ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide for the granting to the Country Fire Brigades Board of certain Land set out as a road in the Township of Healesville.”

“An Act to revoke the Proclamation as a Main Road of certain Land in the Town of Beaufort and to provide for the granting of such Land to the Country Fire Brigades Board.”

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat. He must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show to the satisfaction of the Board—

(a) That he has served during not less than four months under some authorized mining surveyor, in obtaining practical experience in the conduct of underground surveys; or, that he has been engaged for not less than twelve months in the conduct of such surveys.

(b) That he has acquired a knowledge of the methods and appliances used in mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) *Mining Surveying*.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) *Practical Mining*.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.

(c) *Hydraulic Engineering*.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) *Geology*.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply in Victoria will be exempt from the examination required by sub-clause (c) of Regulation 4. STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY
COMMISSION.BY-LAW NO. 189.—BIRCHIP URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE
BIRCHIP WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Birchip Urban District within the Birchip Waterworks District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work, the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, Seven shillings;

For $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. meter, Eight shillings;

For any meter of larger size than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned

to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the Pumping Station of the Commission at Birchip; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be water-tight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. 7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For ½-in. meter, Seven shillings;

For ¾-in. meter, Eight shillings;

For any meter of larger size than ¾ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For ½-in. meter, Seven shillings;

For ¾-in. meter, Eight shillings;

For any meter of larger size than ¾ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register,

or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the Pumping Station of the Commission at Rupanyup; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be water-tight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water, supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Surveyors Board appointed under the *Land Surveyors Act 1895* hereby gives notice that the next examination will commence on Monday, 18th September, 1911.

All applications from intending candidates must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 4th September, 1911.

Regulations for the examination of Land Surveyors are published hereunder.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Date.)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not

passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order repeal Chapter V. of the Regulations made on the fourteenth day of February, 1911, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

CHAPTER V.—(a) LIMITING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF HOURS IN THE WEEK DURING WHICH ALL CARTERS AND CARRIERS MAY BE EMPLOYED IN THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICTS, AND IN ALL CITIES AND TOWNS; (b) PROVIDING FOR A WEEKLY HALF-HOLIDAY FOR ALL SUCH PERSONS (OTHER THAN THOSE EMPLOYED IN DELIVERING BREAD, MEAT, AND MILK).

1. No person shall be employed in carrying or delivering any goods, wares, merchandise, or materials whatsoever or in assisting in such work for more than sixty hours (excluding meal-times) in any week except with the written consent of the Chief Inspector of Factories, when such hours may be not more than seventy (excluding meal-times), provided that the total number of weeks in any year in which such permission may be granted shall not exceed six.

2. Every such carter or person assisting (other than those employed in delivering bread, meat, and milk) shall have and take a half-holiday in each and every week as follows:—

(1) In the Metropolitan District and in all Cities and Towns outside the Metropolitan District where the material to be carried or delivered is—

perishable articles of human food, parcels of laundry-work, or aerated waters or cordials or ice, from the first day of November in any year to the thirty-first day of March next following,

and in cases where the Chief Inspector of Factories has given any written consent to work before or after the legal hours, such half-holiday may be had and taken on any day other than Sunday, either from Midnight till Two p.m. of the following day, or from Two p.m. onwards.

(2) In all other cases—

(a) in the Metropolitan District from Two p.m. on Saturday,

(b) in Cities and Towns outside the Metropolitan District from Two p.m. on the usual local half-holiday.

And the Honorable William Alexander Watt, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1093), and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation, for the purpose of providing for the more effectual protection and improvement of fish in the Goulburn River and waters connected therewith, revoke the Proclamation of the thirtieth day of August, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th September, 1910, page 4116, re Prohibition of Fishing at the Goulburn Weir, and do also prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Goulburn River for a distance of a quarter of a mile below the Goulburn Weir, a State Work of Water Supply between Nagambie and Murchison, from the first day of August to the thirtieth day of November in each year.
