TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

Important Notice to Electors.

It is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1910, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1912.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and supence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and supence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings, per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes; and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officers) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

Fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water sup-plied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January and end-ing on the 31st day of December, 1912.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:

- On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

- 5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of 6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be

In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet is to be considered one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence for each additional horse kept. kept.

Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.
- 10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.
- 12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
- 13. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912, except in cases where the Trust has made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure, or for mining purposes.
- 14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Advances of money to assist in effecting improvements may be granted by the Board up to 60 per cent. of the value of the permanent improvements effected, such advances to be repaid in half-yearly instalments extending over fifteen years, bearing interest at 5 per cent. The half-yearly payment will be at the rate of £4 15s. 7d. for every £100 advanced.

For a period of at least ten years, unless remission is given by the Agricultural Department, a minimum area of 10 acres shall be utilized for beet culture each year, the cultivation of the crop to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Department. A system of three-course rotation to be followed (i.e., the 10 acres under beet in any one year shall not be put under beet again until the third year following) unless remission of this condition be approved by the Agricultural Department, and the whole resulting crop of manufacturable beet shall be supplied to the Maffra Factory, which will pay for same at a rate per ton of topped clean roots delivered at the factory, such rate to be determined by the Factory Manager from year to year during the ten years or until this condition is remitted, which may be done at any time by the Board.

Allotments 9, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 23, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 34, 35, 36, 59, and 60 in the Parish of Wurruk Wurruk, will, however, not be subject to the foregoing conditions. Allotments 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 58 Parish of Wurruk Wurruk and instead of 10 as set forth previously.
