KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST RATING BY-LAW FOR 1911.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW NO. 12, MAKING A RATE FOR 1911.

The following are the rates which the occupiers of owners of lands and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1911, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1911.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW NO. 2.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers of owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the Municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any Ratepayer shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such Municipal valuation. If such maximum quantity be exceeded such Ratepayer shall pay by measure at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the Municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) For water supplied by measure, a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per annum.

2. The Rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1911, and shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of March, 1911.

Such persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time, for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

Order of the Council of the Shire of Colac, made the nineteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and ten.

REGULATION RESCINDED, REGULATION MADE,
WORDS SUBSTITUTED IN CLAUSE 23.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. XI. (c) of the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XI. (c).—CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION AS
INFANT TEACHER OR KINDERGARTEN TEACHER.

1. The certificates of qualification as infant teachers or kindergarten teachers will be termed—

- (a) Infant (or Kindergarten) Teacher's Certificate, Second Class.
- (b) Infant (or Kindergarten) Teacher's Certificate, First Class.

2. Second-class Certificates or First-class Certificates, as the case may be, will be issued to candidates who complete the prescribed course of training, and pass the prescribed examinations and teaching tests, and comply with the conditions indicated below.

3. Candidates at the commencement of their training course shall be at least seventeen years of age; they shall have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or shall have passed in the literary work of the Second-class Certificate or some higher examination of the Victorian Education Department, or hold some other qualification of approved equivalent value.

4. Candidates employed in State schools must possess the following literary qualification prescribed under Act No. 2006, Second Schedule, for teachers of the Sixth Class, viz., a Licence to Teach or a Second-class Certificate, or approved equivalent, or must have passed in the literary work for a First-class Certificate.

5. In the case of teachers employed in State schools, candidates for a Second or for a First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will not be eligible for examination unless they furnish satisfactory evidence that they have had regular teaching practice, under approved supervision, in the infant classes in a State school or other approved school, for a period of one year in the case of candidates for a Second-class Certificate, and for a period of two years in the case of candidates for a First-class Certificate.

6. Candidates other than teachers employed in State schools will not be eligible for examination unless they have fulfilled the following conditions as to course of training laid down by the Teachers and Schools Registration Board—

(a) The course shall be for two years in a training institution recognised by the Board; but special students, such as graduates of the University, or persons holding certificates entitling them to registration as primary or secondary teachers, may be allowed to complete the course in one year.

(b) The standard of training and examination shall be that of the Infant Teacher's Certificate or Kindergarten Certificate of the Education Department, and shall include at least in one year the English Literature set for the Senior Public examination pass for that year. This last-named subject need not be taken at a training institution.

(c) In the first year of training, the candidate shall, as a rule, observe or teach all the forenoon in a kindergarten, and shall attend lectures in the afternoon. In the second year, the candidate shall also learn to teach the sub-primary classes above the kindergarten.

(d) The time to be spent in practice and observation of teaching shall be equivalent to, at least, 200 hours in each year. A complete pass for the Second-class Infant or Kindergarten Teacher's Certificate and a pass in at least six subjects for the First-class Infant or Kindergarten Teacher's Certificate, will be accepted as sufficient to secure registration as a sub-primary kindergarten teacher.

7. At the examination for either the Second-class or the First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate, candidates will be allowed to present themselves for any number of the prescribed subjects, and will be given credit for those subjects in which they pass. Candidates will not, however, be permitted to present themselves for examination in the subjects prescribed for the First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate until they have passed in all the subjects (except practical teaching and infant-school management) prescribed for the Second-class Infant Teacher's Certificate.

8. Either certificate may be withheld if the Director, on the report of the examiner or examiners, is of opinion that the candidate does not possess sufficient experience of, and practical acquaintance with, infant or kindergarten school work. In the case of teachers employed in State schools, no First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will be issued until the candidate has successfully conducted or taught in an infant department for not less than two years, and in the case of teachers not employed in State schools no First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will be issued until the candidate has successfully conducted or taught in a kindergarten or in the sub-primary department of a school for not less than one year.

9. Unless otherwise determined by notice in the *Education Gazette* examinations in the written work for the Infant or Kindergarten Teacher's Certificate will be held annually in November or December, and in the practical tests in September or October.

10. Persons other than State school teachers may, on payment of a fee of £5 5s. per annum to the Accountant, Education Office, Melbourne, and £5 5s. per annum to the Treasurer, Free Kindergarten Union of Victoria, be admitted to the course of instruction at the Training College.

