REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for ex-(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
 (b) An examination fee of £2 25., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

(a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

 (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

 (c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, planetable, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuta; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 25.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, he equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.
- 16. On and after March, 1913 (evcept as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not

passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination

THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC EDUCATION.

REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905, and by section 6, sub-section (2), and section 10, sub-section (5), of the Education Act 1910 upon the Council of Public Education, enabling the Council to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) for regulating the granting by the Council of certificates of registration of teachers or of schools and the form of such certificates; providing for the keeping of the registers and mode of registering and making additions and revisions: for or relating to the time and place of meetings of the Registration Committee and the management and conduct of business thereat, and generally for carrying these Acts into effect," the Council doth hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations:—

VIII .- Register of Teachers.

Section 2 of Regulation VIII.—Register of Teachers is hereby amended to read as follows:—

2. All entries to be made in the Register of Teachers, other than those made under section 7 below, shall first be authorized by the Registration Committee at a meeting, and initialed by the member elected to act as Chairman of the Registration Committee at such meeting.

IX.—Register of Schools.

Section 2 of Regulation IX.—Register of Schools is hereby amended to read as follows:—

2. All entries to be made in the Register of Schools shall first be authorized by the Registration Committee at a meeting, and initialed by the member elected to act of Chairman of the Registration Committee at such meeting.

XI .- Registration Committee.

- r. The Registration Committee of the Council of Public Education shall meet at the Education Office, Melbourne, at quarter past Four o'clock in the afternoon of the last Monday in each month except December and January, or at such other times as may be considered necessary by the Registration Committee. by the Registration Committee.
- 2. A quorum of the Registration Committee shall consist of not less than three members thereof.
- 3. At each meeting of the Registration Committee a member shall be elected to act as Chairman of such meeting, and the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote when there is an equal division.
- 4. The Registration Committee shall at least twice a year report to the Council of Public Education upon the operations of the Committee.

CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BY-LAW NO. 49.—REGULATIONS re FOWLYARDS AND THEIR Position

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Brunswick, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 49, that is to say:—

- (1) If, in the opinion of the Council, the removal of a fowlyard, any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling house, be possible, and be necessary for the health of any of the residents in the vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of it, or of the premises of which such fowlyard forms part, to remove or alter it so that no part thereof shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling house.

 (2) No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling
- within 25 feet of any dwelling house.

 (2) No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling house establish or construct a fowlyard, or cause one to be established or constructed, or within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowlyard without the written permission of the Council, and any such permission may, if deemed necessary, be revoked by the Council.

 (2) Every person who shall disober such an order
- deemed necessary, be revoked by the Council.

 (3) Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

- (4) This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Brunswick.

- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1911, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1912, and shall be payable on the 2nd day of October, 1911, at the offices of the Commission at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

 3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

 4. For making and levying such rates within the said

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

Advances of money to assist in effecting improvements may be granted by the Board, such advances to be repaid in half-yearly instalments extending over fifteen years, bearing interest at 5 per cent. The half-yearly payment will be at the rate of £4 15s. 7d. for every £100 advanced.

For a period of at least ten years, unless remission is given by the Agricultural Department, a minimum area of 10 acres shall be utilized for beet culture each year, the cultivation of the crop to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Department. A system of three-course rotation to be followed (i.e., the 10 acress under beet in any year shall not be put under beet again until the third year following) unless remission of this condition be approved by the Agricultural Department, and the whole resulting crop of manufacturable beet shall be supplied to the Maffra Factory, which will pay for same at a rate per ton of topped clean roots delivered at the factory, such rate to be determined by the Factory Manager from year to year during the ten years or until this condition is remitted, which may be done at any time by the Board.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

A By-law of the Shire of Nunawading, made under the provisions of section 198 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered No. 17, for Regulating and Restraining the Erection of Removed Wooden Buildings in the Shire of Nunawading.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:

- 1. No person shall remove or transport or cause to be removed or transported into any part of the Shire of Nunawading or from any one part of the Shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
- 2. Before any building or erection is removed into the Shire or from any one part of the Shire to another the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particulars:—
 - (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
 - (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
 - (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, any alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
 - (d) A specification giving particulars of the construc-tion of the existing building and of the altera-tions and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.
 - to make when the building is re-erected.

 And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the Building Surveyor shall inspect such building or erection before removal, and shall report to the Council whether in his opinion such building when removed and re-erected will be in compliance with the provisions of this By-law and the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council, or not. If the Building Surveyor certifies that such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law, then the Council shall grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the Shire, but not otherwise.
- 3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation, shall be removed or re-erected within the Shire.
- 4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the Shire, unless the same has been thoroughly funnigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner or of the Health Inspector of any Municipal Council.
- 5. No building or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling house shall be removed or re-creeted within the Shire unless the same when re-creeted shall

cover an area of 800 square feet at the least. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c.:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. red gum or jarrah spaced to 4 ft. centres and fixed on 8 in. x 8 in. x 2 in. sole plates.
 (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 in. x 1½ in. spaced not less than 18 in. apart centre to centre and properly braced.
 (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in. spaced 3 ft. centre to centre.

- (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in. spaced 3 ft. centre to centre.
 Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in. spaced 18 in. apart centre to centre on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers spaced 6 ft. apart.
 (d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.
 (e) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part tess than 12 in. above the surface of the ground.
 (f) All window sashes to be made to open and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.
 (g) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 10 ft. 6 in. between the floors and

 (h) The internal lining of walls and ccilings to be made of lath and plaster, stamped steel, or sheet asbestos preparations: matchboard lining may be retained in rooms other than the main or living rooms, but if so retained must be thoroughly cleaned down and painted with three coats of oil and white lead.

 (i) All roof coveriums to be at incombustible material.

- All timber and material which in the opinion of the unber and material which in the opinion of the Building Surveyor is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material. Such building when completed shall also comply with the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council. (The conditions of this section shall not apply to buildings to be used as stables or sheds, provided the same comply in all other respects with this By-law.)

 6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

 7. If the Building Surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving from the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may on the expiration of the time therein limited pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

 8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner
- 8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—

10. Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.
