Health Act 1890.

THE SHIRE OF CHARLTON.—BY-LAW No. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Charlton order as follows:—

That within the boundaries of the Township of Charlton no privy, urinal, cesspool or earth closet shall be constructed, built, formed, remain, or be allowed to remain within ten feet of any kitchen, dining-room, bedroom, dwelling house, or room used for domestic purposes within the said boundaries of the said Township, except in any case where it is impossible to erect a privy, urinal, cesspool, or earth closet in accordance with the above distance, then such privy, urinal, cesspool, or earth closet shall be erected at the extreme distance possible under the circumstances from any kitchen, dining-room, bedroom, dwelling house, or room used for domestic purposes.

If the owner or occupant of any land uses or permits to be used any privy, urinal, cesspool, or earth closet on the land owned or occupied by him in breach of the foregoing provisions, he shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing By-law was passed by a special order of the Council of the Shire of Charlton on the thirteenth day of October, 1910, and confirmed on the seventeenth day of November, 1910.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite; plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING MANAGERS AND UNDER MANAGERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of February, 1911.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 26, sub-section 4 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909*, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING MANAGERS AND UNDER MANAGERS BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR MINING MANAGERS UNDER THE ACT.

1. Examinations for certificates of competency will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice as required by clause 2. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.
2. Any person desiring to present himself for examination shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, which may be obtained from the secretary to the Board, such notice to be given not less than twenty-one clear days prior to the date of the examination. The notice shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in regulation 6a or 6b, as the case may be. This fee shall admit to one examination only.
3. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall in each instance go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the Consolidated Revenue.
4. No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the additional fee required by regulation 6c or 6d, as the case may be, shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.
5. The Board will issue certificates of competency and service as mining manager (1st class) and as under manager (2nd class), and permits to managers of mines employing less than twelve persons underground. Such permit shall remain in force for twelve months, but may be renewed at the option of the Board.

6. The fees to be paid by an applicant for a certificate shall be as follows:—

7. No person shall be eligible for a certificate under these regulations unless he has attained the age specified in the following schedule:—

(a) For a first class certificate of competency or service as mining manager ...	25
(b) For a certificate of competency or service as under manager ...	23
(c) For a permit as mining manager ...	25

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The examinations may be conducted partly by means of printed or written papers, and partly *viva voce*.

10. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had experience as follows:—

- (a) For a first class certificate of competency as mining manager: Five years' practical mining experience.
- (b) For a certificate of competency as under manager: Three years' practical mining experience.
- (c) The Board will accept as evidence of satisfactory practical mining experience under (a) and (b):—
 - I. The Degree of Bachelor of Mining Engineering, University of Melbourne—2 years.
 - II. The Diploma of Mining Engineering of any School of Mines in Victoria approved by the Board under clause 13—1 year.

- (d) For a first class certificate of service as a mining manager: Five years' practical experience in mining, and, in addition, two years, within the five years next preceding the date of his application, as mining manager of a mine or mines in Victoria in which on an average not less than twelve men were employed underground.
- (e) For a second class certificate of service as a mining manager (*i.e.*, under manager): Three years' practical experience in mining, and, in addition, one year, within the five years next preceding the date of his application, as mining manager of a mine or mines in Victoria in which on an average not less than twelve men were employed underground.
- (f) For a permit as a mining manager in the case of a mine in which less than twelve persons are employed underground: Three years' practical mining experience.

11. Every candidate shall produce to the Board testimonials in proof of the nature and extent of his practical experience, sobriety, and general good character, and stating that he is not subject to any mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties, such testimonials to be signed by his previous employers, and in the case of a registered company, by the legal manager or chairman of directors of the company.

12. No candidate for any certificate shall be entitled to be examined by the Board unless he produces evidence to comply with regulation 10.

13. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with regulations 6, 7, 10, and 11, and who shall produce to the Board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any school of mines or educational institution whose curriculum, training and subjects for and mode of examination are approved of by the said Board, and every such certificate shall state that it is issued

on the certificate of a school of mines or educational institution approved by the Board, and also state the name of such school or institution and the class of mines to which the certificate relates.

14. Every candidate for a certificate shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with copies of the testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board. The original testimonials must be produced as well as copies, but the originals will be returned after perusal.

