#### THE GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 32.—A BY-LAW FOR THE MAKING AND LEVYING OF RATES FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING THE 1ST DAY OF JULY, 1911.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

(I.) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16, Twenty shillings per annum.

(II.) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16, Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation up to £300; Five pounds per centum on

the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £300 and up to £700; and Three pounds fifteen shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £700.

(III.) On lands on which there is no building, Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1911, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1912, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 9th day of September, 1911, and the 3rd day of January, 1912.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust on the 25th day of August, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and the common seal of the said Trust was hereunto affixed the 25th day of August, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the presence of—

# TRAMWAYS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE CITY OF MALVERN.—AMENDED ORDER.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 6th day of July, 1908, under the provisions of the Tramways Act No. 1148, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 15th day of July, 1908, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Malvern (now the City of Malvern) was authorized to construct tramways within the municipal district of the then Town of Malvern: And whereas the Council of the said City of Malvern has now made application (accompanied by plans and specifications numbered 16 to 22), under provisions of the *Tramways Act* 1890, to have the said Order amended by adding further plans and specifications thereto, and extending the route of the tramway in Glenferrie-road from the southern side of the Glen Iris Railway at Kooyong Station northerly to Gardiner's Creek, the northern boundary of the municipality; and the said Council having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act and the Regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by such rules, the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order of the 6th day of July, 1908.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

## EXTENSION OF ROUTE OF TRAMWAY.

That the Council of the municipality of the City of Malvern shall be and is hereby authorized to extend the route of the tramway in Glenferrie-road terminating at the south side of the Glen Iris Railway line at Kooyong Station, as authorized by the said Order in Council dated the 6th July, 1908, whereby the route of the said tramway shall be extended from the south side of the said railway line northerly to Gardiner's Creek, the northern boundary of the municipality.

## GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 16 to 22 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister for Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

## MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramways shall be electricity.

## MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway with hand-brake equipments on the cars shall be at the rate of fifteen miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power brakes and life-guards the maximum speed shall be at the rate of twenty miles per hour.

## TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of eight years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

## TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and their luggage only.

## NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said Municipality.

## STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

## TOLLS AND CHARGES.

The extension of the route of the tramway authorized by this Order shall not be deemed to extend the penny section of the tramway from the south side of the Glen Iris Railway line along Glenferrie-road to High-street, as authorized by Order in Council dated the sixth day of July, 1908, but it shall be a condition of this Order that the Council shall co-operate with the Council of the Municipality of the City of Hawthorn to charge a through fare of One penny for the section from Riversdale-road, or from each other point as may be determined to be the northern boundary of the Penny section adjoining the southern boundary of the Municipality of the City of Hawthorn, over the proposed extension to the Kooyong Railway Station, and *vice versa*.

## COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

## ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would, if placed above ground, cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or be in a position likely, if special precautions are not taken, to prejudicially affect telegraphic or telephonic communication on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

## FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into any arrangement with the Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

## COUNCIL NOT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.

It is a condition of this Order that the Council shall not enter into any arrangement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, nor be a party, directly or indirectly, to any arrangement whereby through passengers, that is, passengers travelling over both the tramway now so controlled as aforesaid (hereinafter called the "Melbourne Tramway") and the Council's tramway, may travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways, nor shall the Council sell Melbourne tramway tickets or furnish passengers intending to travel by the Melbourne tramway with transfer tickets or any means of identification, or in any way assist or facilitate passengers travelling over both tramways to travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways.

## COUNCIL NOT TO RUN OVER LINES CONTROLLED BY MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY.

It is further a condition of this Order that the Council shall not acquire the right to run, nor shall it run any of its cars or other vehicles on or along any or any part of the lines now controlled by the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or on or along any extension of any of such lines, or any part of the same, nor give a better service in connexion with the trams of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited than the service connecting with the trains of the Commissioners, nor shall the Council permit the cars or other vehicles of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, to run over the tramway of the Council, nor shall such cars be so run.