- III. (i.) *Kindergarten Management;* or
(ii.) *Infant-school Management.*
- IV. *Mother Play, Gifts and Occupations, Games.*
- V. *Literature, Art, Stories, Poetry.*
- VI. *Drawing and Brushwork.*
- VII. *Voice Production.*
- VIII. *Nature-study.*
- IX. *Physiology and Hygiene.*
- X. *Physical Culture.*
- XI. *Practice of Teaching in the Kindergarten and Infant School.*

11. The details of the subjects prescribed for any of the above examinations may from time to time be varied by the Director, provided that due notice be given.

12.—Due notice of all examinations and of changes in the details of the subjects prescribed will be given in the *Education Gazette*. All candidates at examinations must defray their own travelling expenses.

And further, His Excellency doth Order that in Clause 23 of Regulation XII., Training College, the words "on payment of a fee of £6 6s." be rescinded, and the following words be substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say: "on payment of a fee of £5 5s. per annum to the Accountant, Education Office, Melbourne, and £5 5s. per annum to the Treasurer, Free Kindergarten Union of Victoria."

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION XII(c).—COURSES IN DOMESTIC ARTS FOR WOMEN TEACHERS.

1. Studentships entitling to a three years' course of training in the course of study for the 1st Class Certificate and the Trained Teacher's Certificate Domestic Arts will be awarded to qualified candidates.

Each studentship will entitle the holder to an allowance at the rate of £50 per annum for the first year, £50 for the second year, and £70 per annum for the third year.

Students may be required for the first two years of their course to enter into residence at the Training College Hostel, and may be required to perform such domestic duties as may be assigned to them by the Superintendent of the Hostel. They will defray the cost of their board and residence out of the annual allowance paid them.

2. During their course of training students will attend such courses of lectures and practical demonstrations at the University, the Training College, and the College of Domestic Economy as may be from time to time prescribed.

At the end of the second year students will be examined in the subjects of the course of study, and those who pass a satisfactory examination will be allowed to continue for a third year.

In the third year students will be required to assist in the teaching of domestic subjects in a school, in order that they may gain practical experience in teaching. During this year they will be paid an allowance at the rate of £70 per annum.

3. Students who have completed the three years' course of training satisfactorily will be awarded the 1st Class Certificate Domestic Arts or the Trained Teacher's Certificate Domestic Arts, in accordance with conditions to be prescribed from time to time by the Director. For the purpose of Part II. of the Second Schedule to the *Teachers Act 1905* the 1st Class Certificate Domestic Arts shall be held to be equivalent to the 1st Class Certificate mentioned in that Schedule and the Trained Teacher's Certificate Domestic Arts shall be held to be equivalent to the Trained Teacher's Certificate.

4. Persons who have been awarded studentships and have obtained either the 1st Class Certificate Domestic Arts or the Trained Teacher's Certificate Domestic Arts shall be eligible for employment as teachers of special subjects in State Schools, higher elementary schools, district high schools, or continuation classes.

5. The following persons shall be qualified for studentships:—

- (a) Persons who have attended for two years at a continuation school for junior teachers and who have completed the full course of study prescribed by the Regulations;
- (b) Persons who prior to admission to a continuation school for the training of junior teachers have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, and have attended for one year at a continuation school for the training of junior teachers and have completed the course of study prescribed by the Regulations;
- (c) Persons who have been awarded State School scholarships and have won State school exhibitions or have been adjudged meritorious at the competitive examination for awarding State School exhibitions;
- (d) Persons who have passed the Senior Public Examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University;
- (e) Persons adjudged by the Director to have equivalent qualifications to the above.

In the selection of candidates for studentships preference will be given to those who can furnish satisfactory evidence of their interest and success in domestic work.

6. Persons awarded studentships must be at least 17 years of age, and must be free from any physical defect likely to impair their service as teachers. Students will be required to enter into an agreement by themselves and an approved surety not to relinquish their course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four years after the termination of their course to teach in any school to which they may be appointed. Students may in the event of their marriage be permitted to resign at the expiration of two years' service after the termination of their course of study.

7. The subjects of the course of study shall be as follows:—

First Year.—(1) English; (2) Applied Chemistry; (3) Physics; (4) Short courses in elementary bacteriology, elementary anatomy, and elementary biology; (5) Cookery; (6) Laundry work; (7) Household economics; (8) Short courses in first aid, home nursing, care of children; (9) Art work; (10) Textiles, needlework, dressmaking, millinery.

