inspection Districts any Inspector, when authorized by the Minister of Agriculture, may examine any potatoes at any railway station, wharf, warehouse, store, market, or other place.

6. No person to whom any potatoes shall be consigned from any part of Victoria (other than a "Potato Inspection District") to any other part of Victoria within ten miles of any place where an Inspector shall be stationed, shall remove any such potatoes from any railway station or wharf, warehouse, store, market, or other place unless—

- (a) such potatoes shall have been, not more than four days prior to such removal, examined by the Inspector, and found to the best of his knowledge and belief to be clean, free from Irish Blight (*Phytophthora infestans*), and reasonably free from other diseases of potatoes proclaimed under section 2, Act 1432;
- (b) such potatoes are contained in bags, cases, or packages determined by the Inspector as sound, suitable, and clean.
- (c) the bags, cases, or packages in which such potatoes are contained shall be legibly branded or stamped with the name and address (or registered mark) of the actual grower of such potatoes, and in the case of previously-used bags, cases, or packages, all other names and marks (if any) shall have been effectively obliterated; and
- (d) a "Removal Permit" in the form of Schedule B shall have been issued in respect of such potatoes.

*Sorting.*

7. Potatoes found upon examination by an Inspector to comprise a proportion of potatoes which are diseased shall be removed by the owner or consignee or agent of either to a place approved by the Inspector, which may be the owner's store, and there sorted under his supervision, and dealt with under the following conditions, viz. :—

- (a) When sorted, all potatoes which are free from disease may be repacked in bags, cases, or packages determined as sound, suitable, and clean, by the Inspector, who may then issue for such potatoes a "Removal Permit" in the form in Schedule B.
- (b) After sorting, all diseased potatoes shall be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Inspector may direct.
- (c) All expenses in connexion with the supervision, handling, sorting, cartage, and destruction of such potatoes shall be paid by the owner or consignee or agent of either.

*Charges.*

8. The charge for inspection shall be Sixpence per ton or fraction of a ton, and shall be paid in respect to each lot or consignment prior to the issue of a "Transport Permit" or "Removal Permit," as the case may be; except in cases where the owner or consignee shall have lodged a deposit in money or approved guarantee to cover all consignments to be submitted during a period of one month, when and in such cases the charge shall be calculated in respect of the aggregate tonnage of potatoes submitted for inspection during any one month until the last day of such month.

9. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of or who shall fail to comply with these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty for the first offence not exceeding One pound, and for any subsequent offence not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. 1893) it is enacted that, at the request of the council of any municipal district, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that the provisions of Part XXII. of the said Act shall apply to and be of full force and effect in such district or portion of such district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation, not being within six months from the date of such Proclamation; and that, except in pursuance of a Proclamation under the said section, the said Part shall not have any force or effect in any municipal district: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in compliance with requests from the Councils of the Municipalities named hereunder, do by this my Proclamation declare that the provisions of Part XXII. of the Act aforesaid shall apply to and be of full force and effect in each of such municipalities from and after the dates hereunder set forth opposite the names of such municipalities respectively, that is to say:—

PROHIBITION OF TRANSFER OF POTATOES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF VICTORIA INTO OTHER PORTIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order that on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall, except subject to Regulations, be taken or conveyed into any other portion of Victoria from those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the hereinafter specified municipalities or groups of municipalities which shall constitute and be known as "Potato Inspection Districts," that is to say:—

1. The shires of Warrnambool and Belfast, the town of Warrnambool, and the boroughs of Port Fairy and Koroit shall constitute and be known as "the Warrnambool Potato Inspection District."
2. The shires of Ballarat, Ballan, Bungaree, Buninyong, and Creswick, the boroughs of Buninyong and Sebastopol, the town of Ballarat East, and the city of Ballarat shall constitute and be known as "the Ballarat Potato Inspection District."
3. The shires of Glenelg, Dundas, Wannon, and Portland, and the boroughs of Hamilton and Portland shall constitute and be known as "the Hamilton Potato Inspection District."
4. The shires of Metcalfe, Kyneton, Newham, Glenlyon, Mount Franklin, Newstead, Mount Alexander, and Maldon, the boroughs of Daylesford, Malmsbury, Castlemaine, and Chewton shall constitute and be known as "the Daylesford Potato Inspection District."
5. The shires of Yarrowonga, Rutherglen, Chiltern, Wodonga, Yackandandah, Bright, Oakey, Benalla, North Ovens, and Toowong, and the boroughs of Rutherglen and Wangaratta shall constitute and be known as "the Wangaratta Potato Inspection District."

No. 1962, section 58) it is enacted that where unused or unformed and unused roads intersect any land acquired by the Crown pursuant to the provisions of the aforesaid Act, and are not suitable to the subdivision of such land, such roads may, with the consent of the municipal council in the municipal district in which such roads are situate, be closed by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter may be dealt with as part of the land so acquired which they intersect: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim that the unused roads, defined in the following descriptions, be closed, that is to say:—

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated close to the Kow Plains and Murrayville Stations, on the Ouyen-Murrayville railway line, now in course of construction, and is from 8 to 36 miles north-east from Pinnaroo, and from 49 to 77 south-west from Ouyen.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor car, or motor cycle.

2. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted so as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, other machine, or other vehicle (except a tramcar), or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine to the right of such vehicle, machine, horse, or other beast of burden.

4. Any person overtaking with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot-passenger proceeding along any carriage-way, such person shall, when within a reasonable distance from and before passing such other vehicle, machine, horse, beast of burden, or foot-passenger, by sounding a bell, horn, or other loud warning contrivance, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

5. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, carriage, or horse, or other beast of burden; and where any horse or animal may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding on or driving such machine shall stop such machine and remain stationary as long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of South Melbourne.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