## TRAMWAY WHERE IT CROSSES THE RAILWAY LINE.

That the tramway upon so much of the route as crosses the railway line from Melbourne to Darling shall be constructed in such manner as may be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works to meet railway requirements.

## TRAMWAY TO BE SUBORDINATE TO RAILWAY SERVICE.

That the tramway where it crosses the Glen Iris Railway line shall, so far as regards its use, running, and maintenance on or across the railway line, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such regulations and orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injurious consequences which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said route crossing the railway line or incidental to its use, and the tram service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements.

## COUNCIL TO DEFRAY WHOLE COST OF PROVISION OF THE CROSSING, SIGNAL BOX, ETC.

That the Council shall defray the whole cost of the provision of the crossing, signal box, interlocking, catch points, and other safety appliances at the crossing of the tramway over the Glen Iris Railway at Glenferrie-road.

## MAINTENANCE AND UPKEEP OF CROSSING, SIGNAL BOX, ETC.

That the Council shall reimburse the Railways Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, signal box, interlocking, catch points, and other safety appliances.

## COUNCIL TO PAY HALF OF WAGES OF SIGNALMEN.

That the Council shall pay to the Railways Commissioners one-half of the wages of the signalmen (less the wage paid to, and the annual value of the quarters occupied by the present caretaker, who will be displaced by the signalmen), who shall be employed for the control of the railway and tramway traffic at such crossing.

## GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in its adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the City of Malvern shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said routes are laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable William Haslam Edgar, His Majesty's Acting Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SCHEDULE 57, CHAPTER IX., PART II.

Licences which do not confer the exclusive right to enter on Crown Lands.

From and after 31st August, 1911, the fee for a permit for the removal of sand from the unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend shall be 2s. per load without back loading, or 1s. 6d. per load if a load of filling material be brought into the sand ground by the person who desires such a permit.—(S.21270.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR  
PUBLIC PARK AT HEPBURN, IN THE PARISH  
OF WOMBAT, KNOWN AS "THE DAYLESFORD-  
HEPBURN SPRING PARK."

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of section 200, *Land Act* 1901. And whereas Crown grants have issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Franklin, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford, in respect of the reserves for a Public Park at Hepburn, in the parish of Wombat, known as, and hereinafter designated "The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park." Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Franklin, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of "The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park (except the portion thereof demised to George Allan) shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park.
4. No person shall climb or jump over fences, or gates, or post bills thereon, or cut names, or in any way damage or deface any of the buildings, gates, bridges, seats, or fences, or trees, or rocks in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, or leave or deposit therein any glass, paper, or rubbish, except in receptacles provided for same, nor roll or throw stones in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, or light any fire therein.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
6. No person shall interfere with the spring taps within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or prevent the flow of mineral water, and any person procuring mineral water for sale or barter within a radius of 15 miles from such portion of the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, as is not demised to George Allan, shall fill all cans or vessels before Ten o'clock in the forenoon and after Eleven o'clock in the evening, and while doing so shall use the small taps only; and no carrier shall be allowed to have more than two cans, either full or empty, on the floor of the spring, or within the pavilion, at one and the same time.
7. No person shall dance, or hold any form of concert or other entertainment within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park without the consent, in writing, of the trustees.
8. No person shall stand on the seats in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or cause any interference with or annoyance to visitors by playing games or musical instruments therein, or by obstructing free entrance to and exit from the pavilion and spring, unless such obstruction be sanctioned by trustees.
9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. No person shall put or allow to wander into the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or poultry, and all goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinafter provided, found trespassing within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park shall be liable to be destroyed.
11. No person shall bring into the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the

trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 49 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Wood, Hay, Chaff, and Coal Branch under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

## Coal and Firewood Act 1904.

## CITY OF BENDIGO.

## BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and numbered 27, for regulating for the purposes of the last-named Act the sale of coal in any quantity, and sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet; for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not to be required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purpose of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

(a) Coal in any quantity; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

(a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundredweight; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale, or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note thereof to any inspector who may demand same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than two miles.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—