Second Year.—(1) English; (2) Education; (3) Physiology; (4) Cookery; (5) Laundry work; (6) Household economics; (7) Sanitation and applied hygiene; (8) Art work; (9) Textiles, needlework, dressmaking, millinery.

The Director shall from time to time prescribe the details of the above subjects, and these details shall be published in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Corio with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said Shire a certain area therein described, being part of the Lara Riding, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Parwan Riding of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, and with the advice aforesaid doth redefine the boundaries of the said Shire of Corio with its Lara Riding as reduced, and of the said Shire of Bacchus Marsh with the Parwan Riding as enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

CORIO SHIRE (REDUCED).

UNDER the power in that behalf conferred by the Artificial Manures Acts and all other powers him in that behalf enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. The register book to be compiled and kept in compliance with section 11 (1) of the *Artificial Manures Act 1910* shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the First-Schedule hereto.

2. Every application to the Secretary for Agriculture for the registration of a brand of manure under the Artificial Manures Acts shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and the statutory declaration which is to accompany such application shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the Third Schedule.

3. The registered brand to be set forth on every parcel, invoice, certificate, label used in connexion with the sale of any manure shall be plainly printed in black ink or other indelible substance.

4. Every label required to be affixed to a parcel of manure shall be of linen and otherwise of good quality, and shall in size be 4 inches in length by 2 inches in breadth.

5. Where any manure is sold which is being prepared upon an order in writing of a purchaser and according to a *bond fide* special prescription in writing supplied by the purchaser, the person who prepares the same, whether a manufacturer, importer, vendor, or dealer in manures, shall, if required by the Minister, furnish to the Chemist for the Department of Agriculture the date of the sale of such manure, the price charged or paid therefor, the quantity thereof sold, the name and address of the purchaser, and to also furnish a copy of or produce for inspection the special prescription used.

6. The scale of fees set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be payable in respect of the several kinds of manure therein named forwarded to the Chemist of the Department of Agriculture for analysis in accordance with sub-section (3) of section 22 of the *Artificial Manures Act 1910*.

7. The scale set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto shall be the fees payable in respect of the several matters therein mentioned.

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH, AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF WODONGA.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 E.w. VII. No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Yackandandah with regards to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said Shire a certain area being portion of the Yackandandah and Kiewa Ridings, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Green Hill and Bonegilla Ridings of the Shire of Wodonga; and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Yackandandah with the Yackandandah and Kiewa Ridings thereof as reduced, and of the said Shire of Wodonga with its Green Hill and Bonegilla Ridings as enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH (REDUCED).

4. That the licensee shall not sublet, assign, transfer, or part with the possession, or grant the use of, or agree to assign, transfer, or part with the possession of the land described in this licence, or any portion thereof, without the consent, in writing, of the Minister first had and obtained.

5. That the licensee shall keep the area licensed in a cleanly and orderly condition to the satisfaction of the Minister:

6. That the licensee shall on the area licensed, and on a rear corner thereof, erect a closet, with floor measurement of not less than five (5) feet by three (3) feet, to be constructed of wood with iron roof, and the pan door to be placed in the wall abutting on the right-of-way.

7. That this licence shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any Bailiff of Crown Lands.

8. That the non-observance of or non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the obligations or conditions set forth in this licence shall render such licence null and void; and the Governor in Council may thereupon cancel such licence and cause the land described therein to be re-entailed by any Bailiff of Crown Lands and dealt with as unoccupied Crown land. Provided always that, with the consent, in writing, of the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts, the out-going licensee may, within one month from date of cancellation of licence, sell or remove the improvements on the land hereby licensed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GLEN THOMSON.

WE, Harold Alfred Cardale Irving, John Henry, Frank Batten, Patrick James Mahony, and Joseph Vinson Walter, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 8th November, 1910, as a site for Public Recreation in the Township of Glen Thomson, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as herein provided.

(2) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve, on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—For the admission of every person over the age of fifteen years, such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling. For the admission of every person over the age of three years but not over the age of fifteen years, such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence. For every horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle exclusive of rider or passengers, such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

(3) No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(4) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without permission, in writing, of the committee of management.

(5) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

(6) No person shall bring into the reserve or allow to stray therein any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(7) No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, any article in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

(8) No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

(9) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who, knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
