REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

Provided always and it is hereby agreed that the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence and also provided that the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of 12 months at the next preceding rate. In computing the period of 12 months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed that the said apprentice will not at any time during the said term wilfully disobey the lawful and reasonable commands of the said employer nor without the leave or the licence of the said employer absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours as fixed by the determination of the said Special Board nor fail to work such reasonable overtime as the exigencies of the business may require and the law permits nor habitually neglect his duties nor fail to perform the same nor otherwise grossly misconduct himself.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed and declared that if at any time during the said term the said

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.
—RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1911.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*.—

1. That the water rate for the year 1911 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and sixpence in the £1 on the municipal valuation of the Borough of Horsham for the year 1910-11, with a minimum of One pound (£1) upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 259 of the above-mentioned Act.

All rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance on the first day of January, 1911, at the offices of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

2. Such officers of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW
FOR 1911.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. *Minimum*.—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. *Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. *On Valuations above Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Nine pounds sterling, or more than Nine pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. *Special Rates*.—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. *Notice to Install Meter within Seven Days*.—The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglect to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 sterling. The Trust may, in the event of failure to comply with such notice, cut off the supply of water to such house or premises either by cutting off the pipes by or through which the supply is taken from the main or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as such notice is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trust or its officers, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

6. *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge*.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

7. *Meters to be Tested and Approved*.—The Trust may cause a meter to be affixed in any case where it considers necessary, such meter to be provided by the consumer and fixed at his expense. No meter shall be fixed unless approved of by the Trust nor unless it shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. *Syphons*.—Syphon pipes will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

9. *Where Meter ceases Registering, &c., Average may be Charged*.—If the meters shall cease registering the Trust shall, during the time it is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

10. *Unlicensed Persons not to Interfere with Pipes or Services*.—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. *Licences to Plumbers to be during Pleasure of the Trust*.—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such licence. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

12. *Notice of Work proposed to be given.*—Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. *Notice to Lay Services, &c., to be given.*—No service-pipe shall be laid for the purpose of connecting with pipes of the Trust unless two (2) days' prior notice thereof be given to the Trust, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth of less than 12 inches below the surface of the ground in streets. The day for connecting private services to the Trust's pipes shall be Thursday in each week.

Special Size Services.—No service of a larger pipe than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

14. *Service-pipes to be Repaired by Owner or Occupier—Penalty for Refusal or Neglect to Repair Service.*—If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the occupier or owner of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

15. *Waste of Water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds per day for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

16. *Special Provision for Steam Boilers.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

17. *Overflow to Baths.*—Overflow pipes to baths or basins will not be permitted.

18. *Sale or Hire of Meter and Rate.*—The Trust will upon the application of an intending consumer supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on time payment, on the following terms:—One pound cash deposit, and balance bearing interest at 8 per cent. per annum, by annual payments of One pound.

19. *Testing Meters—Hirer to give Notice of Removal from Premises.*—In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. *Water Rate Outside Trusts Area.*—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

21. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 13,000 gallons per annum at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

22. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she."

Period of Rate.—That the before-mentioned rate as made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1911, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1911, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1911.

Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each half-year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW 15.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound fifteen shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied from stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) On buildings in course of erection, when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourpence per 100 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1911.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1911 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust; also for dealing with charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Lillydale; but no such rate for tenements of £20 net annual value and under shall be less than Twenty-five shillings per annum.

2. A rate of Six (6) pence in the pound on the net annual value of all vacant lands facing the mains shall be levied with a minimum charge of Five (5) shillings.

3. Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on the 1st January and 1st July, 1911.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1911.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

I, _____, of _____, hereby swear that I will truly and faithfully, according to the best of my skill and knowledge, perform the duties imposed upon me by or under the Income Tax Acts, or the *Land Tax Act 1910*, and that I will not divulge or communicate any matter or thing in relation to the Returns, Valuations, or Assessments made thereunder or any other matter coming to my knowledge in the performance of my said duties to any person whomsoever, except as may be authorized by law for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts.

SHIRE OF WERRIBEE.—REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF ROTHWELL, KNOWN AS "THE BULBAN (LATE LITTLE RIVER) RECREATION RESERVE."

THE Council of the Shire of Werribee, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation in the town of Rothwell, known as "The Bulban Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	1 0
For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	1 0
For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2 0
For admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	0 6

3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the reserve any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall light any fire in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall engage in any game or sport or in dancing in the reserve, or use the bicycle track therein on Sundays.

13. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the reserve.

14. Every person hiring or erecting in the reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Conditional Purchase Lease.

A By-law of the above-named Union, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and section 10 of the *Weights and Measures Act 1909*, and numbered 2, for regulating for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act* the sale of coal in any quantity, and the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet in measurement or five hundredweights in weight, for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904* of any weighing instruments.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and the *Weights and Measures Act 1909*, the Managers for the *Weights and Measures Union* of the Cities of Richmond and Hawthorn, the Town of Camberwell, the Borough of Kew, and the Shire of Nunawading, order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place, sells or offers for sale—

- (a) Coal in any quantity; or
- (b) Firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet in measurement, or five hundredweights in weight, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used, without charge, for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who exposes or offers for sale, or sells or delivers from any vehicle, and every person in charge of any vehicle in which coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet in measurement or five hundredweights in weight is being carried, or from which it is being delivered to the purchaser, shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles. And every such box, sack, or receptacle shall be labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

3. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet in measurement or five hundredweights in weight, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

4. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than three-quarters of a mile.

5. When firewood exceeding ten cubic feet in measurement is sold by measure, the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—
