## VACANCIES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

(1) Exports Superintendent. Yearly salary, £500 minimum; £600 maximum. (2) Senior Inspector of Dairy Produce. Yearly salary, £315 minimum; £360 maximum. Duties: To act as assistant to the Exports Superintendent, and to direct and control the officers engaged in the inspection and grading of produce for export under the Commonwealth Commerce Act and Regulations. Qualifications: Knowledge of dairy and perishable products, their production, manufacture, and treatment for export; of the requirements of the various export markets, and the conditions necessary for the successful placing of products thereon; of shipping practices and business methods, and experience in handling men; and of the various methods of commercial refrigeration; and an acquaintance with Acts and Regulations determining the standards of products for export, and experience of their administration.

(3) Senior Butter Grader. Yearly salary, £250 minimum; £270 maximum. Duties: To grade dairy produce—butter chiefly—and inspect and report on places where such produce is manufactured or treated for export; to assist the Senior Inspector of Dairy Produce, and to arrange and direct the work of the staff of butter graders. Qualifications: Experience in the production, manufacture, preparation, grading, and grade-marking of dairy produce for market and export; knowledge of the standards and requirements under the Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Act and Regulations, and as regards the quality and composition of dairy products (particularly butter), and of the causes of various defects.

## REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO DEFENCE OF DESTITUTE PERSONS CHARGED WITH CAPITAL CRIMES AND OF ABORIGINALS CHARGED WITH INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

**T**HE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in lieu of the Regulations dated the 25th February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, made the following Regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. When any person charged with an offence punishable by death, or any aboriginal accused of an indictable offence, requires assistance from the Crown for his defence, he shall, seven days before the first day of the gaol delivery, Circuit Court, or Court of General Sessions at which he is to take his trial, or so soon as he shall know that he is to be tried for such offence, apply to the sheriff of the bailiwick for such assistance, and shall show to the satisfaction of such sheriff that he is without sufficient means wherewith to employ legal assistance.

2. Upon the sheriff being convinced of the truth of the allegations contained in such application, and having ascertained from the Crown Solicitor or the Clerk of the

Peace, as the case may be, that the applicant is to be tried on a capital charge, or in the case of an aboriginal, that he is to be brought to trial, he shall—if the applicant nominate one legal practitioner to conduct his whole defence—communicate to such legal practitioner the desire of the applicant to be defended by him, together with the amount of fees to be allowed, and upon such legal practitioner agreeing not to withdraw from the defence before the trial is concluded, except on sufficient cause to be allowed by a Judge of the Court to which the accused is committed, forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General. If, however, the applicant nominates two legal practitioners, one to act as solicitor and one as counsel, the sheriff shall communicate to each of the legal practitioners so nominated the desire of the applicant together with the amount of the fees to be allowed, and upon each legal practitioner agreeing as aforesaid the said sheriff shall forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General.

2. (a) If any person or persons nominated as aforesaid refuse to agree as aforesaid the sheriff shall require the applicant to nominate another or others in the place of the person or persons so refusing and shall proceed in the case of second and all subsequent nominations as in the case of the legal practitioner or practitioners first nominated.

2. (b) The fact that any legal practitioner has broken such agreement as aforesaid shall be sufficient to justify the Attorney-General in not paying or agreeing to pay such legal practitioner, should such legal practitioner be at any subsequent time nominated to defend any accused person. The fees shall not (except in special cases, to be approved of by the Attorney-General *before the trial*) exceed the sum of £10 10s. where such barrister and solicitor conducts the whole case himself, or £14 14s. where the defence is conducted in Court by another barrister and solicitor briefed for the purpose.

3. The above sums are exclusive of the expenses of any witnesses whom the Judge or the Chairman of General Sessions presiding at the trial shall certify to have been material and necessary (which expenses shall be paid at the same rate as those of Crown witnesses).

4. The barrister and solicitor so engaged shall, after the trial, present his claim to the sheriff by whom he was so engaged, and shall, when the claim is £14 14s. (or upwards), produce to the sheriff a receipt for the fee paid to the barrister and solicitor who has conducted the case in Court.

5. Only those persons who comply with these Regulations shall be entitled to receive aid from the sum voted by Parliament.

6. Every gaoler shall, as soon as possible after the commitment for trial of any prisoner to whom these Regulations apply, communicate the purport of them to such prisoner.

2. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff, or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be, and is hereby deemed to be, a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands shall be—

During the period from the 1st day of October, 1911, to the 31st day of May, 1912, Five shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the period from the 1st day of June, 1912, to the 30th day of September, 1912, Two shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

5. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purposes of this By-law deemed to be, such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

6. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Dimboola Urban District within the Western Wimmera Waterworks District:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said Urban District:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than lands on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-one pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. 9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act 1901* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.