15. If in any case the Board does not deem as satisfactory the evidence submitted by any candidate as required by regulations 10 and 11, it shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, but this will not disqualify him from again making application to the Board in connexion with any subsequent examination.

16. Every person who—

- (a) forges or counterfeits or knowingly makes any false statement in any certificate of competency under this Act or in any certificate of service granted under this Act or any official copy of any such certificate; or
- (b) knowingly utters or uses any such certificate or copy which has been forged or counterfeited or contains any false statement or knowingly makes use of or attempts to make use of any certificate of competency or service granted to some other person; or
- (c) for the purpose of obtaining for himself or any other person employment as a certificated manager or under manager or the grant renewal or restoration of any certificate under this Act or a copy thereof, either
 - (a) makes or gives any declaration representation statement or evidence which is false in any particular, or
 - (b) knowingly utters produces or makes use of any such declaration representation statement or evidence or any document containing the same—

shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and be liable on conviction to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years.

17. Every holder of a second class certificate as under manager under these regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being examined for a first class certificate as mining manager, and in the event of the latter being granted, the certificate he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

18. Every holder of a permit under these regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being examined for a certificate, and in the event of the latter being granted, the permit he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

19. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost any certificate granted to him under these regulations, such Board may, upon payment of the fee specified in regulation 6e, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified to, as aforesaid, shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

20. Any person holding a certificate under these regulations, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate suspended or cancelled by the Board.

21. Candidates for examination for first class certificates of competency as mining managers must pass in all the following subjects. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

Arithmetic.—Elementary rules applied to mining problems. Vulgar and decimal fractions. Simple mensuration, use of elementary formulæ.

Surveying.—Principles and practice of surface and underground surveying; adjustment and use of clinometer, level, miners' compass, and theodolite; making of mine plans and connexion with surface surveying; measurements of bedded deposits, and calculating quantities thereof. Each candidate must produce a mine plan with field notes of an actual survey carried out by himself.

Mining Geology.—General and fundamental principles of geology. The composition and character of different classes of coal: bedded deposits and the more common rocks associated with deposits of coal, shale, iron stone, and fire clay; geological sections; effects of faults; location of shafts.

Mining.—The laying out and construction of shafts, chambers, and other underground workings. The winning and working of coal, shale, iron stone, or fire clay. The tapping of water under pressure. The drainage of mines and construction of underground dams. Blasting, and the nature, properties, and uses of explosives.

Ventilation.—Theory and practice of methods of ventilation; testing and measurement of mine air; construction of airways, division of currents, and the effects of friction. The nature and properties of explosives and dangerous gases; construction, use, and examination of safety lamps; precautions against danger from the firing of coal dust.

Machinery and Surface Work.—The principles of action, methods of inspection and testing, and the care of winding, pumping, and haulage machinery, and of boilers; practical elementary electricity; coal cutting machines; screening, conveying, and weighing of coal. Erection of mining plant; the laying out and construction of tramways, water races, and flumes. The construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing overwinding, and other safety appliances. The strength of materials used in mining, such as ropes, chains, timber, iron, and steel. Simple structures.

Bookkeeping.—Mine accounts and cost sheets.

Mines Act.—The provisions of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909*.

"First Aid."—Each candidate must be the holder of a "First Aid" certificate granted by the St. John Ambulance Society or other approved institution.

22. Candidates for examination for second class certificates of competency as under managers must pass in all the following subjects:—

Arithmetic, elementary surveying (excluding production of mine plan), mining, elementary ventilation, Mines Act, and "First Aid." (For details of subjects see clause 21.)

And the Honorable Peter McBride, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order that, except subject to Regulations which the Governor in Council may make, on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall be brought from those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries hereinafter described to any other portion of Victoria, that is to say :—

From those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parish of Garvoc in the County of Hampden, the Parish of Panmure in the Counties of Hampden and Heytesbury, and the Parish of Tallangatta in the County of Heytesbury;

From those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parish of Koo-wee-rup East in the County of Mornington, the Parishes of Warragul and Moe in the County of Buln Buln, and the Parish of Broadlands in the County of Dargo;

From those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parishes of Leongatha, Neerim, Darnum, and Yarragon in the County of Buln Buln, and the Parish of Weeaprounah in the County of Polwarth;

From those portions of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Parishes of Paywit and Colongulac in the Counties of Grant and Hampden respectively.
