WHEREAS by section 21 of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164) it is provided that the Governor, when it is made to appear to the Governor in Council in any special case that in any year it is expedient that a day by the aforesaid Act appointed for a bank ladiday should not be a bank holiday may declare by proclamation in the Government Gazette published not less than one week from the day appointed for such holiday that such day shall not in such year be a bank holiday: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare that
